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EXPLANATORY NOTE

and FOREWORD

- 1. On a number of occasions the Commission, Council and Parliament have expressed their interest in the drawing up, by the Statistical Office of the European Communities, of work programmes covering statistical activities in the years ahead.
- 2. To meet these demands in a manner which is calculated to enable the Council to examine and approve such programmes, the Commission has adopted a procedure whereby a programme covering the statistical activities of the Community in the years ahead will be prepared at regular intervals and submitted to the Council for approval.
- 3. In instituting this procedure, the Commission has the following considerations in mind:
 - 3.1 At a time when demands for statistics are increasing rapidly, co-ordination is essential. Otherwise there will be needless waste and confusion caused by a proliferation of requests for figures.
 - 3.2 Requests for statistics come from many directions each reflecting a different need. But unless they are co-ordinated the result is an accumulation of overlapping and potentially conflicting demands.
 - 3.3 Many requests may be aimed at a limited number of suppliers of information, who may increasingly resent and oppose any duplication and inconsistency.
- 4. The programme and the associated procedures for consultation and discussion provide the means for co-ordination.
- 5. The principal features of the proposals and the new procedures are:
 - 5.1 The bringing together of the major statistical and closely related activities of concern to the Community into one programme, the central core being the SOEC's own programme.
 - 5.2 The possibilities of improved co-ordination that such a comprehensive programme presents.

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- 5.3 Consultation with the interested parties, particularly the principal users of the information, including the European Parliament.
- 5.4 The opportunity for the Council to review annually the adequary of the Community statistical programme, its priorities and its relevance to policy needs and thus to approve its general lines.
- 6. This procedure was followed for the second statistical programme covering the years 1977 1979 which was approved by the Council on 29 July 1977 (Doc. T/ 626/77 (AGRI)). The first and third programmes were merely circulated as information documents to Commission services and the Statistical Offices of the Member States.
- 7. The Council is asked to approve the general lines of the Community's statistical programme. The programme is submitted to Council in parallel with the formulation of the Commissions' budget proposals to ensure consistency between the two as regards the financial implications. At the same time, the programme is sent to the Parliament for information. Authority to finance individual projects will be sought in the appropriate manner : the major statistical projects are normally subject of an Act of Council.

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FOURTH STATISTICAL PROGRAMME 1979-1981

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The 1979-1981 working programme for EUROSTAT is drawn up with a view to developing the statistical system of the European Communities in such a way that it will constitute an optimum information source and practical tool, primarily for the use of the European Community's own institutions and Member States.

Considerable importance is therefore attached to the ideal of achieving a suitable balance between, on the one hand, those types of statistics which are largely intended to give an up-to-the-minute picture of economic and social developments, particularly as regards employment, production, prices and external relations, and, on the other hand, those types of statistics which are intended more for use in describing structures or analysing society.

In both cases, it is essential to ensure as high a degree of continuity as possible, with a view to providing, among other things, a practical basis for forecasts.

In drawing up the programme and deciding on the statistical work to be done, every possible effort is made to meet the requirements of the administration of the European Communities, while taking account of the capacity of the various national statistical institutions to provide the necessary basic information.

- 1.2 The programme is concerned with Community statistical activities in the years 1979-1981. As with previous programmes, it concentrates on the work of the Statistical Office of the European Communities (EUROSTAT), but it also takes into account work of a statistical interest carried out by other Directorates-General of the Commission.
- 1.3 In the first section, the purposes to be served by the programme are recalled as is the nature of the decision which the Commission seeks to obtain from Council on such programmes.
- 1.4 As these programmes are intended to form part of a regular annual series, each covering three years only, it is to be expected that, from year to year, there will normally only be a limited number of changes. Changes, however, become cumulatively significant over the years. They reflect responses to new short-term priority needs and they indicate a movement towards new long-term objectives. To put proposed innovations in the draft programme into a better perspective, this first section contains a brief review of past and future developments.

2. PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAMME

- 2.1 The programme is a multi-purpose document in that it:
 - 2.1.1 enables the Commission to determine its priorities for statistical work in the years ahead
 - 2.1.2 gives Council the opportunity to give its approval on the broad lines of the programme
 - 2.1.3 promotes the role of EUROSTAT as integrator at the centre of the Community's statistical system and improves coordination between EUROSTAT and the other services of the Commission
 - 2.1.4 makes it easier to adjust national, Community and international statistical programmes to accord with each other
 - 2.1.5 informs internal and external users of statistics of Community plans in this field
 - 2.1.6 serves EUROSTAT as a basis for internal planning.
- 2.2 To meet these various purposes, the programme must be quite succinct in its general outlines and at the same time must enter into a considerable amount of descriptive detail both as regards existing and new projects. For this reason the programme is in two parts, the first dealing with the broad lines and the second taking the form of an annex giving details.

3. NATURE OF COUNCIL APPROVAL

- 3.1 In submitting such programmes at regular intervals to Council the Commission is responding to Council's wishes. However, Council experienced some difficulty with regard to the second programme. This difficulty arose because of uncertainty whether approval of the broad lines of the programme meant that individual projects were also approved. The Commission wishes to make it clear that it does not seek, in the context of the statistical programme, approval for an individual project. The justification for, and agreement to, specific projects, are matters for the committees and working groups of the Commission and, where necessary, for appropriate procedures in Council.
- 3.2 Indeed, a three-year programme cannot be legally binding because the provisions of the Treaty allow only for year by year commitment of budgetary resources for Community purposes.
- 3.3 Nevertheless, the Commission regard an agreement in principle by Council to record its general approval of the broad lines of a programme
 - . as morally binding insofar as Member States would then be expected to plan to provide necessary resources and make the necessary efforts to assist EUROSTAT to accomplish the whole or the greater part of the programme within the time scale envisaged.

- 3.4 This commitment on the part of both Commission and Member States is of course strongest for the first year of the programme, particularly as the planning for that year will be linked to the allocation of budgetary resources for that year. For the second and third years, the programme is necessarily more indicative, more subject to uncertainty both as regards the availability of resources and other developments on the national and Community level. Nevertheless, even for these later years, approval of the programme by Council is interpreted as a commitment by Member States to preparing plans for a Community programme of work of the size and scope indicated by the programme.
- 3.5 Approval does not exclude one or other Member States stipulating qualifications about the usefulness or feasibility or one or a number of individual projects. Indeed, the Council decision on the second programme was accompanied by a list of a small number of qualifications, cited as examples of the kind of qualifications Council wished to make. These related to the annual and conjunctural surveys of industrial activity and to projects relating to transport, services and inputs of raw majorials to industry.

4. REVIEW OF PAST DEVELOPMENTS

- 4.1 EUROSTAT will be 20 years old in 1978 and it is perhaps appropriate at this juncture to try to place the current three-year programme in the context of the Office's past history and of the likely future development of Community statistics over the next decade.
- 4.2 The Community statistical service began in 1953. It was designed to give statistical support to the newly created High Authority of the Coal and Steel Community. Activity in these early days led to the foundation of what is now a fairly comprehensive system of statistics covering, initially, the steel and coal industries and, subsequently, the whole of the energy sector.
- 4.3 The Statistical Office was created in 1958 following a decision by the three executive bodies, ECSC, Euratom and EEC. Much of the first decade was devoted to the search for and the setting up of basic statistical systems, of nomenclatures, the NIMEXE, the NACE, of national accounts, the ESA, of Community surveys particularly in the field of social and agricultural statistics, and of a comprehensive system of agricultural statistics required to meet the needs of the Common Agricultural Policy.
- 4.4 In the following five years preceding the enlargement of the Community from six to nine countries, there was much concern with the problems of implementation by the six Member States of these new Community statistical instruments. In addition the range of the Office's activities was extending rapidly and new directives on industrial and transport statistics, planned during the previous decade, were approved during this period.

- 4.5 The enlargement of the Community brought two new tasks, fitting the three new Member States into the statistical framework of the Community, and dealing with the increased volume of statistics consequent solely upon the enlargement.
- 4.6 During the same period, fresh needs for statistics have arisen. On the one hand, Community policies have called for Community statistics in new fields, including research, education and environment. Many of these activities may be described as conventional in that they are principally concerned with the collection of data to be published and used at a fairly high level of aggregation. By contrast, there has been a growing demand for other statistics of a more analytical character, particularly those which permit the Community and Member Countries to appreciate the size of and the changes in their economic and financial relations with the rest of the world, distinguishing separately the main geographical areas. As an example may be quoted the foreign trade statistics and those for balance of payments, statistics to which recours has to be made more and more frequently for the negotiation and monitoring of agreements with third countries in this area. In this area the conceptual and presentational homogeneity of the figures must be such as to form the basis for an adequate "Community picture", starting from national statistics which are as up to date as possible.
- 4.7 However, perhaps the most significant development in recent years has been the impact of Community and world economic difficulties. Perception and analysis of these difficulties require fast and reliable figures. The Office has developed a number of important social and economic indicators, including those covering monthly figures of industrial production and unemployment. Others are in preparation, and the paramount need in the programme for statistical work for the immediate future is to give the necessary priority to providing a good service of timely statistics related to the Community's most pressing needs in the social and economic fields.

5. THE NEXT TEN YEARS

- 5.1 For any programme of future statistical work, assumptions must be made, in the face of uncertainty, about the political, social and economic environment in which the statistician is likely to be working. For the next decade, it seems likely, at the present time, that four factors will be important in shaping statistical plans:
 - 5.1.1 continuing concern with the problems of Community and world economic growth
 - 5.1.2 continuing efforts to primote Community coordination and integration, particularly in the economic and monetary fields
 - 5.1.3 increasing number of Community policies, internal and external, requiring very detailed statistical support
 - 5.1.4 prospects of further enlargement of the Community.
- 5.2 Against the background sketched out in the preceding paragraphs the Commission's broad strategy in the field of statistics in the next decade can be defined as (cllows:

- 5.2.1 to guarantee a suitable and adequate supply of time series which can be continually brought up to date and used as a source of information regarding current developments within the different sectors of the Community. As far as possible, these time series should also enable comparisons to be made with the situation in the rest of the world
- 5.2.2 to conduct regular studies with a view to clarifying the economic and social structure in the various countries and providing a basis for closer analysis, comparisons, and evaluation of developments in the various sectors in the individual countries. In particular, to improve the data for the analysis of the regional economies to highlight imbalances between regions which affect the process of economic integration.
- 5.3 The continually growing demand for statistical information emphasizes the need for harmonization in the statistical work carried out in the various countries. It also calls for a greater degree of coordination between EUROSTAT itself and the various other administrative departments of the European Communities with a view to avoiding duplication of effort and avoiding the compilation of information for which there is little use. In this respect, it is also essential to ensure optimum use of the information available, e.g. by channelling it through EUROSTAT and by making as much use as possible of computer technology in the development of information services.
- 5.4 EUROSTAT has also a continuing and important role to play in coordinating statistical activities in the Community with those of international statistical organizations. Once again, the twin objectives are increased harmonization and avoidance of duplication of effort.
- 5.5 An underlying theme of the work of coordination at national, Community and international levels will be the need to keep the demands on respondents to statistical questionnaires to the essential minimum.

