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TWELFTH PROGRESS REPORT OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON SAFETY, HYGIENE AND HEALTH PROTECTION AT WORK - PERIOD 1987 -

(presented by the Commission)

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I. LEGAL BASIS

Council Decision of 27 June 1974 on the setting up of an Advisory Committee on Safety, Hygiene and Health Protection at Work (extracts):

"The Council of the European Communities ... Whereas a standing body should be envisaged to assist the Commission in the preparation and implementation of activities in the field of safety, hygiene and health protection at work and to facilitate cooperation between national administrations, trade unions and employer's organizations ...

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1:

An Advisory Committee on Safety, Hygiene and Health Protection at Work is hereby extablished.

Article 2:

The Committee shall have the task of assisting the Commission in the preparation and implementation of activities in the fields of safety, hygiene and health protection at work ...

Article 3

- 1. The Committe shall produce an annual report on its activities.
- 2. The Commission shall forward that report to the European Parliament, the Council, the Economic and Social Committee and the Consultative Committee of the European Coal and Steel Community".



b) Detailed description

1) Pathogens

The Committee delivered a favourable opinion on the draft produced by the ad hoc group concerning the protection of workers against the risks arising from exposure to microbiological agents at work. The Committee considered only the technical questions and delivered an opinion indicating what the content of a draft directive in this field should be. The Commission took the Committee's observations into account in its preparation of the draft Directive.

2) <u>Directive on machines (technical harmonization and placing on the market)</u>.

The Committee delivered a favourable opinion on the draft prepared by the ad hoc group. The group was able to follow the work of DG III (Internal Market and Industrial Affairs) throughout the preparation of this Directive and to have a say in the drafting of the text.

3) <u>Draft Directive on the technical harmonization</u>, <u>placing on the market and use of personal protective equipment</u>.

The Committee adopted the ad hoc group's draft opinion. The fact that the group had followed DG III's work in this field meant that it was able to prepare the opinions on the DG V proposal and the DG III proposal in parallel. The group's work is now completed.

4) Third Programme of Action on Safety and Health at Work.

The Advisory Committee held an extraordinary meeting in order to be able to deliver an opinion on the Third Programme of Action within the time-limit allowed. A joint opinion was adopted by the Committee, to which were added three supplementary opinions delivered by the interest groups.

5) Occupational health

At the November meeting the Committee delivered a favourable opinion on the section relating to the function of the services responsible for health surveillance. The ad hoc group will continue its work on the "organization" section taking into account the draft Directive on the introduction of measures to encourage improvements in the safety and health of workers at the workplace.

6) Ad hoc Group on Occupational Diseases

The ad hoc group has not yet completed its work on the European list of occupational diseases. The experts having produced a new list, this will need to be verified and commented on, if necessary, by the members of the group.

The draft recommendation will also be reviewed by the ad hoc group during 1988.

The group's work should be completed in the course of 1988.

7) Ad hoc Group on Carcinogens

The Committee adopted the draft opinion prepared by the ad hoc group describing the strategy to be followed with regard to the protection of workers against carcinogens. The Commission took account of this opinion when preparing the draft Council Directive (OJ C 34 of 8 February 1988). The ad hoc group will continue its work, specifically with a view to defining the procedure to be followed for incorporating other carcinogenic agents into the draft Directive.

Other activities

8) Intermediate Group.

At its meeting on 23.2.1987 the Intermediate Group heard the reports of the chairmen of each ad hoc group and examined proposals for the creation of new groups. On the basis of this, it drew up the draft agenda and established the programme for the plenary meeting. The extension of the activities of the Committee to cover the radiation protection of workers was also discussed at the plenary meeting held on 2 and 3 July 1987.

9) Extension of the Committee's terms of reference to cover nuclear safety.

The aim of this extension is to make good the lack of consultation between workers and employers, within the framework of a standing advisory committee on protection of workers against ionizing radiation.

At its plenary meeting on 4 and 5 November the Committee delivered a favourable opinion on this amendment to the internal regulations. The members of the Committee wanted the wording of the amendment to specify "ionizing radiation at the workplace" so as to encompass all places where workers are threatened by radiation. Furthermore, the Committee stressed that the financial and documentary resources needed for the new activities entailed by this Decision should be made available.

The Commission proposed an amendment to the Council Decision (1) on the setting up of the Advisory Committee on Safety, Hygiene and Health Protection at Work, designed to extend its present terms of reference to radiation protection.

IV. ANALYSIS OF WORK

1 - 1987 saw a further intensification of the Committee's activites.

The intensification can be expressed in quantitative terms: 40 days of meetings compared with 23 in 1986, and 23 meetings compared with 15 in 1986. There were three plenary meetings of the Committee. This is the highest number of meetings held by the Committee since its establishment in 1974 (see Table on page).

2 - The increase in activity is mainly attributable to the implementation of Article 118 A of the Single Act (1), and in particular to the adoption of the "Commission Communication on its programme concerning safety, hygiene and health at work" (2). This Communication demonstrates the Commission's wish to exploit rapidly all the resources opened up by this legal provision in order to reinforce the social aspect of completion of the internal market. To show the importance of this action, the Council, at its meeting of 2 December 1987, adopted a Resolution on Safety, Hygiene and Health at Work (3).

3 - The Committee was informed of this new programme of work at its 20th plenary meeting held on 3 and 4 July (1) and the text of the Commission's communication to the Council was formally submitted to the Committee for its opinion at the 21st plenary meeting held on 8 and 9 September 1987, which was convened specifically for that purpose.

This was the major event of the year, judging by the fundamental discussions it provoked and the consequences it had on the Committee's working methods.

- 4 Despite the extremely short deadlines the Committee analysed the Commission's communication methodically and delivered a joint opinion to which each interest group added its own observations (2).
- 5 In drafting this opinion the Committee proved its ability to react rapidly to Commission initiatives in difficult circumstances and justified its role as a crucial forum for the social dialogue, as recognized in the Commission's communication and the Council Resolution.
- 6 At the same meeting the working methods were questioned and clarified. The situation now is that the Committe must give its opinion on all the proposals produced by various departments of the Commission concerning the safety and health of workers.

- 7 The Committee will need to adjust its structures and its working methods in order to adapt to this new situation, the main features of which are:
 - the high number of documents to be examined,
 - the technical and scientific nature of the documents,
 - the very short time allowed for an opinion to be delivered.

This matter will be discussed during the forthcoming year.

8 - In general, the Committee can be considered to have fulfilled its function, which is to assist the Commission in defining and pursuing its activities in this field.

In so doing, it has confirmed the crucial role which it plays in the social dialogue desired by the Commission in the preparation of its decisions.

- 9 As regards the extension of the Committee's terms of reference to cover the Euratom Treaty, the dossier was placed before the Working Party on Social Questions at the meeting of 22 June 1987, and then COREPER on 3 November 1987; the formal final decision must be taken by the Council, wich has yet to be presented with the dossier.
- 10 Finally, at its 21st meeting the Committee paid tribute to M. BENNETT, who has requested a transfer to another department in the Commission. The Director-General, Mr. DEGIMBE, thanked Mr. BENNETT warmly, emphasizing the value of the scientific work which had been performed and the quality of the human relationships which had prevailed during Mr. BENNETT's time with the Health and Safety Directorate.
