EXPLANATORY NOTE

1. In Council Regulation (EEC) 2779/78 of 23 November 1978 (1) the Unit of Account was replaced by the European Unit of Account as of 1 January 1979.

However, the references to units of account, in the context of rules of origin which concern value limits regarding the use of simplified documentation, are contained in the various preferential Agreements negotiated with the partner countries. For the sake of administrative simplicity the question of changes to be made to the Mediterranean Agreements are dealt with in this proposal which covers:

Algeria

Cyprus

Egypt

Israel

Jordan

The Lebanon

Malta

Morocco

Syria

Tunisia

As the origin Protocol in the present Agreement with Spain provides no power for the changes to be made by the Joint Committee, the question of Spain will have to be resolved separately.

- 2. The annexed proposals are presented separately for Israel, Malta and Cyprus and a model for the others containing:
 - 1) a proposed draft Council of Association /Cooperation Council Decision to be adopted as the common negotiating position of the Community;
 - 2) a proposed draft Council Regulation to apply the Decision.

In the case of Israel, Malta and Cyprus there is also a Joint Declaration to be made concerning the calculation of the EUA.

- 3. The proposed Decisions replace the present units of account defined in terms of the value of gold with the European Unit of Account. However, the value to be used will not be one which fluctuates daily, but one fixed at the values in force on 30 June 1978. This solution has been chosen for day to day administrative simplicity as the unit of account in the origin context is used to determine which of two, if either, form of certificate shall be used to demonstrate that goods covered by that form or certificate comply with the origin rules in force.

 Demonstrably too frequent changes would lead to confusion and it would be a laborious task to change the base date at very short intervals.

 The base date is changed automatically every two years.
- -4. The basic principle applied to the choice of the levels chosen as expressed in EUA was that the present levels in force as expressed in national currencies could not be allowed to be decreased in any Community country.
- 5. The new value limits proposed are:
 - 1. Top limit for the use of form EUR.2: 1420 EUA, previous limit 1000 UA.
 - 2. Limit for exemption from use of any form or certificate for small packages for personal use: 90 EUA, previous limit 60 UA.
 - 3. Limit for exemption from use of any form or certificate for travellers' personal baggage: 285 EUA, previous limit 200 UA.