6. THE PROGRAMME FOR 1979 TO 1981

First priority - timely social and economic statistics

6.1 The primary objective of this programme is to improve the statistical service given by EUROSTAT in certain fields. These include new as well as old projects, annual as well as more frequent statistics statistics which are already harmonized and some which are not, projects concerned with the treatment and dissemination of data, and projects of special (fishing) as well as general (ESA) application. Other priorities for policy purposes

- 6.2 There are few major new projects involving the collection of new statistics in the period 1979 to 1981. A contingency programme for fishery statistics has been drawn up, plans are being laid for statistics relating to wine and olive growing and in the industrial sector there are new proposals for compiling balance sheets for essential industrial raw materials.
- 6.3 In a large area of activity, a good statistical service is already available - for example agriculture and energy. In these sectors the objective will be to meet a limited number of new demands while maintaining the existing service. With limited resources this will mean simplifying wherever possible. Nevertheless, the programme of surveys in the coming years remains substantial. An indicative list, looking as far ahead as 1983, is given in Table A.

As regards national accounts, certain important gaps have been identified and remain to be filled. In the coming years the objective is to continue to make steady progress in filling the gaps and in extending the use of the ESA system for Community and national purposes. Particularly attention will be given to developing regional accounts to meet the needs for assessment of national and Community regional policies. The importance of statistics of balance of payments with third countries has already been underligned. There are some changes of emphasis in the programme for social statistics. The need for short-term statistics has already been mentioned, but in addition some lightening of the periodic structural surveys will continue in order to make room for the increased use of time series of various social indicators.

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- 6.4 Ways and means must also be found, from material already available, to provide Commission services with badly needed information on the service trades, particularly in the context of the sectorial analyses. In addition, data for sectoral analyses at appropriate regional level will be supplied to the Commission.
- 6.5 The prospects of a further enlargement of the Community have already increased the workload of the Office. Meeting demands for statistical information required during discussions and negotiations with candidate members will need a high degree of priority during the period of this programme.

Priorities for statistical development

6.6 Work on the statistical infrastructure must continue. Many longer-term projects which yield no immediate returns in terms of quicker or better statistics are essential. In this category for example falls the joint UN/EEC work on world nomenclature problems.

7. WAYS OF IMPROVING SHORT-TERM STATISTICS

Efforts by the Member States

7.1 Obtaining up-to-date statistics in all the fields to be covered puts a heavy demand on national statistical systems, in spite of EUROSTAT's efforts to reduce the overall workload by lightening the programme wherever possible. However, particular importance is attached to the observance by Member States to the agreed timetables for supplying:

- 7.1.1 foreign trade statistics (according to the timetable laid down in the regulations on foreign trade statistics)
- 7.1.2 monthly, quarterly and annual industrial statistics to be provided in accordance with the directives now in force
- 7.1.3 employment and unemployment figures on a standardized basis

Efforts by EUROSTAT

7.2 The ability of EUROSTAT to give an adequate service depends essentially on the efforts made in the Member States. Nevertheless higher priority than hitherto will be given by EUROSTAT to the processing, dissemination, presentation and analysis of these statistics. In particular, the organization of work will distinguish more clearly the operational tasks of providing a timely service from the development work on harmonization and integration.

Estimates

7.3 A high degree of harmonization of figures from Member States is desirable in EUROSTAT statistics, and efforts to achieve this goal must continue. But for many urgent purposes only incomplete and disparate data will be available for some time to come. Much of this data, from existing national sources, cannot be used directly for Community purposes. EUROSTAT must, by processes of estimation, explanation and analysis, ensure that the data is put in a form which can serve the purpose in hand.

Use of indicators

7.4 Many of the short-term statistics are needed to monitor changes and in this context comparability over time is the first objective. EUROSTAT's task will be to find the best statistics available to use as indicators of these changes .

Sectorial studies

7.5 The drawing together of statistics from various sources to support sectorial studies highlights the use of these statistical skills in selection, estimation, analysis and interpretation of data. It also leads to greater coordination within EUROSTAT of the work of the different Directorates.

Computer programme

7.6 EUROSTAT has pursued for a number of years an important and successful development programme for providing essential software (CRONOS, OSIRIS, SABINE, and, in preparation, AISE) for statistical work. This development programme will continue and in addition considerable resources will be needed during this period to deal with problems arising from the changeover to the new computer. However the ability of EUROSTAT to provide timely statistics already depends to a large extent, and will increasingly depend, on a high degree of operational efficiency in EUROSTAT and in the Computing Centre. Moreover, the collaboration between computer specialists and statisticians and other users of the automated data systems must become much closer than hitherto.

7.7 The problem of the linking of national and Community statistical systems by a computer network will merit special study during the period of this programme. Close collaboration with the computer specialists in the national statistical services will be extremely important in the next few years.

Publications

7.8 The programme of publications - internal as well as external will be re-examined to ensure that the maximum use is made of computing possibilities and that data reaching the user in this form is timely and relevant.

8. CONCLUSIONS

- 8.1 The statistical programme must look as far ahead as possible to help EUROSTAT and the national statistical services to programme their work rationally. Unforeseen developments will undoubtedly occur which will require further changes to be made long before the end of the terminal year of programme, hence the necessity for regular review and revision and an annual updating and rolling forward of the programme. It is at once a purposeful and flexible instrument and its usefulness depends to a large extent on the discussion and comment that it stimulates which is secondary only to its prime purpose of providing positive guidelines for the Community's statistical work in the coming years.
- 8.2 Without losing sight of the importance of collecting a wide range of data to meet many differing needs, and to make steady progress towards the harmonization and integration of the national systems, this programme underlines the urgency of the need for timely statistical data and analysis to understand and deal with the Community's social and economic problems in the years ahead. The Commission, through EUROSTAT and with the help of the national services, intends to meet this need.

STATISTICAL ACTIVITIES AND PLANS OF THE BRUSSELS LIAISON GROUP

THEME NOTE A1.I : INFORMATION SYSTEMS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : A1

1. INTRODUCTION:

Modern statistics make increasing use of computers, which become the essential means for the processing and storage of data, and sometimes of collection and dissemination. The Office must coordinate the work done in Member countries and make its own contribution towards technical progress.

2. SOURCE:

SOEC initiative

3. AIM:

To improve the global efficiency of systems of treatment of statistical information: notably, by the setting-up and maintenance of generalised data processing programmes.

4. DESCRIPTION:

CRONOS - the system of managing time series - should be maintained in an operational state which takes account of technological modifications; OSIRIS is a data processing system constructed from a specialised language orientated towards the production of statistical tables. A synthesis of the experience acquired during the development of these two systems will permit the establishment, in the long term, of a new project AISE.

This consists of a system of managing a set of very large sets of data (AISE: Archive of Socio-Economic Information) enabling simultaneous operation by many users who will utilise sets of programmes for execution and edition.

The view of future networks of data banks is becoming clear thanks to the work of DG XIII advised by the Committee for Information and Scientific and Technical Documentation (CIDST), which will permit the creation of a European Telecommunications Network (EURONET) into which the basic statistical data could be integrated. This would lead to an improvement in the circulation and exchange of statistical information.

5. WORK PLAN:

CRONOS : 1977-1980 maintenance and conversion to ICL equipment. OSIRIS : 1977-1978 completion, maintenance and conversion to ICL equipment. AISE : 1977-1980 studies and completion. EURONET: 1977-1978 development work. 1979 putting into service.

A considerable investment in data processing resources.

THEME NOTE A2.I : HARMONIZATION IN THE FIELD OF STATISTICAL COORDINATION

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : A2

1. INTRODUCTION

In view of the diversity of statistical fields and problems and given the knowledge and use of the variety of work already carried out by the Member States, the SOEC is justified in engaging, on a permanent basis, in reflection, coordination and harmonization in the domain of statistical methodology.

2. SOURCE

SOEC

3. AIM

To ensure responsibility for methodological aspects and the coordination of Community work on statistics. To participate closely in the preparation of new work.

4. DESCRIPTION

The range of these activities is vast. In particular, they relate to the following areas:

- Nomenclatures: important projects mentioned in the programme result from the application of different national and international nomenclatures. The SOEC assures the coordination of these projects in general as well as the correlations between families of nomenclatures, with regard to data processing aspects, in particular.
- 2. Major surveys and sampling techniques. This coordination will take place:
 - a) in the <u>Community programme proper</u>, between sectors of study and within these sectors
 - b) over <u>time</u>, in updating certain data from more modest intermediary projects which are nevertheless well integrated with larger surveys carried out at less frequent intervals
 - c) with the <u>countries</u>, in order that for each type of survey, the essential criteria, well defined, for which guarantees of comparability exist, are not called into question but on the contrary form a basic Community gain, leading in due course to the harmonization of national surveys.

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3. Application, in the spirit of coordination within the SOEC, and, so far as possible, between countries, of particular statistical analysis techniques, of sets of index numbers, of a selection of mathematical-statistical and econometric models, etc.

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5. WORKPLAN

Continuous work.

6. FINANCING

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Possible credits for studies.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Substantial, bearing in mind the large field of application.

THEME NOTE A3.I : DIFFUSION

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : A3

1. INTRODUCTION

The Statistical Office has available a large mass of economic and social data. In the main these data are collected by the countries. But they derive also from work of synthesis and from country enquiries and analysis of Community files. The publication and diffusion in a coherent framework of selected, and in principal, harmonized information is an essential task of the SOEC.

2. SOURCE

Various national and Community sources.

3. AIM

To make available to the Commission and the public regularly and as rapidly as possible, good quality statistical information circulated using the most efficient technical means.

4. DESCRIPTION

The management of publications consists in producing and diffusing

- annual publications concerning national accounts and tax statistics as well as sectorial annuals
- b) publications and special series presenting the results of Community work, studies and enquiries
- c) monthly and quarterly bulletins giving short-term economic trends for the Community in numerous areas.

5. WORKPLAN

New forms of diffusion, microfiches and films, magnetic tapes, data bank (CRONOS) are developing in competition with the classical type of publication.

Eventually it will be necessary to allow for the linking of data banks and the creation of veritable information networks.

6. FINANCING

Special Commission budget post.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Considerable, taking account of the growing demand for quantitative information, and the necessity for the SOEC of improving its publications and modernizing their distribution.

THEME NOTE A3.II : CENTRAL MANAGEMENT OF THE CRONOS SYSTEM

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : A3 (Group "Data banks and systems")

1. INTRODUCTION

The CRONOS system can be used to manage a group of time series data banks. Each of these banks covers a different sector and is operated in agreement with the Directorate-General responsible for that sector. The Statistical Office is directly responsible for the general purpose banks and for the central management of the system.

2. SOURCE

Initiative of the SOEC in responding to the needs of the Directorates-General of the Commission.

