THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation No 120/67/EEC⁽¹⁾ of 13 June 1967 on the common organization of the market in cereals, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1346/73⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 5 (5) (b) thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission;

Whereas, in accordance with Article 5 (1) of Regulation No 120/67/EEC, the threshold price for the principal cereals must be fixed in such a way that the selling price for the imported product on the Duisburg market will be the same as the target price; whereas, by deducting from the target price the most advantageous transport costs between Rotterdam and Duisburg, transshipment charges at Rotterdam and a trading margin, this objective may be attained; whereas the target prices were fixed for the 1974/75 marketing year by Regulation (EEC) No ⁽³⁾;

Whereas the threshold prices for other cereals for which no target price is fixed must, in accordance with Article 5 (2) of Regulation No 120/67/EEC, be so determined that the target price for the principal cereals in competition with these products may be reached at Duisburg;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Sole Article

For the 1974/75 marketing year, the threshold prices for cereals shall be as follows:

	Units of account per 1000 kg
Common wheat and meslin	119,65
Rye	116,80
Barley	108,30
Maize	107,25
Durum wheat	180,60
Oats	101,80
Buckwheat	102,89
Sorghum	106,13
Millet	104,51
Canary seed	102,89

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
