COMMISSION REPORT TO THE COUNCIL

ON THE OPERATION DURING THE YEAR OF APPLICATION 1979 OF THE SYSTEM
FOR STABILIZING EXPORT EARNINGS SET UP BY THE DECISION

ON THE ASSOCIATION OF THE OCT WITH THE EEC

- 1. Article 29 of the Internal Agreement on the financing and administration of Community aid requires the Commission to prepare an annual comprehensive report on the operation of the system for stabilizing export earnings as regards the ACP States and the overseas countries and territories.
- 2. The Commission presents simultaneously to the Council the fifth comprehensive report on the operation during 1979 of the system set up by the Lomé Convention for stabilizing export earnings.
- 3. This comprehensive report is concerned with the application for the year 1979 of the system for stabilizing export earnings set up by the Council Decision of 29 June 1976 on the association of the overseas countries and territories with the European Economic Community. It deals with:
 - (i) general developments since the fourth report was drawn up;
 - (ii) the results of the fifth year of application of the system;
 - (iii) the effect of the transfers on the economic development of the recipient countries, and on the development of external trade.

I. GENERAL DEVELOPMENTS

- 4. Three former OCT have acceded to the Lomé Convention: St Lucia on 28 June 1979, Kiribati on 30 October 1979 and St Vincent on 27 December 1979.
- 5. However, pursuant to Article 1 (5) of the Internal Agreement on the financing and administration of Community aid, those ACP States which are former OCT, that have become independent and have acceded to the Lomé Convention under Article 89 continue in the future to be covered by the fund for stabilizing the export earnings of the OCT, provided for in Article 1 (3) (c) of that Agreement.
- 6. The machinery for cooperation with the countries and territories as described in the reports for the years 1975 to 1978 continued to function satisfactorily.
- 7. In accordance with Article 22 of the Decision, information on the utilization of the resources transferred during 1979 will be presented to the Council at a later date.
- 8. Reference should also be made to the exchange of views between the Member States and the Commission which, as in 1978, enabled answers to be given to requests for information, and proved very useful and fruitful.

II. FIFTH YEAR OF APPLICATION OF THE SYSTEM

- 9. The Commission has received two requests for transfers for the year of application 1979 from the OCT appropriation. These requests were received from two OCT, which have become ACP States through accession to the Lomé Convention under Article 89, namely the Islamic Republic of the Comoros, and Dominica.
- 10. In September 1979, Dominica received an advance payment of 2,480,000 EUA on the 1979 transfer, due to the total destruction of the country's potential banana exports, following hurricane David in August 1979.

- 11. The two applications for 1979 were eligible since the dependence and fluctuation thresholds provided for by the Decision on the association of the OCT with the EEC had been exceeded under the conditions set.
- 12. Examination of the trend of total exports from the countries and territories concerned did not show any significant change, and consequently there was no need for consultations within the meaning of Article 21 (4) of the Decision.
- 13. The overall results for the latest year of application of the Decision are as follows:

- 14. Both countries concerned received non-repayable transfers. Thus, for 1979, 100 % of the transfers were therefore made in the form of grants.
- 15. The transfers cover two products: bananas (87 %) and cloves (13 %).
- 16. These transfers compensated for falls in earnings resulting from local circumstances.
- 17. With regard to the reconstitution of the resources, the Commission, in accordance with Article 23 (3) of the Decision, and the practical arrangements embodied in the exchange of letters which takes place on the occasion of each transfer, carried out the necessary investigations in connection with the transfers made for the years 1975 to 1978 in favour of OCT which had undertaken to contribute to the reconstitution of the system's resources.

Investigations showed that in the case of Kiribati, the conditions laid down in the Decision had been met. The Commission has notified the responsible authorities of Kiribati of its findings.

- 18. In 1977, the authorities of Kiribati and the Anglo-French Condominium of the New Hebrides were informed that the conditions for reconstitution had been fulfilled. Kiribati was expected to reconstitute 174,972 EUA with respect to the 1976 transfer. Pending a decision on their application for a change of status under Article 23 § 6 of the Decision, the Kiribati authorities have not made the contribution available to the fund.
- 19. The New Hebrides was required to reconstitute 1,103,499 EUA with respect to the 1975 transfer and 327,364 EUA with respect to the 1976 transfer. The British authorities have reconstituted 50 % of the total 1,430,863 EUA requested. The French authorities have informed the Commission Services, that they will make available their contribution in the near future.

20. In accordance with Article 20 (3) of the Decision, the unexpended balance at December 1980 for the year of application 1979, will be as follows:

III. EFFECT OF THE TRANSFERS ON THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE RECIPIENT COUNTRIES AND ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF EXTERNAL TRADE

- 21. Article 29 of the Internal Agreement on the financing and administration of Community aid stipulates that the Commission's annual report shall indicate in particular the effect of the system on the economic development of the recipient countries and on the development of external trade.
- 22. The same article stipulates also that the Commission shall forward to the Member States the reports, which it receives. The 1979 transfers in favour of the OCT were carried out in July of 1980. At the present time, none of the recipient countries has as yet provided the Commission with information relating to the economic effect of the transfers received. Details will be passed to the Council, when they become available.
- 23. The Commission will at a later date forward to the Member States the specialized forms, which describe the use of resources transferred to Belize, Comoros, Djibouti and Tuvalu for the years of application 1977 and 1978. These reports may be the subject of further exploitation.

Dear Mr. Davies,

The Lomé Convention, in Article 21, provides that those ACP States subject to its terms, of which the Republic of Kiribati is one, are to contribute to the reconstitution of the resources made available to the system of stabilization of export earnings (1).

The figures you have supplied concerning the export of copra by the Republic of Miribati during the period 1976 to 1979, indicate that for certain years the conditions for a contribution by the Republic of Kiribati to the reconstitution of the resources of the system of stabilization of export earnings have been fulfilled. The present reconstitution situation is summarized below:

The amounts of these contributions have been determined, as shown in the attached statistical annexes, and amount to 528,240 EUA with respect to the 1975 transfer and 2073816 EUA with respect to the 1976 transfer.

A sum of 174,972 EUA for the year of examination 1977, and relating to the 1976 transfer, was officially requested in Mr. Meyer's letter of 25 April 1978 addressed to the Permanent Representative of the United Kingdom to the European Communities in Brussels. Reminder letters have been sent out, but as yet no contribution has been forthcoming.

A period of two months following the receipt of this letter is allowed to enable the Republic of Kiribati to make the amounts available to the system.

The transfer agreement provides in Article 3 paragraph 2 that contributions to the reconstitution shall be effected in the same currencies in which the transfer was paid, and in the same proportion as indicated in Article 2 paragraph 1 of the same agreement.

In the light of the above, the Republic of Kiribati will be expected to pay into the account of the European Development Fund Nº 41.027.000 at the Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, London E.C. 2R/8AH, a total amount in Pounds Sterling equivalent to 913,028 EUA, at the rate of exchange in force on the day prior to the day on which the operation is carried out by the financial body acting for the authorities of the Republic of Kiribati.