3. AIM

To allow users rapid access to the time series held in store, facilities for certain statistical operations and for the production of statistical tables.

4. DESCRIPTION

The CRONOS system is a time series data bank composed of a series of "sub-sets" of files (SEF) and managed by the Statistical Office. The system caters for all the basic operations required for data bank management, namely input and updating of the series, automatic calculation of totals, and consultation. The initial aim of the system is the management of general purpose series, usually dealt with by manual or semi-manual methods. The access to CRONOS is through the <u>conversational</u> mode using individual terminals equipped with a visual display screen and, possibly, a printer and also through the <u>deferred</u> time mode, using forms and punched cards which enable the data to be obtained by return in the form of computer print-out.

5. WORKPLAN

The main computer problems having been solved, the development of the system takes place according to the users' needs which are developing rapidly.

6. FINANCING

No special provisions, except possibly for the input of data into the system.

7. Considerable, bearing in mind the number of series already stocked and the requests for the opening of new SEF. Problems of capacity have already been raised and a technical solution will have to be found.

In 1977 495 000 time series were stocked and kept up to date, covering 12 statistical sectors. Work is in hand to cover 7 additional sectors.

1. INTRODUCTION

The most important objective of this programme is the adoption of ESA by all the Community countries, and achieving this will represent a significant step towards the harmonization of European statistics:

on the one hand, in regard to integrated national accounts (economic and financial accounts, input-output tables)

on the other hand, when used as a basis for examining the validity, compatibility and comparability of every plan for setting up particular statistics.

It is necessary to stress that the input-output tables constitute a basic tool for a large number of macro-economic or structural studies.

The establishment of accounts for Community institutions is in progress. The absence at present of these accounts constitutes a gap.

2. SOURCE

Decisions of the Commission and a recommendation of the Council.

3. AIM

Adoption and development of the ESA.

4. DESCRIPTION

Receipt of information on a standardized basis Testing and correcting with a view to harmonization Synthesis to a Community level Economic analysis Development of the system.

5. WORKPLAN

Establishments of accounts for the Community institutions. In consultation with the Working Party on National Accounts, the Office is examining critically the progress made in implementing the ESA in the Member countries, and is examining in detail the measures to be taken in each country, in order to fill the gaps in the statistical information which gave a necessary basis for drawing up ESA Accounts and Tables.

6. FINANCING

Yes: credits for studies.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Considerable for Member countries as well as for the SOEC. The burden is that much heavier for those Member countries who compile their national accounts on an ESA and on a national basis.

1. INTRODUCTION

The comparison between countries of the major economic aggregates expressed in values is hindered by the inadequacy of the rates of exchange as a means of conversion to a common monetary unit. The project aims to define and to apply a method which will enable the comparison to be made.

2. SOURCE

Decision of the Commission within the framework of an investigation into world price levels under the auspices of the United Nations and the World Bank.

3. AIM

To express the principal aggregates of the national accounts (ESA) in units in terms of a uniform purchasing power.

To compare price levels between countries.

4. DESCRIPTION

Synthesize the data collected by a series of price surveys:

survey on prices of household consumer goods survey on the prices of goods entering fixed capital formation survey on the prices of non market services.

5. WORKPLAN

Annual synthesis to be carried out, starting with 1975, on the basis of the surveys.

Annual updating from 1976 onwards.

6. FINANCING

Studies only.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Requires an increasing attention from a specialized group.

THEME NOTE B3.II : SURVEYS OF PRICES

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : B3

1. INTRODUCTION

The Community interest centres on the need to compare the final consumption of households and gross fixed capital formation in real terms on the basis of purchasing power parities.

2. SOURCE

Commission Decisions and Council Recommendations.

3. AIM

Comparison between Community countries of prices of goods entering the final consumption of households and gross fixed capital formation, the calculation of purchasing power parities and real values of these aggregates.

4. DESCRIPTION

Annual survey of the prices of about 200/300 consumer goods, 60 capital goods and 7 building and civil engineering goods. These surveys are carried out in conjunction with the national statistical offices and with the help of technical experts.

5. WORKPLAN

Finalising the lists of articles and their specifications Execution of the enquiries Checking results.

6. FINANCING

Price surveys and consultation of experts :
- consumer prices 200 000 ua for 1978
- capital goods 110 000 ua for 1978
for subsequent years, similar sums will be necessary.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

The planning and execution of these surveys demand a considerable amount of work for both SOEC and national statistical offices.

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THEME NOTE B4.I : REGIONAL STATISTICS AND ACCOUNTS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : B4

1. INTRODUCTION

There is a regional aspect in each statistical domain, thus under the heading of regional statistics there is a very wide range of statistical work. Here, two of the most important aspects of the regional field are considered : regional accounts and the coordination of regional statistics.

2. SOURCE

- Council regulation of 18 March 1975 creating a European Regional Development Fund (ERDF)
- Articles 92 and 93 of the Treaty setting-up the E.E.C.

3. AIM

To supply information necessary to implement the community's regional policy and the sectoral regional policies.

4. DESCRIPTION

- Regional accounts : the application of the system of regional accounts within the framework of the ESA for the basic administrative units of the Community (+ 160) : collection, testing how the work has been carried out by the member countries, analysis and dissemination, studies on the development of the system, especially as regards public authority accounts.
- <u>Regional statistics</u> : coordination, collection, analysis and dissemination of the regional statistics in the various statistical domains (social, industrial, agricultural, etc...).

Regional statistics usually for the basic administrative units of the Community and for several series for the zones which benefit from regional aid (about 700).

5. WORK PLAN

- Regional accounts :
 - permanent work of up-dating the system of application of ESA at regional level (ESA-Reg)
 - Extension of the application of ESA at regional level : regionalised accounts of local authorities.

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : C2

1. INTRODUCTION

Creating statistics on R & D is closely linked to the work of the Committee on Scientific and Technical Research (CREST) set up by the Council in January 1974. EUROSTAT provides the secretariat for the sub-committee "Statistics" of CREST. This sub-committee prepares annually a report on the public financing of R & D and all its methodological discussion is in this context. An enlargement of scope towards the provision of a general set of indicators which would require the inclusion of sectors other than the public, is under discussion at CREST.

3. <u>AIM</u>

To draw up the statistical information necessary for the coordination of research policy wanted by Council.

THEME NOTE C3.I : SOCIAL ACCOUNTS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : C3

1. INTRODUCTION

Following the decision of the Working Group that in future the social accounts should take the form of four separate "accounts" (social protection, health, housing and vocational training), the title of the accounts established up to the present is being altered to "social protection accounts (current operations)". They still need to be completed by certain basic data on "capital operations" and on "persons and benefits".

So as not to overburden the statistical services concerned, this complementary material, as well as the new accounts, will be confined to an absolute minimum of indispensable data. Discussions on the basis of special studies conducted on the initiative of EUROSTAT are already well advanced in two Working Parties (Persons and Benefits, Housing).

A 1974/75 edition of "Social protection accounts - current operations" which in future will only be presented in condensed form, was published in 1977. The first edition in the new form is planned for the end of 1978 and the publication of the completions mentioned for 1979. In addition, a special study on social aid schemes will appear.

2. SOURCE

- a. Request of DG V (1962)
- b. Council decisions
 - i. of 26.11.1970, whereby the social accounts form the basis of a European Social Budget
 - ii. of 9.11.1972, to establish a European Social Budget on the basis of social accounts and to include the functions "vocational training" and "housing".Council decision of 19.10.71 concerning the priority to be given
- c. Council decision of 19.10.71 concerning the priority to be given to the statistics of participants and benefits
- d. Council decision of 21.1.74 (Social Action Programme: actions III/5 and III/14).

3. <u>AIM</u>

4. DESCRIPTION

5. WORKPLAN

 - iii. complementary aspects of a financial nature (capital operations, social advantages) will require several more meetings. A simple framework for capital operations will be produced by mid-1979.
 - iv. Types of benefits: analysis and conclusions from the Summary Report on the nine national reports (1978). On the basis of the analysis: revision of the contents of the functions (1979/80).
- b. Housing account:

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- i. Preparatory work study for setting up an account (1978).
- ii. Establishment of a framework for the Account (1978/79)
- iii. First completion with figures (1979/80)
- c. Health account (requested by the Working Party):
 - i. preparatory work for setting up an account (1978)

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THEME NOTE C3.II : SOCIAL INDICATORS

a) Objective indicators

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : C3

1. INTRODUCTION

Within the framework of the Social Action Programme (Action III/6) eight principal series have been selected, for the first year and relevant specific indicators have been established.

Care was taken that numerical data already available at national level was used. After examination by the national experts, the first publication was brought out in 1977. The development of subjective indicators to complement the objective indicators is in progress (cf. detailed description theme note C3.III).

2. SOURCE

Requests of Directorates-General II, V and other Directorates-General of the Commission: Action III/6 of the Social Action Programme.

3. <u>AIM</u>

To provide a basis of general statistics in the social field, essential for the development of Community policy in social affairs and to comply with the Social Action Programme.

4. DESCRIPTION

Social indicators, For pragmatic reasons, EUROSTAT will leave the further development of the philosophy and terminology of "social indicators" to be worked out in collaboration with the international bodies (OECD, UN). For the immediate practical requirements of Community statistics the choice of priorities is governed by the framework of the Social Action Programme and other Community policy concerns.

5. WORKPLAN

- Completion of the first stage: in Autumn 1977 (publication of the first indicators for 8 social areas - demography, employment, working life, standard of living, social protection, health, education, housing - and for an international comparison with third countries)
- 2. Continuing development of the system: 1978 to 1981:

Future work will proceed on the following lines:

- i. Concentration on particular problem areas in Community social policy (e.g. problem social groups in the population)
- ii. Technical improvements e.g. comparability, consistency of presentation
- iii. Completion with calculated examples of social "model cases" and subjective indicators.

Considerable task of coordination and execution as well as of assembling a substantial amount of new data.

THEME NOTE C3.III : SOCIAL INDICATORS

b) Subjective indicators

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : C3

1. INTRODUCTION

To complement the objective indicators described in Theme Note C3.II subjective social indicators are being developed from material collected in a series of qualitative surveys in progress in the Community. The main emphasis in the surveys is on the individual's subjective assessment of different aspects of his life. Such work is being carried out already by the public authorities in several Member States. The data collected is very often of direct interest in Community policy formation. The scientific study of the methodology to be used in the organization of this kind of survey at Community level is important since cultural and linguistic differences seem to have a major impact on the results obtained.

After a seminar on multi-purpose surveys and subjective questions held in Luxembourg in November 1975 and discussions with experienced survey practitioners it was decided to organize a series of experimental surveys. The first survey, held in 1977, dealt with health, the health services and housing: the second being held in 1978 deals with working life. On the basis of experience gained the Office hopes to be able to develop in succeeding surveys an instrument which will supply broad general information on matters of social interest relevant to Community policy formation.

