# SOCIAL FUND GRANTS - FIRST SERIES 1977 - 217 mua\* (£ 90.4m)

#### UK Young Workers' Schemes Get Over £ 16 million

The Commission has approved the financing of the first set of applications for 1977 from the European Social Fund for vocational training activities in the Member States.

The Social Fund's assistance in the form of non-repayable grants for the first series of applications amounts to approximately 217 million units of account (£ 90.4m).

Some of the training programmes assisted are spread over the three-year period 1977 - 78 - 79, though most of the expenditure is likely to be spent during 1977.

Further grants from the Social Fund will be announced in the course of the year so care should be taken not to draw conclusions concerning the total allocations for 1977 on the basis of this first series.

The total Social Fund budget for 1977 is 616 million u.a. (£  $257 \, \text{m}$ )

In this first series the United Kingdom receives a total of around £ 23.4m. Last year the overall total allocated to the UK was some £ 36.2m.

In accordance with the rules of the Social Fund the Commission can reimburse 50% of the cost of retraining schemes financed by a public authority. In the case of schemes carried out by private bodies, the Commission grant will equal that made by the public authorities.

Applications for Social Fund aid are first assessed by the Commission's services for conformity with the Fund regulations and with the guidelines laid down for the management of the Fund which are periodically updated. Then the Social Fund Committee, consisting of representatives of governments, trade unions and employers, gives its opinion on the applications and the Commission takes its final decision in the light of the Committee's views.

#### A. ACTIONS IN FAVOUR OF CATEGORIES AND SECTORS (Article 4)

Under this heading, the Social Fund can assist in the retraining of persons who are : leaving agriculture; leaving textiles or acquiring new skills in textiles; migrant workers; handicapped workers; young

persons under 25 years of age and unemployed or in search of a first job. Applications approved under this heading in this first series amount to about 146 million u.a. of which 104 million u.a. is for the retraining of young people.

#### B. ACTIONS ON STRUCTURAL PROBLEMS (Article 5)

Under this heading, the Social Fund can grant financial assistance for retraining schemes in favour of workers who are threatened with unemployment in the poorer regions of the Community and who are affected by technical progress or by problems in groups of undertakings. Applications approved under these headings in the first series amount to about 71 million u.a. of which 68 million u.a. is for regional schemes.
