**COMMON MARKET PRESIDENT TO VISIT THE UNITED STATES**

WASHINGTON, D.C., April 6 -- Professor Walter Hallstein, President of the Commission of the European Economic Community, will arrive in Washington on April 7 for a three-week visit in the United States.

In Washington, the head of the executive branch of the six-nation Common Market will confer with President Kennedy and with Cabinet members including Secretary of State Dean Rusk, Secretary of Commerce Luther Hodges, Secretary of Labor Arthur Goldberg, Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman, and other Administration and Congressional leaders. During his stay in the nation's capital, he will also meet with A.F.L. - C.I.O. leaders and deliver addresses at the National Press Club and Georgetown University.

Professor Hallstein will later visit Boston, Seattle, and New York. In Boston he will deliver the annual Clayton Lectures at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy and receive an honorary degree from Tufts University. In Seattle, he will participate in the opening ceremonies of Seattle's "Century 21" Exposition where the European Community is a major participant. In New York, Professor Hallstein will address a meeting of the Economic Club of New York.

During his stay, the Common Market leader will confer with business, labor, and agriculture leaders and discuss some of the prospects and problems arising out of the developing partnership between the United States and the Common Market.

He is scheduled to arrive at Washington National Airport at 5:10 p.m. EST on Saturday (April 7) via National Flight 701. He is scheduled to depart for Europe on April 25.