2. SOURCE

Request of Directorate-General V. Action III/6 of the Community Social Action Programme.

3. AIM

To provide material for use in the development of subjective social indicators in the Community.

4. DESCRIPTION

The surveys are carried out by the national statistical offices or by private research institutes selected in agreement with the national statistical offices concerned in each Member State. (In 1977 and 1978 Luxembourg did not participate.) A random sample of 2 000 individuals from the adult population is drawn and interviewed. Questionnaires collect information on the characteristics of the respondent, his experience in the area being investigated and his assessment thereof. The replies are analysed by broad categories of the population so as to highlight the influence of certain objective characteristics and experience on the assessment made.

5. WORKPLAN

- a) Completion of second survey on working life in 1978
- b) Examination of results of 1977 and 1978 surveys with a view to the establishment of a regular qualitative social survey concentrating each time on a specific topic of Community social policy or concern.

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6. FINANCING

Yes (lump sum based on costs of individual interview).

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THEME NOTE C4.I : EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : C4

1. INTRODUCTION

The guidelines for a programme of employment statistics were approved by the Council on 19 July, 1976, having been submitted by the Commission after agreement had been reached by the General Directors of the national statistical institutes. The task now is to implement this programme within a reasonable time.

Some portions of the programme are already being put into effect while for others the preparatory work is in hand (see also Theme Note Cl.I for the census of population and Cl.II for the labour force sample survey).

2. SOURCE

Regulation of the Council Programme of employment statistics approved by the Council Specific requests (Standing Committee on Employment, Education Committee, Community policies)

3. AIM

To provide comparable and up-to-date information on the structure and trends of employment and unemployment generally as well as on specific topics.

4. DESCRIPTION

General study of employment and unemployment statistics. Standardization of national series for registered unemployment and for vacancies. Development of harmonized series of statistics of employment from national sources. Implementation of the Regulation of the Council on the development of statistics of migrant workers. Monthly and annual surveys concerning employment in the ECSC industries. Standardization of national series for industrial disputes.

5. WORKPLAN

Continuing work on standardization and harmonization of national series in association with the appropriate working groups. Annual publication in "Population and employment" from 1977 onwards. Rapid publication of important data (e.g. the statistical telegram on unemployment).

6. FINANCING

Possible credits for studies in certain specific fields.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Considerable, especially as regards the development of harmonized series.

THEME NOTE C4.II : EDUCATION (SCHOOL EDUCATION AND VOCATIONAL TRAINING)

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : C4

1. INTRODUCTION

Assembling Community level statistics for education in the widest sense is a relatively new element in the statistical programme. The work has come about from the growing importance of this field in both national and Community policies. There is interest in both the number of persons undergoing education and in the expenditure on education.

2. SOURCE

Council regulations on matters of education and social action: the resolution of Ministers of Education, meeting in the Council, 9th February 1976: the decision of the Council of Ministers of Labour, 30th April 1976: the resolution of the Ministers of Education meeting in the Council, 13th December 1976.

3. AIM

To provide policy makers with usable data both for background and for specific decisions. Coordinated statistical information is particularly important for the work of DG XII "Research, Science and Education" in liaison with the Education Committee of the Council and for the work of "Employment and Social Affairs" in the context of the European Social Fund, of Social Politic Action and in the preparation of the European Social Budget. For all these purposes particular attention is given to vocational training.

4. DESCRIPTION

Collecting, harmonizing, presenting, analysing national statistics on:

- numbers of pupils and of students (at school and university) by age, sex, level and year of study, by type of teaching, foreign language learnt, by nationality (children of migrant workers).
- 2. numbers of teachers by level
- 3. numbers undergoing initial vocational training and adult education by age, sex, level and vocation taught
- 4. financial aspects of education, including the type of the finance (public, or non public) and by the type of expenditure (current, or capital).

Some Community initiatives are anticipated in the context of the 1979 Labour force sample survey to examine the links between training and working life, as well as a first approach to the study of flows within the educational system at a Community level.

5. WORKPLAN

To continue the work of harmonization within the framework of the Working Group "Statistics of Education" and of its specialized sub-groups with a gradual extension of the field covered, to use of specific surveys, etc.

The results are published in the series "Social Statistics". _

6. FINANCING

None for the work of harmonization. Partial finance for the specific surveys.

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Credits for studies.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Growing, especially in the field of vocational training and in the study of flows.

WORK OF A STATISTICAL INTEREST OF THE OTHER DIRECTORATES GENERAL OF THE COMMISSION

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CO.1 Social security in agriculture

1. INTRODUCTION

Statistical information or estimates on Social Security in agriculture and their financing in the Member Countries of the Communities.

2. SOURCE

Commission, in accordance with a mandate issued by the Council in 1970.

3. AIM

To provide basic statistical material for the realization of the Common Agricultural Policy.

4. DESCRIPTION

Every year national experts send to the Commission statistical figures concerning the expenditure of the Social Security system in agriculture and their financing during the previous two years: these figures may be definitive or provisional. Every two years the same experts inform the Commission of the existing legislation in the field of Social Security in agriculture.

The Commission collects, compiles and distributes these statistics.

5. WORKPLAN

Continuing annually.

CO.2 Industrial Accidents in Coal Mining

1. INTRODUCTION

These statistics are collected each year to provide quantitative information on industrial safety in the coal mines.

2. SOURCE

Commission in accordance with Council mandate of July 1957.

3. OBJECT

To aid the Mines Safety and Health Commission to follow the development of industrial safety on a comparable basis in the Member States.

4. DESCRIPTION

The statistics are collected from the administration of the coal mines in each country. They are broken down by the circumstances of the accident, the site of the injury and severity (death, absence of 4-20 days, 21-56 days, more than 56 days).

5. WORKPLAN

Continuous.

CO.3 European Social Budget

1. INTRODUCTION

Statistical information (the retrospective part) and estimates (the forecasting part) on expenditure and receipts relating to social security, and, in a general way, to all domains relevant to social policy.

Based (as to field and structure) on the social accounts (social protection accounts).

2. SOURCE

Commission, in accordance with Council decision of 26 November 1970.

3. AIM

Factual document enabling, by reason of the indications which it presents, an appreciation by the competent authorities of the repercussions that would result from a possible modification of the legislation from which the forecasts derive.

4. DESCRIPTION

A first European social budget (1970-1975) was established in 1974 and revised in 1975. The second (1976-1980) is at present in course of preparation: it will be based on the data of the social protection accounts relating to the 1975 exercise. The national experts are, in principle, required to send the 1975 results to the Office and, at the same time, their 1980 forecasts, to the Commission. The assumptions, and in particular economic assumptions, to be used by the national experts are furnished in part by the Commission (DG II).

DG V attempts to assist the national delegations in this work, notably in the matter of methodology, by getting another working party of independent experts (methodology of forecasts) to undertake studies, on selected subjects (sickness, old age and unemployment benefits), destined to establish models capable of being used for forecasts of social expenditure.

5. WORKPLAN

The aim is to present the second ESB in October 1977.

CO.4 Statistics on foreign workers

1. INTRODUCTION

In order to inform the specialist services of the national employment services and/or the governments as well as the Advisory Committee and the Technical Committee on Free Movement of Workers and their Employment, the Commission collects the available statistics concerning foreign workers.

2. SOURCE

Commission, on the basis of information supplied by the Member States.

3. <u>AIM</u>

According to Article 19 of Regulation 1612/68, the Commission has to establish an annual report on the situation on the labour market, with special reference to the movement of foreign workers: for this report, statistical background information on the situation of foreign workers is necessary.

4. DESCRIPTION

The various Member Countries still compile their statistics of foreign workers according to different methods and definitions and at different intervals. The statistics deal with the number of foreign employees in employment, the new arrivals (placings) and the number of unemployed foreigners. Most statistics of foreign workers are broken down by nationality and industrial branches.

5. WORKPLAN

Continuing, until results are available at the Statistical Office according to regulation (EEC) No 311/76 concerning compiling of statistics on foreign workers.

CO.5 Unemployment and vacancies

1. INTRODUCTION

These statistics are collected, compiled and updated in order to describe the most recent situation regarding unemployment and job vacancies in all the various sectors of the economy.

2. SOURCE

Commission, on the basis of statistics provided by national employment services or statistical offices.

3. AIM

To inform the services of the Commission, ad-hoc working groups and other users of statistics of the development of the labour market in the Member States.

4. DESCRIPTION

The statistics on unemployment and job vacancies are established according to national criteria: unemployment statistics are broken down into industrial branches and/or professional groups, age-groups, sex and regions.

5. WORKPLAN

Collection of these statistics is now done in close collaboration with the Statistical Office in standardized form (Statistical Telegram on Unemployed issued monthly).

CO.6 ECSC Employment Statistics

1. INTRODUCTION

The statistics are compiled in order to determine the situation and the development of employment in the coal, iron and steel industries under different aspects.

2. SOURCE

ECSC Treaty.

3. AIM

To provide the necessary statistical data for the annual report concerning the coal industry in the Community, the general objectives in the steel industry, the European Social Fund, the construction of housing for the benefit of ECSC workers.

4. DESCRIPTION

The statistics cover both the workers who are registered and those who are present, and the series are classified as salary-earners or wage-earners, by sex, age-groups, nationality and regions.

5. WORKPLAN

Continuing of regular collection and compiling by the Statistical Office - Special studies for use of the Commission.

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THEME NOTE D1.I : AGRICULTURAL ACCOUNTS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : D1

1. INTRODUCTION

Agricultural accounts are a synthesis of specific data from production and price statistics. They aim at giving an overall view of economic transactions in the agricultural sector.

Their most important applications are:

- to permit an annual review of the agricultural situation in the EC,
- to provide a basis for examination of the interdependence between the branch "agriculture" and other areas of economic activity.

The drawing up of the accounts presuppose harmonization of the greater part of agricultural statistics and their adaptation to the concepts of the system of national accounts. Price statistics and the supply balance sheets will be of considerable importance in this respect (see theme notes D1.II and D2.II).

This work forms a very important source of information for the formulation of the common agricultural policy and for Community activities in other fields (especially economic and fiscal policy).

2. SOURCE

Request from DG VI for the basic tasks as well as from other users.

3. AIM

Supply of comparable macro economic information on production values (broken down by products), intermediate consumption, fixed assets in agriculture and on agricultural income.

Extending agricultural accounts according to uniform principles and preparing up-to-date estimates. Supply of corresponding statistics for the EC.

DESCRIPTION

Collection of data, analysis of questionnaires, preparation of EC results in a common currency unit and at constant prices, and dissemination of information. Efforts to be directed towards making the results available earlier and towards the harmonization of data.

3

Completion of a handbook specifying the ESA rules for agriculture (harmonization of concepts).

Bringing the Economic Accounts for Agriculture up to date for the current period.

Consideration of the possibilities of calculating by a common method (in accordance with Annex C of the Sixth Council Directive on the harmonization of the laws of the Member States relating to turnover taxes) the value added for (i) all agricultural, forestry and fisheries' undertakings in each Member State and (ii) those subject to the flat-rate scheme of VAT.

