# COMMISSION COMMUNICATION TO THE COUNCIL

on the negotiations between the Member States of the European Coal and Steel Community and the Lebanese Republic for the conclusion of an Agreement under the overall Mediterranean policy

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on the negotiations between the Member States of the European Coal and Steel Community and the Lebanese Republic for the conclusion of an Agreement as part of the overall Mediterranean policy

1. The negotiations between the Member States of the European Coal and piece.

Community and the Lebanese Republic for the conclusion of an Agreement as part

of the overall Mediterranean policy were concluded in Brussels, on 16 February 77.

The text of the draft agreement was initialled by the Heads of the two Delegations, who indicated their agreement to the contents. This text represents the results of the negotiations conducted on the basis of the directives of the Member States meeting in the Council on 16 January 1976.

The Commission considers that it has fulfilled its negotiating mandate. It therefore recommends that the Member States approve the results of these negotiations and set in motion the procedure for the signature and conclusion of the Agreement with Lebanon, the text whereof appears hereafter.

# AGREEMENT

BETWEEN THE MEMBER STATES OF
THE EUROPEAN COAL AND STEEL COMMUNITY
AND

THE LEBANESE REPUBLIC

THE KINGDOM OF BELGIUM.

THE KINGDOM OF DENMARK,

THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY,

THE FRENCH REPUBLIC,

IRELAND,

THE ITALIAN REPUBLIC,

THE GRAND DUCHY OF LUXEMBOURG,

THE KINGDOM OF THE NETHERLANDS and

THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND,

being Member States of the European Coal and Steel Community (hereinafter called "the Member States"), of the one part, and

THE LEBANESE REPUBLIC of the other part,

WHEREAS the European Economic Community and the Lebanese Republic are concluding a Co-operation Agreement concerning the sectors covered by that Community,

PURSUING the same objectives and desiring to find like solutions for the sector covered by the European Coal and Steel Community,

HAVE DECIDED, in pursuit of these objectives and considering that no provision of this Agreement may be interpreted as exempting the Contracting Parties from the obligations which are incumbent upon them under other international agreements,

TO CONCLUDE THIS AGREEMENT:

This Agreement shall apply to the products covered by the European Coal and Steel Community which are specified in the Annex.

#### TITLE I

### TRADE CO-OPERATION

#### ARTICLE 2

The object of the Agreement is to promote trade between the Contracting Parties, taking account of their respective levels of development and of the need to ensure a better balance in their trade, with a view to increasing the rate of growth of the Lebanon trade and improving the conditions of access for its products to the Community market.

#### ARTICLE 3

Customs duties and charges having equivalent effect on imports into the Community of products originating in the Lebanon covered by the European Coal and Steel Community shall be abolished on the date of the entry into force of the Agreement.

- 1. The products originating in the Lebanon referred to in this Protocol may not enjoy more favourable treatment when imported into the Community than that applied by the Member States between tehmselves.
- 2. For the application of the preceding paragraph, account shall not be taken of the customs duties and charges having equivalent effect resulting from the application of Articles 32 and 36 of the Act concerning the Conditions of Accession and the Adjustments to the Treaties.

### ARTICLE 5

Quantitative restrictions on imports and measures having an equivalent effect to quantitative restrictions on imports shall be abolished on the date of the entry into force of the Agreement.

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Articles 21 to 34 of the Co-operation Agreement signed this day shall apply mutatis mutandis to this Agreement.

# ARTICLE 7

- 1. If the offers made by <u>Lebanese</u> undertakings are likely to be detrimental to the functioning of the Common Market and if any such detriment is attributable to a difference in the conditions of competition as regards prices, Member States may take appropriate measures under the conditions and in accordance with the procedures laid down in paragraph 2.
- 2. The Contracting Parties shall provide the Joint Committee with all relevant information and shall give it the assistance it requires in order to examine the case and, where necessary, to consider appropriate measures.

If Lebanon fails to put an end to the practice objected to within the period fixed by the Joint Committee, or in the absence of agreement in the Joint Committee within one month of the date on which the matter is referred to it, the Member States may adopt the safeguard measures they consider necessary to avoid, or put an end to, any detriment to the functioning of the Common Market; in particular they may withdraw tariff concessions.

The Agreement shall not modify the provisions of the Treaty establishing the European Coal and Steel Community or the powers and jurisdiction deriving therefrom.

### TITLE II

# GENERAL AND FINAL PROVISIONS

#### ARTICLE 9

1. A Joint Committee is hereby established, which shall be responsible for the administration of the Agreement and shall ensure its proper implementation. For this purpose, it shall make recommendations and take decisions in the cases provided for in the Agreement.

The decisions taken shall be binding on the Contracting Parties which, in accordance with their own rules, shall take such measures as are required to implement them.

- 2. For the purpose of the proper implementation of the Agreement, the Contracting Parties shall exchange information and, at the request of either Party, shall hold consultations within the Joint Committee.
- 3. The Joint Committee shall adopt its rules of procedure.

- 1. The Joint Committee shall be composed of representatives of the Community on the one hand and of representatives of the <u>Republic of Lebanon</u> on the other.
- 2. The Joint Committee shall act by mutual agreement between the Community and the Lebanon.

### ARTICLE 11

- the office of Chairman of the Joint Committee shall be held alternately by each of the Contracting Parties, in accordance with detailed ryles to be laid down in its rules of procedure.
- 2. The Chairman shall convene meetings of the Joint Committee at least once a year in order to review the general functioning of the Agreement.

The Joint Committee shall, in addition, meet whenever necessary, at the request of either Contracting Party, in accordance with the conditions to be laid down in its rules of procedure.

3. The Joint Committee may decide to set up any working party that can assist it in carrying out its duties.

#### ARTICLE 12

Articles 40 to 46 of the Co-operation Agreement shall apply mutatis mutandis to this Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply, on the one hand, to the territories to which the Treaty establishing the European Coal and Steel Community applies under the conditions laid down in that Treaty and, on the other, to the territory of the Republic of Lebanon.


# ARTICLE 14

This Agreement is drawn up in duplicate in the Danish, Dutch, English, French, German, Italian and Arabic languages, each of these texts being equally authentic.

# ARTICLE 15 J

This Agreement shall be subject to ratification, acceptance or approval by the Contracting Parties in accordance with their own procedures. They shall notify each other when the procedures necessary to this end have been completed.

This Agreement shall enter into force on the first day of the second month following the date on which the notifications provided for in the first paragraph have been carried out.
