THE CANADIAN COUNCIL FOR EUROPEAN AFFAIRS AWARDS
ITS ANNUAL EUROPEAN PRIZE

The Canadian Council for European Affairs has awarded its European Prize to Mrs. Vera A. Reusens in recognition of her Master's thesis "An Examination of the Relationship between European Political Cooperation and the European Economic Community on the Question of Economic Sanctions", which was presented in November 1982 to the Norman Paterson School of International Affairs, Carleton University. With the Prize, Mrs. Reusens receives the sum of \$500.00.

The Canadian Council for European Affairs is an organization grouping people from government, business and academic milieux for the purpose of promoting better understanding of the process of European integration and specifically EC/Canada links. Founded in 1979 and supported by universities and public and private sectors, the Council's activities include conferences, round tables, and publication of a quarterly revue, the Journal of European Integration.

The European Prize is awarded annually for the best Master's thesis on European integration or on Canada-Europe relations, completed at a Canadian university. There is no restriction as to the academic field of the thesis (economics, history, law, literature, political science, sociology, etc.).