Regionalization of the Economic Accounts for Agriculture.

5. WORKPLAN

Current work.

The revised draft of the Handbook on Economic Accounts for Agriculture will be discussed during meetings of the Working Party in 1978: it is then intended to publish the Handbook.

Annual publication of the results relating to the Economic Accounts for Agriculture in the "Green Series".

Bringing the Economic Accounts for Agriculture up to date. The methodological and technical aspects of the project "Sectoral Income Index" are currently under review: in 1978 and succeeding years efforts will be devoted to applying and further developing the estimating tool.

6. FINANCING

Credits for studies.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Considerable both in terms of planning and of execution.

THEME NOTE D1.II : INSTITUTION OF A SYSTEM OF AGRICULTURAL PRICE STATISTICS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : D1

1. INTRODUCTION

Agricultural price statistics have two main roles. They are linked directly to agricultural policy and form an essential link between quantitative measurements in this field and accounts and other statistics expressed in terms of value. After a long period of preparatory work, the present programme provides for many individual series and series of price indices:

- EC index of producer prices for agricultural products
- EC index of purchase prices of the means of agricultural production - indices of certain other factors of production.

2. SOURCE

Requests from DG VI, from other services of the Commission and from other users.

3. AIM

To obtain the data necessary for the formulation of the Community agricultural policy and in particular to publish series on the development of the absolute prices of products purchased and sold, accompanied by the determining characteristics for these prices in order to show the degree of comparability of the series. For the indices, to have instruments for overall measurement of output and (in part) input prices. These indices play an important role in the political considerations which determine statutory prices.

4. DESCRIPTION

Collection and distribution of data. For the indices, harmonization of concepts and methods.

5. WORKPLAN

Steady development, during the period of the programme. For the indices, rebasing in a year near 1975 with an extended field of observation and greater uniformity in the approach to seasonal products. (In particular, introduction of fruit and vegetables into the monthly indices). When rebasing occurs, attempts will also be made to construct indices including VAT.

Publication: special series with restricted circulation (about 18 volumes per year).

THEME NOTE DI.III : SURVEYS OF THE STRUCTURE OF AGRICULTURE

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : D1

1. INTRODUCTION

The collection of data on the agricultural development of agriculture and agricultural holdings involves a series of large-scale, onerous surveys. In the past the conducting and processing of such surveys has led to certain difficulties which the Statistical Office is making every effort to avoid or solve. But the problems inherent in large surveys have to be faced - onerous preliminary work, high cost, an often quite considerable burden placed on a large number of respondents and thought is being given to ways and means of obtaining essential data at minimum cost and within given time limits. In particular a plan has been formulated providing for a regular programme of structural enquiries in the 1980's.

2. SOURCE

3. AIM

To obtain for the requirements of the common agricultural policy data on the development of individual structural features of agricultural holdings with the passage of time.

- 4. DESCRIPTION
 - 1975 Under Council Directive 75/108, Member States were required to supply the SOEC for a specific sample of agricultural holdings (about 650 000) with information for a list of certain characteristics set out in the directive. The survey was carried out in 1975 and the data for each individual holding were being forwarded on tape to the SOEC who are drawing up and carrying out processing programmes.
 - 1977 A limited exercise is in train under which Member States provide 1977 results for a selection of key tables in principle chosen from those prepared for 1975. Individual changes since 1975 for a limited number of holdings are being studied under separate contracts with individual Member States (Optic L).

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1979/80 The Council when adopting the 1975 Farm Structure Survey directive endorsed as the third stage of the programme of surveys there envisaged, "a census of agricultural holdings as part of the world census of agriculture recommended by the FAO, to be carried out between 1 May 1979 and 15 June 1980". The programme for the FAO "1980" World Agricultural Census involves a very comprehensive list of questions, but this and the associated definitions are only recommendations and thus not binding. For the EEC, a common list of characteristics to be covered and of definitions, both based largely on 1975, has been prepared. A common tabulation programme, as in 1970/71, will be adopted.

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THEME NOTE D2.I : PREPARATION AND PROCESSING OF SURVEYS ON

AGRICULTURAL AND FORESTRY PRODUCTION

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : D2

1. INTRODUCTION

A statistical scheme complying with the characteristics of agricultural production and policy requirements was described in the work programme prepared in 1971 (Doc. 694/72). As this system is put into practice, the work changes progressively from the development to the management and processing of data. The harmonization and implementation of surveys in the field of crop statistics and the carrying out of new surveys in the field of animal statistics have required great efforts in organization and work efficiency in order to ensure adequate analysis and rapid distribution of the results.

Additional emphasis should be placed on vineyard, and, to a lesser extent, on forestry statistics in the context of recent developments in agricultural and forestry policy.

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THEME NOTE D2.II : SUPPLY BALANCE SHEETS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : D2

1. INTRODUCTION

Work summarising data from all sources consisting partly of a combination in one framework of specific data, such as data on production, external trade, stock, different uses, human consumption, etc., with many important applications, for the following purposes in particular:

the annual community examination of the agricultural and forestry situation, preparation of forecasts in the field of agriculture

to facilitate examination of the balance between supply and demand for each agricultural and forest product and for the management of the different agricultural markets.

2. SOURCE

Request by Council and Commission

3. AIM

To have available the supply balance sheets necessary for the development and guidance of agricultural policy, including the day-today management and the administration of agricultural markets.

DESCRIPTION

Drawing up annual supply balance sheets for each country and EUR-9 for 25 groups of products covering about 150 products. Collection of all basic data on supply to permit calculation of supply and demand for Member States and the Community including special calculations on import requirements, surpluses, human consumption, industrial processing, the degree of self sufficiency in supplies, etc.

5. WORKPLAN

Permanent work, covering work on feedstuffs' balance sheets Publication on Supply Balance sheets (special issue) Publication of feed balances (special issue) Publication of supply and feed balance sheets in summary form in the different monthly series: 15 volumes yearly. Publication of supply balance sheets for forestry and the most important wood products Computer processing of most of the supply balance sheets and the setting up of chronological data files, for at least ten years in retrospect, are being carried out.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

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THEME NOTE D2.III : FISHERY STATISTICS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : D2

1. INTRODUCTION

The Commission's proposal to the Council of the EC for the establishment of a Community system for the conservation and management of fishery resources in the waters of the Community (i.e. within the 200 mile zone) introduces a new dimension to the work and to the statistical requirements in the field of fishery policy.

As the details of this new fishery policy have not yet been finalized it is not possible to formulate definitively the future programme for fishery statistics.

At the present stage of discussion future activities relating to fishery statistics lie in the following fields:

- 1. Development of monthly statistics on catches broken down by fish species and fishing regions
- 2. Development of statistics on catches per unit of fishing effort
- 3. Further development of fleet statistics
- 4. Establishment of monthly statistics on landings (quantity and value)
- 5. Continuation of the compiling of supply balance sheets relating to fish and fishery products.

2. SOURCE

Request by Community organs, in particular by the Commission.

3. AIM

Preparation of statistical data on fishing in the Community for the purpose of drawing up the Common fishery policy and supervising its implementation

Secondly, attempting to standardize the relevant statistical systems of the individual Member States with a view to developing a harmonized Community system.

Finally, making the data on fishery statistics available to the Member States and the other countries.

4. DESCRIPTION

- 1. In establishing monthly statistics on catches broken down by fish species and fishing regions, statistical data are to be prepared for the catch quota system proposed by the Commission.
- 2. Data on catches per unit of fishing effort will be required for the assessments of the state of the fish stocks. These assessments are used in the allocation of catch quotas.

- 3. The Commission's increased need for information on capacity, size and age structure of the fishing fleets for purposes of structural policy (granting of licences, withdrawal of fleets, restructuring of the fleets, etc.) involves the further development of fleet statistics.
- 4. The planned publication of monthly data on fish landings by weight and value in the ports of the Community will be useful when formulating measures and decisions relating to market policy. This holds both for within the services of the Community and the Member States.
- 5. The establishment of supply balance sheets for fish and fish products has proven its value in the past. This work will be continued.

5. WORKPLAN

In order to draw up monthly statistics relating to catches broken down by fish species and fishing regions and to gather data on catches per unit of fishing effort, a system for the collection of data must be introduced. With this in mind, the SOEC has drawn up a proposal for a logbook system. This proposal must now be discussed with DG XIV and the Member States, drawing on the experience of the Member States.

Establishment of an outline plan for the final monthly statistics on catches broken down by fish species and fishing regions and on the statistics relating to catches per unit of fishing effort.

In applying the Commission's proposals on the registration of fishing vessels it is planned to draw up and collate an outline plan for the future statistics on fishing fleets, drawing on the experience of the OECD with the "World Register of Fishing Vessels".

Harmonization of the Member States monthly statistics on fish landings by weight and value: at present these statistics still vary greatly in form.

Annual publication of the various data for Community fisheries.

Monthly publication of fish landings by weight and value.

6. FINANCING

Is yet to be settled. Likely to be on a national basis. Insofar as certain preparatory studies are necessary these will be financed from the Commission budget (Art. 264).

7. VOLUME OF WORK

At the moment it is not yet possible to finalize details on the nature and extent of the work required. Before this can be done it is necessary to await the outcome of the negociations in the Council of Ministers on the future fishery policy and also the subsequent, final division of work between DG XIV (Fishery) and EUROSTAT. This will involve drawing up a list of priorities.

DO.1 The Farm Accountancy Data Network (FADN)

1. INTRODUCTION

The FADN was created to meet the needs of the CAP and has been in operation since 1968. It is described more fully in a leaflet entitled "The farm accountancy data network".

2. SOURCE

Within the Commission

3. AIM

To obtain the necessary accounting data in order to establish annual farm income and to analyse the economic operation of farms. This data is used chiefly as a basis for Commission reports on the agricultural situation and agricultural markets as well as on agricultural income in the Community, reports presented annually to the Council and to the Assembly for the main purpose of fixing annually the prices of agricultural produce. The FADN also serves as a source of "reference" farms for the Commission's objective method of assessing the need for changes in producers' prices.

4. DESCRIPTION

The basic data, taken from a sample of agricultural holdings keeping accounts, is collected and stored by regional accountancy offices. In each FADN region the sample is selected by a committee made up of a maximum of 12 members representing the administration, the agricultural holdings and the farm accountancy offices. At the national level liaison organizations provide a link between the regional and Community authorities. The management of the FADN, and the handling and analysis of the data is the responsibility of DG VI. It is assisted by the FADN Community Committee, which is made up of representatives of the Member States and has the same powers and functions according to the same rules as the management committees of the agricultural markets. The FADN is concerned with agricultural holdings whose organization is geared to sales, which constitute the farmers' main occupation, and which employ annually not less than one "labour unit" (or 0.75 in some countries). The number of farms, at present around 20 000, is gradually being increased to about 28 000 by 1978.

