BRITAIN TO PRESENT C.A.P. PROPOSALS

There will be a Council of Agricultural Ministers in Luxembourg on Monday and Tuesday, June 17 and 18. Mr. Peart will expand on the British proposals for changes in the C.A.P. and is expected to suggest a new beef support system.

The meeting of the Council of Foreign Ministers scheduled for June 17 will not, as expected, take place. But the Ministers will meet in Luxembourg the following week, Tuesday June 25.

A decision will be taken today on whether a Council of Environment and Transport Ministers will take place on June 27.

Depending on the mood of next week's Agricultural Ministers Council a further meeting might take place on June 24 and 25.

COMMISSIONERS' MOVEMENTS

Prof. Dahrendorf arrives in Britain on June 16 to address a Liberal Party Congress in Aviemore. He will also address the Parliamentary and Scientific Committee of the House of Commons on June 18.

FLASHBACK

On Monday, June 10, the Council of Ministers on Social Affairs agreed to release money from Article 4 of the Social Fund to aid migrant workers. Agreement on a directive giving protection to workers in mergers was blocked by the British Government.

Also on Monday, the Italian Government headed by Signor Rumor fell amidst growing economic disruption.

In a Commons debate on Europe on June 11 James Callaghan got widespread support for his renegotiation tactics.
