### Preface

This report reviews the activities of the European Community in the area of Education and Training in the overseas countries and territories (OCT) and in developing nations of Africa, the Caribbean and the Pacific (ACP). This study covers the aid provided through the European Development Fund (EDF) from 1958 to 1980. (See page VI for the historical background of the EDF).

After twenty-two years of close ties between the Community and these developing countries, and now with the beginning of the fifth EDF, this report provides a timely retrospective of Community activities in a sector critical to economic and social development.

Education-Training is one of the areas in which all of the participating developing states and most of the overseas countries and territories have requested and received Community aid (see page 33). These requests reflect V the importance given by these countries to the promotion of human resources in the development process.

The aid provided by the Community in this sector has reached **522,000,000 ECU\*** or approximately **11% of the total aid** provided to these countries in the framework of the first four European Development Funds.

Community aid in the Education-Training sector has taken two distinct forms :

- Infrastructure projects : the construction and equipping of new facilities, and the extension, refurbishing and/or equipping of existing facilities.
- Technical cooperation projects : the award of study and training scholarships, the sending of teacher-trainers, the organization of seminars and training sessions, and other activities.

Since the beginning of the EDF, the Community has allocated 309,000,000 ECU for **infrastructure** projects, representing 59% of the total commitments in the Education-Training sector, and 213,000,000 ECU, or 41% of the total commitments for **technical cooperation**. This aid has permitted :

- assistance in the realisation of
  - 5,588 primary classrooms,
  - 162 general secondary schools,
- 231 vocational and technical secondary schools,
- 70 universities and higher education institutes
- the award of scholarships to **33,500 individuals** to undertake studies or follow training programmes in their home country or abroad.

Remarks

This report includes data relevant to the 4th EDF up until the date of completion of this report. These data are thus incomplete since some of the projects extend over several years and have not as yet been completed. In addition, some of the recipient countries still have a reserve of credits for the Education-Training sector which have not yet been committed.

It is thus important to note that this report needs to be periodically updated if it is to be a statistical base relevant for planning and evaluation.

### Historical Background of the European Development Fund

The European Development Fund (EDF) is the main instrument of financial and technical cooperation used by the European Economic Community (EEC) since 1958 in its relations with numerous developing countries. For the most part, these countries have had special historical ties with member States of the EEC.

The history of the EDF is a succession of associations, renewed every five years by a contract of cooperation between the EEC and its Third World partners. (See Annex I for a list of countries involved in each EDF).

The first Association, the "Association of Overseas Countries and Territories", which is covered by the fourth part of the Treaty of Rome, was signed on March 25, 1957. This Association was conceived by the member States of the EEC as a means of resolving the development problems of colonies and dependent territories of four of the six member States : Belgium, France, Italy and the Netherlands.

Commercial and financial orientations were established within the framework of this first Association, which was unilateral in character. The basic principles were defined in the Treaty of Rome and the methods and procedures defined by a "Convention of Application", an Annex to the Treaty, for a five-year period. The first EDF, entitled "Development Fund for Overseas Countries and Territories", was instituted by this Convention of Application, and endowed with 550 million ECU.\*\*

This first EDF, which became operational in 1959, was characterised by investments in the area of economic and social infrastructure (essentially transport systems). Technical cooperation, notably the scholarship programmes, was financed during this first EDF out of the budget of the Commission of the European Communities.

On expiry of the "Convention of Application", nearly all of the recently independent countries sought to continue privileged relations with the EEC. Now faced with sovereign partners, the EEC formed a new association based on a contract negotiated with these States.

This new association was ratified by a Convention of Association signed in Yaoundé on July 20, 1963 (Yaoundé I), for a five-year period. This Association regrouped on the one hand, the 6 member States of the EEC, and on the other hand, 18 African Associated States and Madagascar (AASM).

The Convention of Association did not, however, apply to other countries and territories which still had ties with France and the Netherlands. For these Overseas Countries and Territories (OCT), the Council of Ministers of the EEC decided to continue the OCT Association on February 25, 1964. This Association retained its unilateral character.

The 2nd EDF saw its credits attain 750 million ECU. The great majority of these credits were allocated to the AASM and the rest to the OCT.

During this EDF, priorities were reoriented towards rural development. There was also an effort to redress the imbalance of the preceding EDFs by financing technical cooperation, notably in the area of technical assistance and scholarships.