D0.2 Statistical information on olive cultivation

1. INTRODUCTION

A register of olive cultivation in the Community is considered necessary for efficient market management in the olive oil sector.

2. SOURCE

Council Regulation 154/75 January 1975

3. AIM

To follow production trends more closely in order to work towards market stability.

To permit a more effective control of Community expenditure on the olive oil market.

4. DESCRIPTION

The statistical information on each holding shall be provided in two stages:

- (a) total olive growing area total number of olive trees
- (b) (by January 1981)

The register shall be brought up to date at regular intervals.

THEME NOTE E1.I : COAL (ECSC)

(see also theme note E2.I)

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : E1

1. INTRODUCTION

- In the coal, iron and steel sectors (including iron ore mining) a comprehensive system of statistics was inaugurated as early as 1953. It has the following particular characteristics within the present programme of work by SOEC.
 - 1.1 Except for certain periodical revisions the system poses only problems of day-to-day organization and data manipulation.
 - 1.2 In practice its costs are borne by the firms and professional organizations from which the Commission must gather the necessary information for the application of the various provisions of the ECSC Treaty.
 - 1.3 The comprehensive nature of the system, covering all factors of production, output and marketing, is commensurate with the importance of these sectors in an industrial economy and with the duties laid down by the ECSC Treaty. In effect these require the Commission to take decisions, to give guidance in various matters and to maintain controls down to the level of the individual firm (e.g. scrutiny and advice on individual capital expenditure projects, the regulation of conditions of sale, etc.).
 - 1.4 Nevertheless the Office, aware of the amount of work imposed on firms in these industries, endeavours:
 - a) to simplify the system as far as possible without compromising the statistical base necessary for application of the ECSC Treaty, which it would be as well to preserve at least until eventual fusion of the treaties.
 - b) to coordinate and harmonize this particular system with the general system of industrial statistics, notably in the field of nomenclature.
- 2. Finally, it may be noted the programme, derived from the Treaty of Paris, is not subject to approval by the Council but has been conceived and is regularly brought up to date by following the procedure for consultation with all interested parties, including government services, prescribed by the Treaty (see Article 5).
- 3. These objectives will call for closer collaboration than ever between the Office, the other services of the Commission and the national statistical institutes, in order to avoid disparate demands being placed on firms.

2. SOURCE

ECSC Treaty, Articles 46, 47 and 54.

3. AIM

To provide the necessary documentation for application of the ECSC Treaty and to incorporate data on coal in energy balance sheets.

4. DESCRIPTION

Approximately twenty questionnaires on coal, lignite and derived products. Capital expenditure inquiry bearing on present and future coal production capacity.

5. WORKPLAN

Tasks of day-to-day administration.

6. FINANCING

Nil.

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7. VOLUME OF WORK

Substantial enquiries addressed to 350 coal mining firms.

THEME NOTE E1.II : ENERGY BALANCES AND STATISTICS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : E1

1. INTRODUCTION

At the present time, energy balance-sheets and statistics have an increased importance. Though the whole range of energy statistics finds its first use in conjunctural studies and notably the development of Community energy policy, the Statistical Office foresees certain priorities in the coming years, in particular:

- 1. Promoting the comparability between energy statistics and other economic statistics and accounts, more particularly input-output tables. The object is to facilitate studies of the interdependence between energy and economic developments.
- 2. This improvement includes, among other things, a new start on the establishment of price statistics in the energy sector with a view to establishing balance sheets by value and better statistical information on the breakdown of energy consumption.
- 3. To develop energy statistics so as to take account of principal changes in the energy economy (promotion of nuclear statistics, extension of the petroleum products balance sheets, measurement of energy losses on transformation and consumption). This action involves reconsideration of certain methodological aspects of the energy balance sheets, particularly in adapting to the measurement units of the International System.

2. SOURCE

Need for harmonized energy statistics, in particular for laying down directions for energy policy, for economic analyses in the energy sector, and for actions taken with a view to rational energy utilization.

3. AIM

Placing at the disposal of the Commission and the Member countries comparable information, appropriate to each source of energy, in a unified and coherent frame. Developing balance sheets by taking into account the developments in the energy sector. Integration of energy statistics with other economic statistics.

4. DESCRIPTION

Seven questionnaires on gas: surveys and collection, from various sources, of prices and other energy statistics, including current monthly statistics by sources of energy: work on the structure of energy consumption, and energy losses.

5. WORKPLAN

For the most part continuous work with frequent and direct contacts with professional organizations, specialized departments and offices and national statistical offices, along with other international organizations such as the OECD-IEA, ECE Geneva, UN New York. With regard to improving information on the structure of consumption, specific action in the form of a survey of households to obtain individual information on their energy consumption and, to elaborate a methodology for a study and/or simplified survey on the breakdown by usage of industrial and domestic consumption.

With respect to the understanding of energy losses, the establishment of balance sheets expressed in "useful" energy.

6. FINANCING

In part, credit for studies (prices, balance sheets expressed in values, survey into the structure of energy consumption, study of useful energy).

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THEME NOTE E3.I : RAW MATERIALS BALANCE SHEETS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : E3

1. INTRODUCTION

The Commission's general policy on raw materials underlines the increasing need for statistical information on the Community's raw materials supply outlook.

In order to fulfil this objective, SOEC intends to draw up relatively detailed balance sheets for 19 raw materials, the need for which is felt to be particularly urgent by the Commission. These balance sheets will be prepared for the Member States and for the Community as a whole on the one hand and, in a simplified form, for the major third countries (producing as well as consuming countries) on the other.

2. SOURCE

Request from the Commission, in particular from DG III (Internal market and industrial affairs).

3. AIM

To improve knowledge on resources and uses of the raw materials concerned.

4. DESCRIPTION

The balance sheets for the Member States will be drawn up by the National Statistical Institutes and those for the Community and the third countries by Specialized Service E3.

5. WORKPLAN

The new Working Party on Raw Materials Balance Sheets of the Industrial Statistics Committee met for the first time on 29 and 30 March 1977. Following this meeting the questionnaires were sent out in June 1977. The first results were received at the end of 1977.

6. FINANCING

Possibly appropriations for studies.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

This will vary from small to very large depending on the country and the data which already exist.

THEME NOTE E4.I : ANNUAL AND LESS FREQUENT SURVEYS

OF INDUSTRIAL ENTERPRISES

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : E4

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1. A fundamental objective of the programme is the efficient operation of a system of collection and distribution emerging from the directives on annual coordinated surveys of investment in fixed assets and industrial activity.
- At the same time the Office will study, within this system, the value and scope of any other annual or longer term industrial survey.
- 3- The application of these statistics for the purposes of national and regional accounts will be examined.

2. SOURCE

Annual survey of industrial activity: Directive of 6 June 1972

Annual survey of investment: Directive of 30 July 1964

Surveys at five-yearly intervals as instructed by Article 2, chapter 2, of the Directive of 6 June 1972

Survey of consumption of main raw materials: request of the Council at its meeting 5/6 June 1972.

3. AIM

The purpose is to place at the disposal of the Commission as well as Member States comparable data permitting the analysis of the structure, the state and the economic growth of the different branches of industry and meeting statistical needs in the field of economic and statistical analysis.

4. DESCRIPTION

Surveys:

Annual survey of industrial activity Annual survey of capital investment Survey (at least) quinquennial of the structure and economic activity of small enterprises in industry and handicraft Survey of consumption of main raw materials.

Field of inquiry:

All industrial enterprises and, if appropriate, in handicrafts, which employ 20 or more persons and whose principal economic activity is contained in one of the groups of the NACE divisions 1 to 5. The enquiry at intervals of not more than 5 years will include those enterprises employing less than 20 persons.

4

Statistical units:

The statistics are collected by enterprises: some are also collected by kind of activity unit and by local unit.

5. WORKPLAN

The surveys are conducted by the Member States who will send the results in an agreed format to the Commission.

The annual survey of industrial activity has taken place for the first time in 1974 in respect of the year 1973. The results for the years 1973 and 1974 will be disseminated in 1977: the results for the year 1975 will be published in 1978.

The quinquennial survey will be carried out for the first time in 1979, covering the year 1978.

The sub-committee "Annual Inquiries and Censuses on Industry" will examine the methods for collecting data concerning the consumption of main raw materials, and the content of such a survey, in order to enable the Commission to submit proposals to the Council before the end of 1978.

The annual inquiry on investment has been carried out since 1965.

6. FINANCING

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Nil, as far as the surveys are concerned: possible future credits for studies.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Extensive work. The annual surveys of industrial activity and investment cover about 200 000 enterprises. The number of firms covered by the quinquennial survey will depend on the sample required.

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : E5

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1. Following the directive of 30.5.72, the Office undertook the task of putting a whole range of short-term industrial statistics at the disposal of the Commission, Member States and other users.
- The collection, analysis, presentation and rapid distribution of these indicators of industrial activity will be one of the first preoccupations of Directorate E.
- The Office will seek to keep a balance between different needs - speed and comparability, analysis of short-term trends in general and detailed study of specific branches.

2. SOURCE

Directive of 30.5.72.

3. AIM

To put at the disposition of the Commission and Member States the numerical data essential to the analysis of short-term economic trends.

4. DESCRIPTION

Field covered:

Indices of production, turnover, new orders, number of employees, hours worked, total wages, for those industries belonging to Divisions 1 to 4 of the NACE and, with some modifications, Division 5 (Building and civil engineering).

Method of collection:

Enquiries carried out by the national agencies, sometimes by means of sample surveys.

Presentation of results:

In the form of indices in total and by branch of industry (at present about 35 branches) as well as by the following groups:

industries producing investment goods industries producing consumer goods industries producing intermediate products.

5. WORKPLAN

The dissemination of the indices of production for 38 branches has been started. The dissemination will be successively extended to include the other indicators starting in 1978. A new publication is envisaged. Work is continuing in the Committee for statistics of industry. Directive for NACE division 5 has been adopted by the Council.

6. FINANCING

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7. VOLUME OF WORK

A very large number of important statistics at frequent intervals.

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THEME NOTE E5.II : INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION PRICES

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : E5

1. INTRODUCTION

The lack of information on prices of industrial products is a serious deficiency in the system of industrial statistics. This deficiency has also been noted by a number of Member States which have decided to reorganize or complement their surveys of industrial production prices or to introduce such surveys. The time is therefore right to establish Community statistics on industrial production prices. In addition, these statistics must be coordinated with other indices and price statistics (e.g. building and external trade prices). .

2. SOURCE

Statistical Office - Requests by the Commission.

3. AIM

To obtain short-term information on the evolution of industrial production prices.

4. DESCRIPTION

Establishment of a Community framework for drawing up industrial production price indices. Harmonization of methods.

Study for compiling statistics on <u>absolute</u> prices in respect of a limited number of products.

5. WORKPLAN

End of 1977/ Meetings of an "ad hoc" working group and adoption beginning 1978 of a specific work plan.

