CONFERENCE IN KINGSTON

Four Councils of Ministers have been confirmed for July, as follows:

Monday, July 15	Finance
Monday and Tuesday, July 15 and 16	Agriculture
Tuesday, July 16	Development and cooperation
Monday and Tuesday, July 22 and 23	Foreign Affairs.

All these meetings will take place in Brussels.

Ministers of the Nine have accepted an invitation to a conference in Kingston, Jamaica, on July 25 and 26, with Ministers of the 44 developing countries negotiating trade and aid arrangements with the Community.

On Tuesday next, July 2, Mr. George Thomson, member of the Commission for regional affairs, will attend a conference of editors of regional newspapers organised by this office in York. Around 40 editors are expected. Mr. Thomson will be accompanied by three members of the Commission's staff from Brussels, and three from London.

Also on Tuesday next, Dr. Patrick Hillery, Vice-President of the Commission for social affairs, will address a London seminar organised by the British Council for the Rehabilitation of the Disabled. In the afternoon, with Mr. Alfred Morris, Minister for the Disabled, he will visit the Disabled Living Foundation's centre in Kensington.

FLASHBACK

During a Nato summit meeting for the signing of a new Declaration of Atlantic Principles, the British Prime Minister met other leaders from Member States of the Community. It was announced he would visit Paris next month.

As farmers described the slide in the beef market as the worst since the 1930s, the Minister of Agriculture, Mr. Peart, announced in the Commons that he would seek approval from the Community for new measures to underpin the producer price of beef.
