# ON EMERGENCY FOOD AID TO THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF MOZAMBIQUE

IN FAVOUR OF NEEDY PERSONS IN THAT COUNTRY

#### 1. Request of Mozambique

The Government of the People's Republic of Mozambique has recently requested the EEC for emergency food aid involving:

10 000 t maize

5 000 t wheat

10 000 t ground nuts (or oil/butteroil equivalent)

4 000 t skimmed milk powder

These commodities are intended to feed:

- those who fled before the independence to mearby countries (Malawi, Zambia, Rhodesia and Tanzania) and have since returned to Mozambique;
- victims of floods affecting the southern part of the country after a cyclone.

The present request should be examined in the light of the very difficult economic situation of Mozambique following independence. This can be summed up as follows:

- 1. departure of Portuguese citizens;
- 2. problems linked with the reintegration of refugees (unemployment, etc);
- 3. decision of the Government of Mozambique, based on previous UN resolutions, to close the border with Rhodesia; this measure has caused the loss of foreign currencies amounting to about 57 million U.S. dollars (termination of trade, reduced activities of railways supplying the ports of BEIRA and MAPUTO (1).

- 4. consequences of cyclone DANAE which has caused important floods (overflow of the river LIMPOPO southwards from MAPUTO).
- and to the resolution/ to the appeal launched by the Mozambique authorities of the UN Security Council of 17.3.1976, many countries and organizations have given financial, technical and material aid (2).

The Commission considers that the Community should contribute to the international efforts by a grant of food aid.

#### II. ANALYSIS OF NEEDS AND PROPOSAL

- A. According to the information supplied by the FAO, Mozambique is facing a structural deficit in food products. During the next 18/24 months this deficit can be estimated at 250.000 t of cereals (whereof 40.000t of rice) and 4.000 t of skimmed milk powder.
- B. As regards the present request the authorities envisage to put into operation a food aid programme for more than 120.000 people (refugees and victims of floods).

C. Consequently, on the basis of general criteria applied by the Community in this type of situation (1), the Commission proposes to approve the provision of emergency food aid to Mozambique, to be delivered CIF, involving:

5.000 t wheat

300 t skimmed milk powder

200 t butteroil.

The cost of the operation would be about 1.330.000 u.a. (2).

The aid would be charged:

as regards the cereals, to the reserve under the 1975/76 programme, as regards the skimmed milk powder, to the reserve under the 1976 programme (first instalment of 55.000 t),

as regards the butteroil, to the reserve under the 1975 programme. (3)

This first operation should be followed up by the additional one under the 1976/77 programme (cereals) and 1977 programme (butteroil). In this respect, 750 t of skimmed milk powder have been already proposed by the Commission under the 1976 skimmed milk powder programme (second instalment of 95.000 t).

#### CONCLUSION

In view of the foregoing it is proposed that the Council:

- decide to supply to the People's Republic of Mozambique emergency food aid in favour of needy persons in that country, involving the allocation of 5 000 t of common wheat, 200 t of butteroil and 300 t of skimmed-milk powder;
- approve the delivery of this aid to the port of unloading;
- adopt in consequence the acts annexed hereto.

Whereas Regulation (EEC) N° 1541/75 provides for the supply of 43,400 metric tons of butteroil as food aid to certain developing countries and international organizations,

Whereas Council Regulation (EEC) N° 1542/75 of 16 June 1975 on the supply of milk fats as food aid to certain developing countries and international organizations under the 1975 food aid programme (2) provides for a reserve of 4,550 metric tons of butteroil,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

Of the 4,550 metric tons of butteroil provided for as a reserve by Regulation (EEC) N° 1542/75, 200 metric tons shall be allocated to the People's Republic of Mozambique/ in favour of needy persons in that country.

#### Article 2

The Community shall bear the cost of transport to the port of unloading.

#### Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

Of the 3,630 metric tons of skimmed milk powder provided for as a reserve by Regulation (EEC) N° 1299/76, 300 metric tons shall be allocated to the People's Republic of in favour of needy persons in that country.

#### Article 2

The Community shall bear the cost of transport to the port of unloading.

#### Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
