EXTENSION OF THE BENEFITS OF THE AGREEMENT ON GOVERNEMENT PROCUREMENT CONCLUDED BY THE COMMUNITY TO THE LEAST-DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

(Communication of the Commission to the Council)

The European Economic Community concluded the GATT Agreement on Government Procurement by Council Decision of 10 December 1979 concerning the conclusion of the Multilateral Agreements resulting from the 1973 to 1979 trade negotiations,

Article III, paragraph 11 of thie Agreement provides for the possibility of granting special treatment to the least-developed countries. This paragraph reads as follows :

" The Parties may also grant the benefits of this Agreement to suppliers " in the least-developed countries which are not Parties, with respect to " products originating in these countries."

It was the European Economic Community itself which was at the origin of this provision.

It is therefore generally expected that the Community will grant such special treatment to the least-developed countries.

In view of the Ministerial meeting of GATT of November 1982 it has now become urgent to extend in this way the benefit of the Agreement, 'Moreover the United States has already proceeded along these lines, '

When the Advisory Committee for Public Contracts at its meeting on 1 and 2 June 1982 was consulted on the matter and particularly on the date as from when a decision to extend could be applied in the Member States of the Community it suggested September 1982.

The Commission proposes therefore that the Council adopts the attached decision (Annex A)_ π

The political benefits flowing from such a decision would far exceed any inconveniences.

The Community would grant unilaterally and without any condition as to reciprocity the benefits of extending the Agreement which would allow, it need be, the withdrawal of the concessions granted.

The least-developed countries comprise the countries on the UNO concerning the least-developed countries, 'It would nevertheless appear inadvisable to state the origin of this list so as not to be found by amendments exclusively decided within UNO, '

To ensure that the decision is implemented with the maximum of flexibility it will be published in the form of a simple communication in the Official Journal of the European Communities whose text is in Annex B_{μ}

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 113 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas the Council has concluded, by Decision 80/271/EEC of 10 December 1979 concerning the conclusion of the Multilateral Agreements resulting from the 1973 to 1979 trade negotiations (1), the GATT Agreement on Government Procurement; Whereas Article III point 11 of the said Agreement makes provision for granting the benefits of the Agreement to suppliers in the least-developed countries which are not contracting parties to the said Agreement,

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Sole Article

The benefits of the Agreement on Government Procurement are hereby extended to suppliers in the States listed in the Annex with respect to products originating in those countries,
