MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION tabled by Sir Jack STEWART-CLARCK

pursuant to Rule 47 of the Rules of Procedure

on the preservation of Britain's piers

## The European Parliament,

- A recalling the Commission's Communication to the Council on Community action in the cultural sector<sup>1</sup> and the opinion thereon of the European Parliament<sup>2</sup>, both of which stressed the value and importance of Community action in the restoration and preservation of buildings of architectural significance,
- B whereas conservation and restoration projects can have a positive social effect, insofar as they are a means of providing employment, especially for the young jobless and when completed, act as a stimulus to tourism,
- C whereas in Britain piers are a characteristic feature of the coastline, of importance both for their architectural significance (many of them having been built in the nineteenth century) and for the amenities they provide,
- D whereas many of these piers, despite valuable efforts by local conservation groups, are in urgent need of restoration,
- Calls on the Commission to examine the ways in which it could, as part of a concerted Community programme on the conservation of the architectural heritage, provide assistance, both financial and otherwise, to those organizations, bodies and local councils which are working to preserve British piers.
- 2. Asks the Commission to consider, in addition to financial assistance under Item 6702 of the budget, the extent to which a conservation project of this nature, providing jobs for the young unemployed, could receive support from the European Social Fund;
- 3. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission.