### Part One :

### The Evolution of Aid in the Education-Training Sector : An overall analysis

Introduction

The projects financed by the EDF in the area of Education-Training can be seen as an indispensable complement to activities aimed at increasing the production potential of developing countries and territories, by giving to these populations the training necessary to assume their own economic and social development.

Aware of the importance of Education-Training projects, nearly all of the States and Overseas Countries and Territories have requested aid in this sector.

\* European Currency Unit (see notes page 132) During the four EDFs, the total financial commitments of the community in the Education-Training sector reached 521,777,000 ECU\*. This sum represents 11% of the EDF funds available to the developing countries for all types of assistance : infrastructure projects (roads, bridges, dams, hospitals, etc.), technical cooperation projects, STABEX, emergency aid, special loans, etc.

In terms of financial commitments the evolution of this aid is shown in table 0.2.

The figures in this table, as throughout this report, represent the financial commitments contained in the financing Agreements of each project.

The aid provided by the Community in the area of Education-Training falls into two major categories :

- 1. Infrastructure projects :
  - construction and equipping of new facilities, and the upgrading of existing facilities
- 2. Technical Cooperation:
  - study and training scholarships
  - technical assistance : sending of instructors-trainers and experts, basic and advanced training programmes etc.

Remarks

During the 1st EDF, the financing of infrastructure projects clearly predominated (96%) in relation to that of technical cooperation.

During the 2nd, 3rd and 4th EDFs, the financial commitments for the two forms of assistance tended to be more equal.

Taking all four EDFs together, 59% of the commitments went to infrastructure projects and 41% to technical cooperation.

These figures suggest that, having assisted in the construction and equipping of educational facilities, the Community was also in a position to support other forms of aid to complement infrastructure projects.

### **Chapter 1 : Infrastructure Projects**

To improve general education, vocational and technical training, and to directly benefit a larger number of persons, it is necessary to maintain a constant effort to improve and expand educational infrastructures.

Since the 1st EDF, the Community has undertaken the construction, refurbishing and equipping of numerous schools and classes in overseas countries and territories. During the subsequent EDFs, many of these same countries, most of which had since become independent, continued to request this type of aid.

Most of the infrastructure projects have been conceived as national projects. Nevertheless, in order to deal more effectively with development problems common to several countries, the Community and its partners have, since the 3rd EDF, collaborated in the conception of regional educational facilities set up to train students of diverse nationalities in fields such as health, management, information systems, etc. (See Part Two : Regional Projects).

### A. Recipient Countries and EDF Financial Commitments

The number of States and overseas countries and territories benefiting from educational infrastructure projects, both national and regional, is presented in table 1.1.

During the 1st EDF, the Community financed educational infrastructure projects in 22 of the 30 OCT.

During the 2nd and 3rd EDFs, 15 of the 18 and then 14 of the 19 AASM requested aid of this type.

During the 4th EDF, the number of ACP and OCT recipients of educational infrastructure projects rose to 40, of which 15 benefited from both regional and national projects. (See list of countries, page 29).

The Community committed a total of 308,507,000 ECU for educational infrastructure projects. This sum is 6% of the total EDF budget for all sectors, or 11% of EDF commitments for infrastructure projects in all sectors.

Remarks

During the 1st EDF, the financial commitments for educational infrastructure projects were about 18% of the commitments for infrastructure projects in all sectors. This share fell during the 2nd and 3rd EDFs to 9% and 8% respectively, but rose to 10% under the 4th EDF.

The average percentage over the four EDFs was therefore about 11%.

#### **Regional Projects:**

During the 4th EDF, the financial commitments for regional educational infrastructure projects were 19% of the commitments for all regional infrastructure projects in all sectors, and 18% of the commitments for all educational infrastructure projects, both national and regional. These projects have thus become an important feature in the context of EDF aid.

### **B.** Types of Facilities : Cost and Number

At the request of the participating countries, the Community undertook school construction at all levels of education and training. In this chapter the data relevant to these infrastructure projects are categorised as follows :

Primary classrooms, essentially for a general basic education.

**General secondary** schools designed to provide a general secondary education which can lead to higher education.

**Vocational secondary** schools which provide technical and/or practical education leading to a specific type of employment.


Higher education institutes, colleges, universities and polytechnics from secondary up to and including post-graduate level.

The financial commitments of the Community allocated to these different levels of education are presented in table 1.3. and graph 1.3.

