Proposal for a

COUNCIL REGULATION (EC)

**temporarily suspending some or all of the autonomous Common Customs Tariff
duties on certain fishery products (1998)**

(presented by the Commission)

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1. During the third quarter of this year, the Commission, assisted by the Economic Tariff Problems Group, has reviewed all the requests for temporary suspension of autonomous Common Customs Tariff duties presented to it by the Member States, including requests for extending suspensions at present in force.
2. The attached proposal concerns a number of fishery products.
For industrial and agricultural products, the proposal for a Regulation temporarily suspending the autonomous Common Customs Tariff duties is also being prepared.
3. The requests for suspension relating to the above products were examined in the light of the criteria set out in the communication from the Commission to the Council and the Member States concerning autonomous tariff suspensions (see OJ C 235, 13.9.1989, p. 2).

Following this review, the Commission considers that the suspension of duties is justified for the products listed in the Annex to the attached proposal for a Regulation.

4. As can be seen from Article 1 of the above-mentioned proposal for a Regulation, the period of validity of the proposed measure is 12 months.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community, and in particular Article 28 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas the Community relies at present on imports from third countries for supplies of certain fishery products; whereas it is in the interest of the Community to suspend partially or totally the customs duties for these products; whereas, in order to avoid endangering the prospects for developing the production of competitive products in the Community while ensuring that the industries concerned receive the necessary supplies, it is advisable to adopt these suspension measures only from 1 January to 31 December 1998,

Whereas it is for the Community to decide to suspend these autonomous duties,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. From 1 January to 31 December 1998 the autonomous Common Customs Tariff duties on the products listed in the Annex are hereby suspended at the level indicated for each product.
2. Imports of these products shall qualify for the suspension referred to in paragraph 1 only provided that the free-at-frontier price laid down by the Member States, in accordance with Article 22 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 3759/92 of 17 December 1992 on the common organisation of the market in fishery and aquaculture products,¹ is not lower than the reference price fixed or to be fixed by the Community for the products or categories of products in question.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 January 1998.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

(a)	Control of the use for this special purpose shall be carried out pursuant to the relevant Community provisions.
(b)	<p>The suspension shall apply to fish intended to undergo any operation unless they are intended to undergo exclusively one or more of the following operations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - cleaning, gutting, tailing, heading, - cutting (excluding filleting or cutting of frozen blocks), - sampling, sorting, - labelling, - packing, - chilling, - freezing, - deep freezing, - thawing, separation. <p>The suspension is not allowed for products intended, in addition, to undergo treatment (or operations) qualifying for suspension where such treatment (or operations) is (are) carried out at retail or catering level. The suspension of customs duties shall apply only to fish intended for human consumption.</p>
(c)	However, the suspension is not allowed where processing is carried out by retail or catering undertakings.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

1. Budget heading involved: Chapter 12 Article 120
2. Title of operation: Proposal for a Council Regulation temporarily suspending all or some of the autonomous Common Customs Tariff duties on certain fishery products (1998).
3. Legal basis: Article 28 of the EC Treaty.
4. Objective: Suspension of the CCT duties for the above products.
5. Measures aimed at prevention and protection: Checks on the end-use of some of the products covered by this Council Regulation will be carried out in accordance with Articles 291 to 304 of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2454/93 laying down provisions for the implementation of the Community Customs Code.
6. Cost:

By contrast with the previous year (for which the cost of the entire operation was estimated at ECU 38 565 000), it is now proposed that:

- one product be removed from the list of suspensions, i.e. "fillets and meat of hake" (CN headings 0304 20 55 10, 0304 20 58 10 and 0304 90 47 30) because the normal rate of duty will be some 9% from 1 January 1998 whereas, so far, the suspended rate has been 10%; and
- a suspension on "Paralomis granulosa crabs" be added.

The result of the current estimate of revenue foregone, which takes into account the most recent known EUROSTAT statistics (1995), is a gain of ECU 1 100 000 in respect of the product deleted from the list, and a loss of ECU 33 000 in respect of the added product, i.e. an overall decrease of ECU 1 067 000 in the amount of duty not collected.

Estimated cost of this operation (1 January 1998 - 31 December 1998)

The amount of duty foregone as a result of the proposed measure may therefore be estimated at **ECU 37 498 000**, which is **down ECU 1 067 000** from the recorded ECU 38 565 000 foregone in respect of the previous measure (1 January 1997 to 31 December 1997).

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
