SOCIAL FUND - THIRD SERIES, 1976

#### Extensive Grants to Northern Ireland

The Commission has approved the financing of the third series of applications from the European Social Fund for vocational training activities in the Member States.

The Social Fund's assistance in the form of non-repayable grants for this third series of applications amounts to approximately 288.6 million units of account (£121.3m). The amounts of assistance granted in the first and second series approved earlier this year were 38 million u.a. (£15.8m) and 100 million u.a. (£41.7m) respectively.

The expenditure approved in this third series is allocated over a three-year period covering 1976/77/78. The commitments to aid retraining schemes during 1976 amount to 142.9 million u.a. (£60m); in 1977 to 103.9 million u.a. (£43.4m), and in 1978 to 41.8 million u.a. (£17.4m).

However, some of these figures may have to be adjusted because of "accounting shifts" and consequently the final figures for total applications 1976 will not be available until a later date. The total <u>budget</u> for 1976 is 440 million u.a. (£183.3m).

In this third series the United Kingdom receives a total of around £26.lm bringing the aggregate total during 1976 to £32.9 million.

In accordance with the rules of the reform of the Social Fund the Commission can reimburse 50 % of the cost of retraining schemes financed by a public authority. In the case of schemes carried out by private bodies, the Commission grant will equal that made by the public authorities.

# A. ACTIONS IN FAVOUR OF CATEGORIES AND SECTORS

Under this heading the Social Fund can assist in the retraining of persons who are: leaving agriculture; leaving the textile industry or acquiring new skills in textiles; migrant workers; handicapped workers; under 25 years and unemployed or in search of first time employment. The following are some examples of schemes under these various heading.

#### 1. Young people

Germany: the programme organised by the Bundesministerium für Bildung und Wissenschaft whereby public undertakings such as the railways and the post office took on apprentices in addition to their own requirements received a grant of 25,625,000 DM (7 mua) over a three year period to benefit some 1,500 young people who have been unemployed for more than eight months.

#### CORRECTION TO OUR PRESS RELEASE ISEC/3/77

### Social Fund Totals - 1976

A major allocation of expenditure allocated by the Social Fund, and announced on January 24, while included in the detailed text, was inadvertantly dropped from the totals.

The allocation is to the Northern Ireland Department of Manpower Services (see page 4 of the press release) for three separate training schemes for 2230 young persons from January 1976 to December 1977, under Article 4 (young persons) £2,708,831 and Article 5 (regions) £538,024.

This makes the total allocation to Northern Ireland £7,326,562 and the total for Britain in this third series (see page 1) £29.4 million making a grand total for Britain in 1976 of £36.2 million.

Italy: a grant of 1,117,500,000 Lire (1.7 mua) will be made over a three year period to the Chamber of Commerce in Regio - Emilia for its new training programme to prepare about 225 young unemployed people for a career as junior managers in the distributive sector throughout Italy.

United Kingdom: the Social Fund has agreed a contribution of £4,289,308 (10.3 mua) towards the 1976 programme of special measures organised by the Training Services Agency and designed to make an additional 10,000 apprenticeships available to young unemployed people in assisted areas.

Ireland: the special programmes of training in middle-level technician and secretarial skills for about 900 young unemployed people, organised through the Department of Education at various regional technical colleges, will be granted about £1,082,145 over a three year period (2.5 mua).

Denmark: more than 6 million Dkr (0.8 mua) will be granted towards the various activities of the Ministries of Education and Labour to provide pre-employment courses and additional apprenticeships and training programmes for over 1,200 young unemployed people during 1976-1978.

#### 2. Migrants

Italy: for the period September 1, 1976, to December 31, 1978, the Social Fund will grant about 12 million u.a. towards the financing of a series of specialized courses for the children of Italian migrant workers. The courses will involve:

a) the teaching of Italian to about 75,000 children in Belgium Federal Republic of Germany, France, Luxembourg, Netherlands and the United Kingdom;

b) facilitating the reintegration of 16,000 children of migrant workers who have returned to Italy in the regions of Abruzzo, Bassilicata, Calabri, Molise, Veneto and Sicily.

Belgium: about BF 4.6 million will be spent by the Social Fund in 1976 and 1977 as part-financing of integration classes for 335 children of migrant workers in Brussels, Charleroi and Ghent.

United Kingdom: about £36,000 has been granted by the Social Fund to the National Centre of Industrial Language Training to help finance training for 200 teachers responsible for language courses for migrant workers within firms to facilitate integration into the working environment.

#### 3. Handicapped

Belgium: the Social Fund will contribute about BF 49 million towards the cost of the occupational training of about 600 handicapped persons in six centres.

Denmark: about DK 28 million will be granted to assist the training of handicapped persons in specialized centres.

France: among the French schemes for retraining handicapped persons aided by the Social Fund is one organized by the Provence-Côte d'Azur region authorities and which will receive FF 27 million. Two smaller schemes for the retraining of handicapped migrants will receive FF 1.5 million.

<u>Italy</u>: about Lit. 1.2 milliard will be provided for retraining of persons handicapped as a result of accidents at work.

Luxembourg: the Social Fund will provide F Lux. 5 million for schemes to retrain handicapped persons.

#### B. ACTIONS ON A REGIONAL AND INDUSTRY BASIS

Under this heading, the Social Fund can grant financial assistance for retraining schemes in favour of workers who are threatened with unemployment in the poorer regions of the Community and who are affected by technical progress or by problems in groups of undertakings. The following are some examples of schemes assisted.

#### Technical progress

Federal Republic of Germany: the Social Fund will grant 473,164 u.a. (about DM1.7 million) towards the retraining over two years of about 400 workers to enable them to convert from the production of mechanical watches to that of electronic watches.

United Kingdom: the creation of the Joint Standing Committee for the major national newspapers (a body comprising both sides of industry) to implement a far-reaching plan for re-organisation, has led to a significant re-training plan to face up to the challenge and promise of technological advance of new equipment. The Social Fund will contribute approximately 7.2 million u.a. (£3 million) over the next three years towards the cost of retraining approximately 12,000 workers affected by technical progress in this sector.

Italy: the distribution sector in Italy is characterized by an excessive fragmentation of small, family-style undertakings many of which are gradually being squeezed out of business. The Social Fund will help finance training courses to provide organizers and coordinators who can give expert advice to the distribution sector. The Social Fund will contribute about 1.1 million u.a. (Lit.688 million) over three years.