During the 1st EDF, the "primary" level, with 29% of the financial commitments, was most favoured. Nearly 3,000 classrooms were built or renovated at that time. Despite a progressive reduction in subsequent EDFs, this level of education continues to benefit from a relatively important share of EDF aid (9% under the 4th EDF).

The "secondary" level, in terms of financial commitments, ranks second in the four EDFs. Within the secondary level, there has been a change in priorities. During the first two EDFs, the credits allocated to general secondary schools were more or less equal to those allocated to vocational secondary schools. However, during the 3rd and 4th EDFs educational facilities providing vocational training received two and three times more credits respectively than those providing a general education.

The "higher education" level has clearly been the most favoured, receiving 38% of the total commitments over the four EDFs.

### C. Types of Assistance - Creation of New Facilities or Upgrading of Existing Facilities

In the case of new facilities, the EDF provided assistance for the construction and equipping of new classrooms and schools. In the case of upgrading existing facilities, EDF aid was used to expand schools, as well as to renovate buildings, and improve or provide equipment, furniture, technical and sanitary systems, landscaping etc.

In these two types of intervention, the Community took charge, fully or in part, of the projects envisaged by the government concerned; e.g. project programming, architectural and technical studies, construction and equipment. In cases where a project was only partly financed by the EDF, the remainder was provided by the government itself or by other funds.

### E. Admissions Capacity According to Type of Facility

The capacity of classrooms and schools built with EDF assistance is presented in table 1.9.

The figures shown correspond to the initial admissions capacity as planned at the time of conception and construction of new facilities.

In the case of projects designed to enlarge existing schools, only the additional capacity is reported.

The figures have been taken from the Financing Agreements and the EDF archives. Where such information is lacking, estimates have been made for each country, based on standard classroom or school capacity.

It should thus be emphasised that the figures shown in the following table do not necessarily correspond to the number of students presently attending classes or facilities built with Community aid, since actual admissions are sometimes double or even triple that of the planned capacity.

# **Chapter 2 : Technical Cooperation**

Included under technical cooperation in the Education-Training sector are :

- scholarship programmes (see section 2.1.)
- technical assistance, which groups several types of assistance such as the sending of instructors-trainers, vocational training programmes etc. (see section 2.2.).

EDF financial commitments for these two types of assistance are shown in table 2.0.

Remarks

During the four EDFs, three quarters of the financial commitments for technical cooperation went towards scholarship programmes. Nevertheless, in the course of the different EDFs, there has been a progressive shift favouring technical assistance, from 0.3% in the 1st EDF to 33% in the 4th EDF.

### Section 2.1.: Scholarship Programmes

Since 1960 the European Community has financed scholarship programmes for nationals of developing countries.

When the first scholarship programmes were set up during the 1960-61 academic year, there were only a few dozen African scholarship holders studying in Europe. Over the next twenty years 33,500 people obtained scholarships.

### A. Recipient countries and EDF financial commitments

Nearly all the countries participating in the EDF have benefited from scholarship programmes as shown in the table below.

Many of the OCT benefited from EDF scholarship programmes from the beginning of the 1st EDF. In the following three EDFs, nearly all the states, both AASM and ACP, requested this type of aid. (See list of countries, page 29). Initially, the scholarship programmes were financed exclusively through the budget of the European Commission. Beginning in 1964, the EDF took over part of the financing, with the Commission continuing to finance the remainder. Finally, in 1969, the EDF took full charge of financing the scholarship programmes.

In this report, the figures for the 1st and 2nd EDFs represent the total amount of credits committed for this period, independent of their source (Commission budget or EDF).

Remarks

The number of scholarships awarded increased significantly during the 4th EDF following the enlargement of EDF as defined by the Lomé I Convention.

Furthermore, during the 4th EDF, there was a decrease in average cost per scholarship holder. This could be explained by the fact that the length of scholarships was shorter than under the 3 preceding EDFs (see page 17) and that an increased proportion of scholarship holders carried out their studies or training in their home country (see page 24).

### B. Study and Training Scholarships - Number and Average Duration


The Community awards two types of scholarships :

- study scholarships which permit the financing of secondary and university studies;
- **training scholarships** aimed at financing practical training of a specialised or advanced nature. These scholarships may be awarded to individuals or to a group of students following the same training.




During the first three EDFs, an average of 76% of the scholarships were awarded for studies and 24% for training.

