# OPINION OF THE COMMISSION pursuant to Article 189 b (2) (d) of the EC Treaty, on the European Parliament's amendments to the Council's common position regarding the

proposal for a EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND COUNCIL DIRECTIVE

on masses and dimensions and amending Directive 70/156/EEC relating to the typeapproval of motor vehicles and their trailers

AMENDING THE PROPOSAL OF THE COMMISSION pursuant to Article 189 a (2) of the EC Treaty



Parliament on 09-04-1997 adopted two amendments to the common position adopted by the Council on 28-11-1996 on a European Parliament and Council Directive on masses and dimensions and amending Directive 70/156/EEC.

In accordance with Article 189b(2)(d) of the Treaty, the Commission hereby delivers a favourable opinion on these amendments, on the following grounds:

- The proposed additional wording in Amendment 1 (recital 1) is a matter of clarification and does not change the substance of the paragraph.
- The proposed additional wording in Amendment 2 (recital 6) refers "to pursue the constant improvement of safety, in particular regarding to the use of certain categories of carriages or trailers". It stresses the importance of the improvement of safety of vehicles and trailers, an objective to which the Commission can adhere.

For these reasons, the Commission has decided, in line with Article 189a of the EC Treaty, to alter its proposal so as to incorporate the amendments adopted by the Parliament.

Given the closeness of the dates of entry into force foreseen in the common position, it considers it a matter of urgency that the Council modifies its common position accordingly and adopts the text in question.

## (Amendment 1) Recital 1

## (Amendment 2) Recital 6

the Whereas. as a consequence, harmonisation of the maximum authorised masses of motor vehicles and their trailers to be registered in the member States does not appear to be feasible in the short term; whereas on the other hand it does now appear feasible to achieve, as far as the harmonisation of their possible. maximum dimensions, and to deal with the question of masses by providing for the possibility of a uniform procedure to determine registration/in-service the maximum permissible masses of vehicles in each member State;

Whereas, consequence, as a the harmonisation of the maximum authorised masses of motor vehicles and their trailers to be registered in the member States does not appear to be feasible in the short term; whereas on the other hand it does now appear feasible to achieve, as far as the harmonisation of their possible. maximum dimensions, to deal with the question of masses by providing for the possibility of a uniform procedure to determine the registration/in-service maximum permissible masses of vehicles in each member State, and to pursue the constant improvement of safety, in particular with regard to certain categories of trailers;