1978 Technical preparation in the Member States.

End of 1978-1979 Forwarding of data and dissemination of the first results.

6. FINANCING

Nothing.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Considerable volume of work as regards methods and data processing.

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THEME NOTE E5.III : SECTORIAL ANALYSIS

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : E5

1. INTRODUCTION

Following the European Council of London and the latest tripartite conference, the Commission decided to undertake important internal work on sectorial analysis. The Statistical Office will participate actively in these projects and in particular in two of them:

the setting up of a sectorial "display panel" which has been entrusted to DG II $\,$

EO.1 Data on aeronautical construction and construction of railway rolling stock

1. INTRODUCTION

Owing to the necessity of collaboration of the Common Market enterprises engaged in these two very important and highly concentrated industrial sectors, working parties have been set up by DG III in order to study with representatives of the competent trade associations more closely the structure, the evolution and the economic problems of these sectors. 4

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2. SOURCE

Industrial policy of the Commission.

3. AIM

Elaborate measures for improving international collaboration in the two sectors.

4. DESCRIPTION

Data is collected through trade associations on employees, turnover, external trade and research in these sectors.

5. WORKPLAN

Continuing.

DG III

EO.2 Forecasting of the construction activity of the building and civil engineering sector

1. INTRODUCTION

In the framework of a general programme of the steps to be taken to achieve a common market in the building and civil engineering sector, a special Working Party is dealing, in collaboration with SOEC, with the harmonization of national forecasts regarding the medium and long term evolution of the construction of residential and non-residential buildings and of civil engineering works.

2. SOURCE

Industrial policy of the Commission.

3. AIM

Elaboration, in close cooperation with SOEC, of common nomenclature and eventually common methods for the forecasts.

4. DESCRIPTION

The forecasts will be made by the competent administrations of the Member States.

5. WORKPLAN

The forecasts should cover five-year periods and should be revised each year.

DG III

EO.3 Statistics concerning multinational enterprises

1. INTRODUCTION

DG III has developed a file of the 1973 balance sheets of multinational enterprises: this file refers to the mother companies of enterprises of this type established all over the world. The number of these companies may be estimated at approximately 10 000.

2. SOURCE

Initiative of the Commission.

3. AIM

To collect information on multinational enterprises in order to appreciate the impact of their operations.

4. DESCRIPTION

- A. Main sources used:
 - a) List of enterprises: Yearbook "Who owns whom".
 - b) Annual reports and balance sheets asked for by letter directly to the enterprises themselves.
 4534 Common Market multinational enterprises and 2570 with their registered office in the United States were listed.
- B. The following data, extracted from the information received from the mother companies, was registered on the computer:

Name and registered office of each multinational enterprise

Consolidated turnover (or world level)

Total number of persons occupied by the group

Main and secondary activities

Number, localization and statutory link of the affiliated enterprises with the mother company.

5. WORKPLAN

Analysis of the information collected and establishing of a report on multinational enterprises.

The Commission could decide to utilize this report as a basis for more detailed statistical studies on the activity of each of the enterprises linked to a mother company in order to have a better knowledge of the impact of the multinationals' activity on the reception countries. It could foresee updating the information received each year.

DG II

E0.4 Surveys of short-term economic trends

1. INTRODUCTION

Information broken down by industry but covering the whole of the Community is required by businessmen and administrators so that they can follow the trend of demand and the progress of firms in each country and industry. Early in 1961 the Commission therefore set about establishing a harmonized survey among managements based on comparable definitions and methods in all the Member Countries, and this was followed by the successive introduction of an investment survey, a building survey and a consumer survey.

2. SOURCE

Commission.

3. AIM

To improve the analysis and forecasting of industrial activity and private consumption in the Member Countries.

4. DESCRIPTION

All four surveys are carried out by public or semi-public institutes in the Member Countries.

(a) The monthly business survey is carried out in all industries, except mining and quarrying and food manufacture. Participation is voluntary, but the number and size of firms responding are enough to make the results representative, both for industry as a whole and for individual industries.

Businessmen are asked each month for qualitative judgments on current levels of orders and stocks and short-term trends in output and prices, and supplementary questions are put up to four times a year on such subjects as capacity, employment and competitive position. The results are aggregated at industry, national and Community level using an agreed weighting procedure and general results are published in a four-monthly report. The respondents, however, get much more detailed results each month.

(b) The respondents to the investment survey are generally the same as to the business survey, with the exception that the former covers also mining and quarrying and food manufacture. The inquiry is timed to fit in as far as possible with the preparation of the twice-yearly forward economic budgets, and so surveys are carried out in October and February. In October a minor survey with a brief questionnaire gives an estimate of percentage growth in the current year and an idea of the trend in the following year. The February survey is more detailed, giving the percentage growth in the past year and a preliminary estimate for the current year. The questions are of course much more precise, asking for the actual value of investment. Again the general results are published, but more detailed figures are sent to respondents.

- (c) The building survey is carried out each month, and asks for information, again in the form of qualitative judgments, on development of activity, order books, employment and prices. The results are disseminated in the same way as the business survey.
- (d) The consumer survey is regarded as complementary to the business survey, reflecting trends in demand. The survey is carried out three times a year on a sample of households in each Member Country. Questions are asked on the households' opinions about trends in the general economic situation, and on their intentions of buying certain durable goods. Since the inquiry was not started on a Community basis until 1972 the results are not yet published regularly, but detailed analyses are currently being prepared.

EO.5 Coal and steel prices

1. INTRODUCTION

The ECSC Treaty establishes pricing rules for enterprises within the Coal and Steel Community and obliges them to publish basic price lists.

2. SOURCE

Article 60 of the ECSC Treaty.

3. <u>AIM</u>

To ensure compliance with the pricing rules.

4. DESCRIPTION

As well as publishing basic price lists, all enterprises declare to the Commission all selling operations following certain distinctions fixed by regulation.

5. WORKPLAN

E0.6 Energy balance sheets

1. INTRODUCTION

In order to assist the adaptation of energy policy to the new supply situation more information on short-term trends is required.

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2. SOURCE

Council Regulation No 1729/76 of 21 June 1976.

3. AIM

To construct provisional (half-yearly or quarterly in case of crisis) shortterm supply-demand balance sheets for energy.

4. DESCRIPTION

A confidential enquiry is undertaken of developments in the previous half year and forecasts for the current half year (or quarter in case of crisis). The information transmitted is of a confidential nature.

5. WORKPLAN

EO.7 Imports and exports of hydrocarbons

1. INTRODUCTION

This data is considered necessary for a proper appreciation of the supply situation within the Community, which in turn is essential in the formulation of a common energy policy.

2. SOURCE

Council regulations

imports: 1055/72 of 18 May 1972
exports: 388/75 of 13 February 1975

3. AIM

To monitor imports and exports of crude oil, petroleum products and natural gas from the Community.

4. DESCRIPTION

Enterprises are required to send to Member Countries data on actual imports and exports of hydrocarbons in the previous half year, and at the end of each year their forecasts for the following year, and these data are then forwarded to the Commission. The information transmitted is of a confidential nature.

5. WORKPLAN

EO.8 Petroleum Stocks

1. INTRODUCTION

The checking by the Commission of the obligation of the Member States to maintain a minimum level of stocks of crude oil and petroleum products is to be carried out by a periodic statistical enquiry of these stocks, which is effected within the overall framework of security of supplies.

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2. SOURCE

Council Directive of 20 December 1968 (414/68)

3. AIM

To superintend the maintenance of oil and petrol stocks at a level equivalent to 90 days or more, of average daily consumption.

4. DESCRIPTION

Member States will send to the Commission an abstract of the level of stocks existing at the end of each quarter. The information transmitted is of a confidential nature

5. WORKPLAN

Permanent.

E0.9 Thermal Power Station Stocks

1. INTRODUCTION

The checking by the Commission of the obligation of the Member States to maintain a minimum level of stocks of fossil fuel is to be carried out by a periodic statistical enquiry of these stocks, which is effected within the overall framework of security of supplies.

2. SOURCE

Council Directive of 20 May 1975 (339/75)

3. AIM

To superintend the maintenance of fossil fuel stocks at the thermal power stations at a level sufficient to ensure the continuation of electricity supplies for a period of at least 30 days.

DESCRIPTION

Member States send to the Commission a statement of the level of stocks at the thermal power stations existing on the lst April and lst October of each year. The information transmitted is of a confidential nature.

5. WORKPLAN

Permanent.

E0.10 Petroleum prices

1. INTRODUCTION

In its resolution on Community policy on hydrocarbons the Council stated that its policy should be based on transparency of costs and prices throughout the Community, and that there should be a coherent structure of price levels moving in response to realized changes in supply conditions.

2. SOURCE

Council Directive of 4 May 1976 (491/76)

3. AIM

To monitor and compare price levels in different Member Countries and to analyse the response of prices of refined products to charges in the cost of crude oil.

4. DESCRIPTION

Confidential quarterly information on import and ex-refinery prices of crude oil and petroleum products are collected by Member Countries from the oil companies and transmitted to the Commission, who analyse the data so as to obtain useful comparisons of price levels between countries by trying to eliminate the effects of consumption structures and distribution costs in the different markets.

5. WORKPLAN

EO.11 Coal and steel production data for levy purposes

1. INTRODUCTION

The Commission is empowered to finance its duties under the ECSC Treaty by imposing a levy on firms related to the average value of their production.

2. SOURCE

Article 50 of the ECSC Treaty.

3. AIM

To obtain the data necessary for the collection of the levy.

4. DESCRIPTION

The 350 coal mining and 400 iron and steel undertakings are required to declare their monthly production in physical units, in accordance with a simplified scheme whose structure is harmonized with that of the statistical questionnaire.

1. INTRODUCTION

In order to provide the Commission with the necessary information on external trade, important tasks, which moreover concern the Member States as suppliers as well as users of statistical data, will be undertaken. They comprise mainly:

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- the compilation and publication of basic information on the external trade statistics of the Community and statistics of trade between the Member States
- the preparation of statistics for multilateral trade negotiations within GATT (General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade) and for the statistical control of imports made under the Generalised System of Preferences (GSP)
- 3. the compilation of external trade indices.

2. SOURCE

Internal requirements of the Commission. Need for special information inter alia for GATT negotiations, surveillance of the GSP, etc.

3. <u>A</u>IM

To serve the Commission with special and harmonized information. To rationalize the compilation of statistical results.

4. DESCRIPTION

The timely supply of external trade statistics is the first priority of the statistical work programme.

The Commission represents the Community in many trade negotiations. Rapid and harmonized statistics are of the highest importance for the Community as a whole. The following subjects in particular need a considerable, permanent back-up of statistics:

multilateral trade negotiations in Geneva management of the Generalised System of Preferences negotiations on textiles and other goods application of the Lomé Convention statistics for other trade or non-trade negotiations with the developing countries or with other countries/groups of countries external trade statistics for iron and steel products

5. WORKPLAN

Member States are required by Regulation (EEC) 1736/75 to supply the Commission with their national data at the latest six weeks after the reference period. The SOEC duly converts this national data into Community data. The aim is to publish Community data on a quarterly basis before the end of the following quarter. Special tables, which serve a variety of uses, are produced for use by departments of the Commission on the basis of the Community data prepared as above.