Under the 4th EDF, there was a significant increase in training scholarships. This increase was due mainly to Ethiopia's request for 7,850 training scholarships of very short duration, which represented more than half of all training scholarships under the 4th EDF. Without these scholarships, the propertion of study and training scholarships would have been 65% and 35% respectively.

According to the type and level of education sought, the Community undertook the financing of study or training programmes ranging from several weeks to several years for each scholarship holder. Thus, from 1960 to 1981, more than 74,000 years of study and training were financed by the Community, averaging 2.2 years per scholarship holder.

### C. Disciplines and Levels of Education

The scholarships financed by the Community are intended for studies and training in disciplines which are considered to be of prime importance to the economic and social development of the recipient countries.

In Table 2.1.5. EDF scholarships are categorised according to discipline, as defined by the nomenclature of the Development Aid Committee (DAC) which is part of the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD).

Economics : the number of scholarship holders in this discipline decreased from 44% under the 2nd EDF to 25% under the 4th EDF.

Education : during the 1st EDF this discipline received only 2% of the scholarship holders, but by the 4th EDF the percentage was 21%.

Apart from these two exceptions, the distribution of scholarships between the various disciplines remained relatively stable from one EDF to the next. These disciplines include the following branches :

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
The proportion of study and training scholarships varied according to discipline. In disciplines such as Medical Sciences and the Natural Sciences, nearly all of the scholarships were for studies, whilst in Education, Administration and the Social Sciences, the great majority of the scholarships were awarded for training. Study and training scholarships financed by the Community are awarded at different levels of education - secondary, higher or post-graduate.


**Secondary :** intended for students who, having completed the primary level, wish to continue studies of a general, vocational or technical nature, or to acquire practical training to complement their studies.

**Higher :** for students wishing to continue their studies at colleges, institutes and polytechnics of higher education or universities, or to complete their higher education with training.

**Post-Graduate :** permits further studies and/or training after having obtained a university diploma.

Although at the secondary and higher education levels the distribution of scholarships according to discipline is similar to that shown in Table 2.1.5., the picture is different at post-graduate level, where the most popular discipline is Medical Sciences.

### D. Place of Study or Training

According to the demands of the country and the types of education required, scholarship holders carried out their studies or training in their country of origin, in other ACP countries or in Europe. There was also a small number of scholarship holders who studied or trained in other countries such as Morocco, Egypt, Israel and the USA.

### **E. Success Rates of Scholarship Holders**

In table 2.1.11. the success rates of scholarship holders are given according to place of study. These rates concern only study scholarships, since there are no examinations for training scholarships.

Under the 4th EDF, success rates have until now been recorded for only 29% of the scholarships awarded and are thus not included in this table.

During the 1st EDF, 80% of the scholarship holders carried out their studies or training in Europe and 12% in their home country. This distribution changed rapidly. Already under the 2nd EDF, the largest share of scholarships were awarded for studies and training in the countries of origin of the scholarship holders.

One can suppose that this change was encouraged by EDF assistance in the construction and improvement of educational infrastructures, notably at the higher education level.

On average, the distribution of scholarships during the four EDFs was as follows : 66% in the country of origin, 7% in other ACP countries, 25% in Europe and 2% in other countries.

Generally speaking, the success rate improved during the 3rd EDF compared with the 1st and 2nd EDFs.

The success rates are clearly higher in the country of origin of the scholarship holders and in other ACP countries than in Europe, where, contrary to the general tendency, success rates fell after the 1st EDF.

# Section 2.2.: Technical Assistance

### A. Types of Technical Assistance

Other forms of technical cooperation in the Education-Training sector include :

- the sending of experts and instructors-trainers from EEC Member States or partner countries for specific missions of limited duration;
- the organisation of training programmes for students, officials and civil servants of the partner countries, either in Europe or in the countries of origin;
- the supply of teaching materials;
- integrated training programmes which mobilise the various aid instruments (infrastructure projects, scholarship programmes, the sending of instructorstrainers, etc.) in order to increase their effects on a given activity or project;
- cooperation between the universities of EEC Member States and those of the partner countries.

Since the 2nd EDF, technical assistance has been provided in both national and regional frameworks.





Benin (Dahomey) participated in the four EDFs. For Education-Training, a total of 10,753,000 ECU was received, representing +/- 2% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/- 8% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### Infrastructure Projects

42% of the aid, or 4,567,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 84% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 60 primary classrooms, 2 general secondary schools and 2 vocational secondary schools; and 16% for the extension of 1 institute of higher education.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

58% of the aid, or 6,186,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.



