PROPODAL FOR COUNCIL REGULATION (FEG) ON THE GRAFFFIG OF AID BY THE REPOPEAN AGRECULATION. GUILARDE AND GUARANTEE FUND, GUIDANCE SECTION, IN 1978 and 1979 PURSUANT TO REGULATION Nr. 17/64/ERG AND TO COUNCIL DIRECTIVE 77/391/ERG.

(Presented by the Commission to the Council)

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

During the Councils 516th session of 8 to 12 May 1978, it invited the Commission to take the necessary steps to permit the financing in 1978 and 79 of measures in the field of production structures on the basis of Regulation (EEC) No. 17/64 on complementary arrangements still to be proposed and, in the former case, to accept the presentation of individual projects by the Member States up to 1 October 1978. The financing should be by derogation of article 6 of Regulation No. 729/70 as it is necessary to have recourse to the reserves entered in Chapter 88 of the budget.

In this context, the Council noted the intention of the Commission to propose certain complementary measures to those in existence in order to be better able to take account of the particular need of Belgian, Dutch and Luxembourg agriculture and to take account, when deciding on the granting of EAGGF aid to these projects, in particular of the importance of problems met by agriculture in these Member States.

- 2. Article 6(4) of Regulation (EEC) No. 729/70 provides that Regulation No. 17/64/EEC shall cease to apply when expenditure on common measures by the EAGGF, Guidance Section, exceeds the annual amount made available to this Section (325 million u.a.). This will be the case in 1978.
- 3. After the adoption of a number of common measures, Regulation No. 17/64/EEC applies mainly to the granting of aid to projects for the improvement of agricultural infrastructures in the Community ceases to apply, except for the measures foreseen in Council Regulation (EEC) No. 1760/78 of 25.7.78, concerning a common measure for the improvement of infrastructures in certain rural zones.

Even these measures must await the approval by the Commission of the national programmes before they can be effectively applied.

- 4. The improvement of agricultural infrastructures remains an important Community requirement. Projects for improving structures, particularly in this field, are increased in programmes or plans which are drawn up some time before the application for aid is submitted. The sudden cessation of the flow of aid would therefore disturb these programmes and discourage local and regional initiatives. It is therefore justified to make provision for at least a transitional period during which the Regulation will remain in force so that aid can be given to the most important and urgent projects
- 5. Concerning certain measures which are necessary in Benelux countries to resolve the particular problems of agriculture in these countries they could comprise of specific measures which cannot be inserted within the framework of the existing Regulation No. 17/64/EEC. It is fitting however that the Community also participate in the financing of these measures, which will necessitate the derogation to certain conditions of the regulation.

Among the specific actions considered, for Belgium in particular, is the intensification of the eradication of bovine brucellosis, a derogation to this effect shall be provided for in this regulation. This derogation is limited to the amount of the premium; it is also limited in time to the total length of the action which is 3 years.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 43

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Having regard to the Opinion of the European Parliament,

Whereas, in accordance with Article 6(4) of Council Regulation (EEC)
No. 729/70 of 21 April 1970 on the financing of the common agricultural
policy (1) last modified by Regulation (EEC) No. 2788/72 (2), the
provisions of part two of Council Regulation No. 17/64/EEC of 5 February
1964 on the conditions for granting aid from the European Agricultural Guidance
and Guarantee Fund, (3) last modified by Regulation (EEC) No. 3171/75
(4) should cease to apply in 1978, since the expenditure of the Guidance
Section on the financing of common measures will exceed the total annual
appropriations available to that Section;

Whereas there is still considerable need in the Member States for financial assistance by the Community by means of common measures;

Whereas it appears necessary to permit temporarily Community intervention in these sectors;

Whereas Regulation No. 17/64/EEC is particularly suitable for solving these problems, its validity should therefore be extended;

Whereas certain problems particular to agriculture of the countries of Benelux could necessitate specific measures which do not fit the present conditions laid down in Regulation No 17/64/EEC.

Whereas it would seem opportune nevertheless that the Community participates in the financing of these measures and therefore it is necessary to provide for the possibility of derogating from certain conditions laid down in Regulation No 17/64/EEC.

whereas moreover in the framework of the national plans for the application of Council Directive (EEC) 77/391 of 17 May 1977 setting up a Community action for the eradication of bovine brucellosis, tuberculosis and leucosis (1), it would appear opportune to foresee the doubling of the slaughter premium paid in respect of certain regions with a high incidence of these deseases in the countries of the Benelux

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

- 1. By way of derogation from the provisions of Article 6(4) of Regulation (EEC) No 729/70, the provisions of Part two of Regulation No 17/64/EEC, with the exception of Articles 14 (1)(a) and 16, shall continue to apply in 1978 and 1979. These arrangements are also applicable to projects in the coastal fishing sector, alluded to in Article 1 of Regulation (EEC) No 1852/78 (2), which have not been awarded aid due to insufficient available funds.
- 2. By derogation to the conditions of 11 (1) and 22 (1) of Regulation No 17/64/EEC and the condition that measures to be granted aid must take the form of capital investment projects, requests for aid may be admitted following the procedure laid down in Article 19 (1) of the above-mentioned regulation to cope with the particular problems of agriculture in the countries of Benelux.
- 3. Applications for aid for 1978 and 1979 must be submitted to the Commission before 1 December 1978.

4. The Commission shall take a decision on these applications in one or more instalments before 31 December 1979.

Article 2

In derogation to Article 7 (2) of Directive 77/391/EEC the EAGGF Guidance Section can pay to Member States of Benelux who request it in respect of certain regions particularly suffering from these bovine diseases an amount not exceeding 120 ua per cow and 60 ua per bovine other than cows, slaughtered in the framework of the actions set out in chapter I of the above mentioned directive.

Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
