FLASHBACK

EEC-JAPAN: Christopher Tugendhat, Commissioner in charge of the budget, on his return from an official visit to Japan, reported that the Commission's ideas on a greater opening of the Japanese market to European bankers had been received favourably.

<u>EEC-COMECON</u>: Negotiations between the European Community and Comecon will open in Moscow on May 29. The EEC will be represented by Vice-President Haferkamp and Comecon by its Secretary-General Mr Nicolai Fadeev.

<u>AGRICULTURE</u>: Commenting on the results of the agricultural council, Mr Gundelach, Commissioner in charge of agriculture, said that the Council had followed the Commission's lead in keeping prices down. The decision to provide assistance for Mediterranean agriculture were an historic step forward.

ECSC LOAN FOR COAL BOARD: A loan of £65 million has been made to the National Coal Board under the Coal and Steel Community treaty for the development of a new mine at Selby in Yorkshire.

<u>METRICATION</u>: The British government has dropped the element of compulsion in metrication plans, though it still intends to push on with the change.