# Burundi

### **Education-Training Sector**

Burundi participated in the four EDFs. For Education-Training, a total of 15,939,000 ECU was received, representing +/-3% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-14% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### Infrastructure Projects

49% of the aid, or 7,833,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 98% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 1 technical secondary school and 3 institutes for higher education; and 2% for the extension of 1 technical secondary school.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

51% of the aid, or 8,106,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

#### **Scholarship Programmes**

94% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 896 individuals. 93% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Engineering (51%) and in Economics (28%); and 7% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Economics (42%) and in Engineering (30%). 42% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 58% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 51% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in Burundi, 7% in other developing countries or in Israel and 42% in Europe.

#### **Technical Assistance**

6% of this sum was used for technical assistance : in the form of basic and advanced training sessions.



#### **Infrastructure Projects**



# **Central African Republic**

#### **Education-Training Sector**

Central African Republic participated in the four EDFs. For Education-Training, a total of 12,345,000 ECU was received, representing +/- 2% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/- 10% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### Infrastructure Projects

64% of the aid, or 7,927,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 89% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 218 primary classrooms, 2 technical secondary schools and 3 institutes of higher education; and 11% for the equipping of 8 primary classrooms and the extension of 7 general secondary schools and 2 institutes of higher education.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

36% of the aid, or 4,418,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

#### **Scholarship Programmes**

65% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 692 individuals. 71% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Agriculture (62%) and in Economics (23%); and 29% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Economics (38%) and in Engineering (32%). 70% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 30% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 56% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in the Central African Republic, 22% in other developing countries and 22% in Europe.

#### **Technical Assistance**

35% of this sum was used for technical assistance : for 1 integrated project (under the 3rd EDF) and for the sending of instructors-trainers.



Chad participated in the four EDFs.

For Education-Training, a total of 14,739,000 ECU was received, representing +/-3% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-9% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### **Infrastructure Projects**

## **Ivory Coast**

#### **Education-Training Sector**

Ivory Coast participated in the four EDFs. For Education-Training, a total of 22,506,000 ECU was received, representing +/-4% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-10% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### **Infrastructure Projects**

63% of the aid, or 14,248,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 90% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 180 primary classrooms, 3 general secondary schools, 13 vocational secondary schools and 5 institutes of higher education; and 10% for the refurbishing and equipping of primary classrooms, 2 general secondary schools and 1 institute of higher education.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

37% of the aid, or 8,258,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

#### **Scholarship Programmes**

92% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 1,613 individuals. 51% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Economics (35%) and in Agriculture (33%); and 49% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Engineering (43%) and in Economics (39%). 65% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 35% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 59% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in the Ivory Coast, 5% in other developing countries or in Israel and 36% in Europe.

#### **Technical Assistance**

8% of this sum was used for technical assistance : for the sending of instructors-trainers, and basic and advanced training sessions.



## **Education-Training Sector**

Jamaica participated in the 4th EDF.

For Education-Training, a total of 4,650,000 ECU was received, representing +/-1% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-18%of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### **Infrastructure Projects**

20% of the aid, or 930,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 30% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 22 primary classrooms; and 70% for the refurbishing of 250 primary classrooms.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

80% of the aid, or 3,790,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

#### Scholarship Programmes

52% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 302 individuals. 71% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Engineering (18%) and in Medical Sciences (16%); and 29% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Economics (33%) and in Education (28%). 14% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 86% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 54% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in Jamaica, 8% in other developing countries and 38% in Europe.

#### **Technical Assistance**

48% of this sum was used for technical assistance : for one integrated project (Jamal-Literacy Project) and for the sending of instructors-trainers.







Malawi participated in the 4th EDF.

For Education-Training, a total of 4,533,000 ECU was received, representing +/-1% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-6% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

### Infrastructure Projects

35% of the aid, or 1,583,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. The total of this sum was used for the extension of 1 vocational secondary school and 2 institutes of higher education.

## **New Caledonia**

### **Education-Training Sector**

New Caledonia participated in the four EDFs. For Education-Training, a total of 1,990,000 ECU was received, representing +/-0.4% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-14% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### Infrastructure Projects

69% of the aid, or 1,382,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 93% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 14 primary classrooms and 1 general secondary school; and 7% for the refurbishing of 6 primary classrooms and the extension of 1 vocational secondary school.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

31% of the aid, or 608,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

### **Scholarship Programmes**

34% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 42 individuals<sup>\*</sup>. 78% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Agriculture (27%) and in Engineering (27%); and 22% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Engineering (56%). 62% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 38% were awarded at the higher education level. All of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in Europe.

