allocating, for the period until 31 March 1995, certain catch quotas between Member States for vessels fishing in the Norwegian exclusive economic zone and the fishing zone around Jan Mayen

(presented by the Commission)



EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Consultations between the Community and Norway, held in Brussels on 30 November 1994, resulted in an agreement on reciprocal fisheries arrangements for 1995, until 31 March. These arrangements imply, inter alia, certain catch quotas for Community vessels in Norwegian waters.

Sweden has also held consultations with Norway resulting in an agreement defining fisheries arrangements for 1995, until 31 March. In accordance with the Act of Accession of Austria, Finland and Sweden, the fisheries agreements concluded by these countries with third countries shall be managed by the Community.

The Parties agreed to meet again, early in 1995, to agree on fisheries covering the year 1995.

The purpose of this proposal for a regulation is to allocate among Member States the quotas available until 31 March 1995 in the Norwegian zone under the above mentioned arrangements.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 3760/92 of 20 December 1992 establishing a Community system for fisheries and aquaculture¹, and in particular Article 8 (4) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas the Community and Norway have held consultations on their mutual fishing rights for the period until 31 March 1995, and in particular the allocation of certain catch quotas to Community vessels in the Norwegian fishing zone; Whereas the Community and Norway agreed to hold consultations on their mutual fishing rights for the remainder months of 1995 as early as possible in 1995;

Whereas, in accordance with Article 124 of the Act of Accession of Austria, Finland and Sweden, fisheries agreements concluded by the Kingdom of Sweden with third countries shall be managed by the Community;

Whereas, in accordance with the procedure provided for in the agreement on fisheries of 9 December 1976 between the Kingdom of Sweden and the Kingdom of Norway, Sweden and Norway have held consultations concerning their fishing rights for the period until 31 March 1995; Whereas Sweden and Norway agreed to hold consultations on their fishing rights for the remainder months of 1995 as early as possible in 1995;

Whereas, to ensure efficient management of the catch possibilities available, they should be allocated among the Member States as quotas in accordance with Article 8 of Regulation (EEC) No 3760/92;

Whereas the fishing activities covered by this Regulation are subject to the pertinent control measures provided for by Council Regulation (EEC) No 2847/93 of 12 October 1993 establishing a control system applicable to the common fisheries policy²,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

- 1. Until 31 March 1995 vessels flying the flag of a Member State are hereby authorized to make catches
 - in waters falling within the Norwegian exclusive economic zone north of 62°00'N
 - or within the fishing zone around Jan Mayen, and within the quota limits set out in Annex I;
 - in waters falling within the Norwegian exclusive economic zone south of 62°00'N,
 - and within the quota limits set out in Annex II.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 January 1995. However, for Sweden the Regulation enters into force as from Accession.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
