## Proposal for a COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC)

amending Regulation (EEC) No 2967/89 relating to the continued import of New Zealand  
butter into the United Kingdom on special terms

(presented by the Commission)

**EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

Regulation (EEC) N° 2967/89 of 25 September 1989 relating to the continued import of New Zealand butter into the United Kingdom on special terms lays down in particular the quantities of butter which may be imported in 1989 to 1992 and the rate of the special import levy.

Article 3(2) of that Regulation provides that the Council is to adjust the rate of the special levy in line with changes in the conditions of intervention in respect of butter in the Community.

In view of the change in the intervention price on 1 March 1990, the special import levy on New Zealand butter should be reduced.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European  
Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Denmark, Ireland  
and the United Kingdom, and in particular Article  
5(2) of Protocol 18 thereto,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas Regulation (EEC) No 2967/89 (\*) temporarily  
authorizes the United Kingdom to import a certain quantity  
of New Zealand butter on special terms until 31 December  
1992;

Whereas the rate of the special levy should be adjusted in  
accordance with Article 3 (2) of Regulation (EEC)  
No 2967/89,

Article 1

The special levy of ECU 44,02 per 100 kilograms provided  
for in Article 3 (1) of Regulation (EEC) No 2967/89  
is hereby replaced by a special levy of ECU 42,92 per  
100 kilograms.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its  
publication in the *Official Journal of the European  
Communities*.

It shall apply from 1 March 1990

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member  
States.
