## Proposal for a

#### COUNCIL REGULATION (EC, EURATOM, ECSC)

ADJUSTING THE DAILY SUBSISTENCE ALLOWANCE RATES FOR OFFICIALS ON MISSION WITHIN THE EUROPEAN TERRITORY OF THE MEMBER STATES OF THE EUROPEAN UNION LAID DOWN IN ARTICLE 13 OF ANNEX VII TO THE STAFF REGULATIONS OF OFFICIALS OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES AND INTRODUCING AN ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT PROCEDURE

(presented by the Commission)



#### **EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

The last general revision of the daily subsistence allowance rates for officials on mission within the European territory of the Member States of the European Union, has been decided by the Council the 22 July 1991 (Regulation No 2232/91).

Those allowances were based on surveys carried out in the first quarter of 1990.

The scales fixed then no longer reflect prevailing economic conditions and this, compounded by the accession of three new Member States, means that the daily subsistence allowance rates and the ceilings for the reimbursement of hotel expenses for missions within the Member States urgently need revision.

The attached proposal for a Regulation updates the rates on the basis of the consumer price indices in the hotel and catering sector supplied by Eurostat and the exchange rates applied between 1990 and 1995.

However, applying this method of calculation to the entire period would have produced a different scale from the one used by Parliament, partly because Parliament has made an annual adjustment based on the values for the previous year and partly because column II of the scale is applied in Parliament to all grades other than A1 to A3 for missions to the seats of the Community institutions.

The attached proposal for a Regulation consequently takes as its point of departure Parliament's scale for 1996.

Moreover, the Staff Regulations make no provision for the regular updating of rates; this would make the allowances more realistic as they would better reflect the costs incurred by staff on mission. The Commission is therefore proposing to introduce a system for the regular adjustment of the scales on the basis of trends in price indices in the hotel and catering sector as published by Eurostat and the exchange rates used for implementation of the general budget of the Communities. This adjustment would be made annually by the Commission, which would then inform the other institutions.

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## THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing a single Council and a single Commission of the European Communities, and in particular Article 24 thereof,

Having regard to the Staff Regulations of Officials and the Conditions of Employment of Other Servants of the European Communities laid down by Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 259/68,<sup>1</sup> as last amended by Regulation (EEC, Euratom, ECSC) No 2963/95,<sup>2</sup> and in particular Article 13 of Annex VII to the Staff Regulations and Articles 22 and 67 of the Conditions of Employment,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission after consulting the Staff Regulations Committee.<sup>3</sup>

Having regard to the opinion of the European Parliament,<sup>4</sup>

Having regard to the opinion of the Court of Justice,5

Having regard to the opinion of the Court of Auditors,<sup>6</sup>

Whereas the rates of daily subsistence allowance for officials on mission should be adjusted in order to take account of the increased costs recorded since 1991 in the different places of employment in the Member States;

Whereas, in the case of missions to the seats of the Community institutions, the European Parliament's practice of applying the same rates for officials in all grades, except grades A1, A2 and A3, should be emulated;

Whereas daily allowance rates should be fixed for missions to Austria, Finland and Sweden;

Whereas, in the interests of equal treatment, the scale of rates should be aligned on those already applied by the European Parliament;

Whereas a procedure should be introduced for the regular adjustment of daily subsistence allowance rates for missions to take account of changes in prices and exchange rates,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

## Article 1

Article 13 of Annex VII to the Staff Regulations is hereby amended as follows:

1. The scale in paragraph 1(a) is replaced by the following:

#### 2. The following subparagraph (c) is added to paragraph 1:

"In the case of missions to one of the seats of the institutions, Column II of the foregoing scale shall apply to categories C and D".

#### 3. The first sentence of paragraph 2 is replaced by the following:

"In addition to the rates set out in Column I of the foregoing scale, the hotel bill covering room, service and taxes, but excluding breakfast, shall be reimbursed up to a maximum of

dom".

#### 4. The following subparagraph is added to paragraph 9:

"The rates set out in paragraphs 1 and 2 shall be adjusted by the Commission by 31 March each year on the basis of the hotel and catering price indices published by Eurostat in November of the preceding year and the relevant exchange rates. It shall notify the other institutions accordingly. The decision shall take effect on the first day of the month following its adoption."

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following that of its publication in the

Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all

Member States.