6. FINANCING

Special studies : Engagement of experts

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Preparatory work and office management are the major tasks. When this work is put in hand it should lighten the current workload in the Member States. In the very near future it should be possible to reduce to a bare minimum the direct supply of data to the Commission which is now undertaken by the national services of the Member States.

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : F2

1. INTRODUCTION

The SOEC's tasks include supplying the Commission with the statistics intended for implementing the provisions of the various cooperation agreements concluded with the developing countries (Lomé Convention, agreements with the Maghreb and Mashreq countries, etc.) and preparing statistical files for international negotiations with these countries. 1

To this end, the SOEC's work consists in:

- a) processing and publishing the detailed foreign trade statistics of the ACP states and the Maghreb and Mashreq countries,
- b) setting up a statistical data bank for all the developing countries,
- producing calculations and drafts intended for international negotiations.

2. SOURCE

Request from the Commission on the basis of the Lomé Convention and other cooperation agreements.

3. AIM

To collect, analyse and disseminate rapidly and in a standard format the statistical data relating to the developing countries.

4. DESCRIPTION

a) Foreign trade statistics of the ACP states and the Maghreb and Mashreq countries

In collaboration with the statistical service of the United Nations, the department collects the foreign trade data of the ACP states and the Maghreb and Mashreq countries from the data carriers supplied by these countries. The data are converted into a common nomenclature, analysed and published.

b) General statistics of the developing countries

The department is responsible for collecting, analysing and disseminating all economic statistics relating to the developing countries on the basis of:

statistical documents compiled by these countries, existing international sources (UNO, IMF, DAC, IBRD, FAO, etc.).

In order for this information to be placed at the disposal of users within a short period, two data banks have been created: one (ZCA1), contains the foreign trade statistics and the other (ZPVD), the macro-economic statistics (national accounts, finances, industrial and agricultural production, etc.).

5. WORKPLAN

Work carried out in collaboration with the statistical services of the developing countries and other international organizations.

6. FINANCING

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Credits for studies.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Considerable since the new great advance in the Commission's development cooperation.

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THEME NOTE F2.II : TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THE STATISTICAL

SERVICES OF THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : F2

1. INTRODUCTION

The demand for technical assistance on the part of the statistical services of the ACP states continue to be extremely great. It is addressed more and more to international organizations and in particular the Community, especially since the signing of the Lomé Convention, one of the major aspects of which is the development of technical cooperation.

2. SOURCE

Request from the governments or regional organizations of the ACP states.

3. <u>AIM</u>

To supply technical assistance to the statistical services of the ACP states or to the statistical departments of the regional organizations in fields which are limited but of great interest to both the ACP states and the Commission.

4. DESCRIPTION

The principal forms which this activity will assume are:

- a) consultative services: advisers are sent to observe the introduction of a system or to help organize specific operations,
- b) vocational training for statisticians of developing countries by:
 - the organization of training periods in SDEC
 - liaising with DG VIII who are responsible for financing ACP students
 - sending lecturers to training institutes in Europe or Africa.

The Office is particularly involved with:

- CESD, Paris (European training center for economist statisticians from the developing countries)
- Munich retaining center
- Abidjan Statistical School
- IAMSEA, Kigali (African and Mauritian Institute for Statistics and Applied Economics)
- ISPEA, Yaoundé (Institute of Statistics, Planning and Applied Economics).

5. WORKPLAN

- a) Consultative services. A new project whose initial aim will be to help improve the collection, preparation and dissemination of the foreign trade statistics of the UDEAC countries (Cameroon, Central Africa, Gabon, Congo)
- b) Training regular work including Secretariat of CESD Board of Administration, CESD Scientific Committee, etc.

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : F3

1. INTRODUCTION

Now that the Commission is increasingly engaged on negotiations and talks with Third Countries, the service unit which is called upon to reply to requests for statistical information on these countries should be in a position to perform these tasks in as short a time as possible. It is a question, on the one hand, of setting up and processing current statistical series, on the other, of ad hoc studies and analysis of certain present-day problems in specific Third Countries. The tasks covered, therefore, in this subject note are many and diverse. Ŧ

2. SOURCE

Various requests from the Commission (in particular from DG I).

3. AIM

To make available a coordinated system of statistics on Third Countries, and in particular those seeking membership, which would be easily accessible and able to give rapid answers to the most varied requests.

4. DESCRIPTION

This totality of statistical tasks covering, at one and the same time, current statistics (regular updating of all series) and special ad hoc studies, is composed in particular of the following work: setting-up of a complete bibliographic data file on existing sources of information on Third Countries, collecting and processing elementary statistics on these countries, special studies and analyses of social-economic statistics of certain countries and groups of Third Countries.

5. WORKPLAN

To establish a data file as a basic source for later tasks and to put into operation a system of current statistics. To compile also studies on Third Countries' state-run foreign trade and, later on, studies on the Arab League countries, statistics on fishing in certain Third Countries, an analysis of Japan's foreign trade, petroleum statistics on certain Third Countries and a study of China's external trade, as well as replying to demands for statistics on the candidate countries from the Commission departments in Brussels.

6. FINANCING

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THEME NOTE F4.I : COORDINATION AND COMPILATION OF THE

STATISTICS ON GOODS TRANSPORT

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : F4

1. INTRODUCTION

To work out a common transport policy, the Commission needs to know and keep track of the volume carried by each mode of transport, broken down according to the nature of the goods, and periodically, according to certain geographical areas. 1

As existing statistics have considerable gaps which cannot be filled by means of Community legislation and existing bilateral agreements, revision of the principles governing these statistics is necessary.

2. SOURCE

Goods transport statistics by country: Commission Recommendation of 26 July 1961.

Goods transport statistics by region:

International road transport Council Directive No 69/467/EEC of 8 December 1969, under revision at the Council National road transport Draft directive now being discussed at the Council National and international transport by rail, inland waterway and sea: bilateral agreements.

3. <u>AIM</u>

To determine the volume of goods carried by each mode of transport, classified by transport links and by the nature of the goods.

4. DESCRIPTION

The following information is required:

 a) National transport: volume of goods carried and tkm hauled by each mode of transport, broken down according to the nature of the goods:

> within each Member State within each transport region between national transport regions.

 b) International transport: volume of goods carried and tkm hauled by each mode of transport, broken down according to the nature of the goods: initially: between Member States, and between Member States and third countries subsequently: between Community transport regions, and between these regions and non-Member States.

5. WORKPLAN

The Statistical Office has started revising the general objectives of the goods transport statistics for the various modes of transport, taking into consideration the experience gained with Council Directive No 69/467 and with the various proposals for directives in the field of goods transport by road. At the same time, the categories of goods and the transport regions currently used will be revised.

6. FINANCING

Yes (to a certain extent).

With the revision and elaboration of a new work plan for goods transport statistics, there should be a review of the financing of Member States' work by the Commission, aimed at obtaining greater commitment from the Member States.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

Considerable preliminary and setting-up work for the Statistical Office.

A great deal of work for the Member States, most of which is, however, already carried out for national purposes.

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THEME NOTE F5.I : SURVEYS ON THE STRUCTURE AND ACTIVITIES

OF ENTERPRISES PROVIDING SERVICES

UNIT RESPONSIBLE : F5

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1. To give direction to its common policies, the Commission needs basic data on the structure of firms providing services, particularly those concerned with distribution and transport.
- 2- The preparation of harmonized national accounts must be based, among other things, on the results of sector surveys on value added. For services, such surveys as exist in Member States are fragmentary.

2. SOURCE

Requested by services of the Commission (DG III, IV, V and VII).

3. AIM

To establish a system of statistics on firms providing services to complete general statistics.

4. DESCRIPTION

The harmonization of existing statistics to be completed later on by the organization of specific surveys should allow the progressive collection of basic data on the structure of enterprises and on the value added by them.

5. WORKPLAN

The programme for statistics on trade is nearly set up. This survey will be put into effect gradually, to the extent that individual Member States find possible. The first reference year (partial results) is 1977. The study of an extension of this programme to the transport sector started in 1977 and will continue in 1978.

An extension of the programme to the sectors of agents, hotel and catering trades, as well as to other sectors of services, is foreseen as falling within the tasks of the Specialized Service.

6. FINANCING

Funds will have to be provided for the implementation of the programme on wholesale and retail trade.

7. VOLUME OF WORK

A great deal of work to get it off the ground.

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FO.1 Surveillance of imports under the Generalised System of Preferences

1. INTRODUCTION

Imports of so-called sensitive and quasi-sensitive goods are put under surveillance as well as agricultural processed goods. This work is done on the authority of Council regulations which are renewed each year and which list the products under the above categories, showing the countries which benefit.

2. SOURCE

The Customs services of the Member States.

3. AIM

To trigger the decision to reintroduce normal Customs processes whenever ceilings and maximum prices are exceeded.

4. WORKPLAN

Continuation of previous tasks.

FO.2 Surveillance of imports from EFTA countries

1. INTRODUCTION

This system of surveillance has been largely inspired by the Generalised System of Preferences. It is based on Council Regulations (EEC) 2901 to 2910 dated 7.11.74 which are aimed at setting up Community surveillance of imports of goods originating in EFTA countries.

2. SOURCE

The Customs services of the Member States.

3. <u>AIM</u>

To trigger the reintroduction of the Custom duties in force for third countries if and when the indicative ceilings are exceeded.

4. WORKPLAN

Continuation of previous tasks.

F0.3 Importations for inward processing

1. INTRODUCTION

Article 31 of Council Directive (EEC) 69/73 provides that Member States will send to the Commission statistical information on importations for inward processing. This Article was later amplified by Commission Directive 73/37 as to the way in which Article 31 was to be carried out.

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2. SOURCE

The Customs services of Member States.

3. AIM

The surveillance of importations for inward processing.

4. WORKPLAN

Continuation of previous tasks.

FO.4 The setting up of a system of transport market indicators

1. INTRODUCTION

In order to ensure the efficient functioning of the transport market it is necessary to have regular information on a number of its aspects.

2. SOURCE

Commission.

3. AIM

The objective of the system is to aid policy formulation by examining the trend of the balance between supply and demand in the goods transport market between Member States and by making forecasts up to five years ahead.

4. DESCRIPTION

As a preliminary, two analytical studies were carried out to determine suitable data for measuring trends and making forecasts. The Council, in November 1976, called for a report defining the scope of the system, the availability of existing data, the gaps to be filled and the resource costs involved. The next phase will be to assemble the necessary data and make forecasts.

5. WORKPLAN

The two analytical studies were completed by the end of 1976. The report has been presented to the Council in September 1977, after which assembly of existing data will commence.