#### **Technical Assistance**

66% of this sum was used for technical assistance : for the training of and assistance to working populations in the interior areas of the island.



## **Education-Training Sector**

Niger participated in the four EDFs. For Education-Training, a total of 22,244,000 ECU was received, representing +/-4% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-10% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### Infrastructure Projects

75% of the aid, or 16,670,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 63% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 166 primary classrooms, 16 general secondary schools and 1 vocational secondary school; and 37% for the refurbishing and extension of 116 primary classrooms, 22 general secondary schools, 1 vocational secondary school and 1 institute for higher education.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

25% of the aid, or 5,574,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

#### **Scholarship Programmes**

70% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 784 individuals. 81% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Engineering (28%) and in Economics (25%); and 19% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Economics (71%) and in Engineering (17%). 77% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 23% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 33% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in Niger, 51% in other developing countries or in Israel and 16% in Europe.

#### **Technical Assistance**

30% of this sum was used for technical assistance : in the form of technical studies, basic and advanced training sessions and the sending of instructors-trainers.





### **Education-Training Sector**

Senegal participated in the four EDFs.

For Education-Training, a total of 28,087,000 ECU was received, representing +/-5% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-9% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

## Infrastructure Projects

73% of the aid, or 20,419,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 99% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 801 primary classrooms, 7 vocational and technical secondary schools and 1 institute of higher education; and 1% for the extension of 1 institute of higher education.

### **Technical Cooperation**

27% of the aid, or 7,668,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

### **Scholarship Programmes**

97% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 1,217 individuals. 92% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Engineering (39%) and in Economics (29%); and 8% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Economics (48%) and in Agriculture (18%). 14% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 86% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 70% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in Senegal, 6% in other developing countries or in Israel and 24% in Europe.

#### **Technical Assistance**

3% of this sum was used for technical assistance : in the form of integrated projects and basic and advanced training sessions.



Sierra Leone participated in the 4th EDF.

For Education-Training, a total of 6,177,000 ECU was received, representing +/- 1% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/- 20% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### Infrastructure Projects

60% of the aid, or 3,727,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. The total of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 30 general secondary schools, 3 vocational secondary schools, 1 university and 2 institutes for higher education.

#### **Technical Cooperation**

## Suriname

### **Education-Training Sector**

Suriname participated in the four EDFs.

For Education-Training, a total of 17,026,000 ECU was received, representing +/-3% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-29% of the total EDF aid received by this country.

#### Infrastructure Projects

86% of the aid, or 14,619,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. 92% of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 706 primary classrooms and 1 technical training institute (semi-university level); and 8% for the extension of 1 general secondary school.

#### **Technical** Cooperation

14% of the aid, or 2,407,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

#### **Scholarship Programmes**

The total of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 698 individuals. 97% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Economics (42%) and in Natural Sciences (30%); and 3% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Engineering (61%). 35% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 65% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 77% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in Suriname, 3% in other developing countries and 20% in Europe.

### **Education-Training Sector**

Zaire participated in the four EDFs.

For Education-Training, a total of 58,677,000 ECU was received, representing +/-11% of the total EDF aid in this sector, or +/-19%of the total EDF aid received by this country.

### **Infrastructure Projects**

61% of the aid, or 35,651,000 ECU went towards the financing of infrastructure projects. The total of this sum was used for the construction and equipping of 1 general secondary school, 9 institutes of higher education and 1 department of sciences.

### **Technical Cooperation**

39% of the aid, or 23,026,000 ECU went towards the financing of technical cooperation.

### **Scholarship Programmes**

77% of this sum was used for scholarship programmes, under which scholarships were awarded to 1,567 individuals. 78% of these scholarships were for studies mainly in Engineering (33%) and in Agriculture (18%); and 22% of these scholarships were for training, primarily in Economics (64%). 25% of the scholarships were awarded at the secondary level; 75% were awarded at higher education and post-graduate levels. 27% of the scholarship recipients undertook their studies or training in Zaire, 4% in other developing countries or in Israel and 69% in Europe.

### **Technical Assistance**

23% of this sum was used for technical assistance : for basic and advanced training sessions and one integrated project (recycling of teaching and technical personnel).
