Subject: Communication from the Commission to the Council concerning the major problems relating to the proposed Council Directive to harmonize the structures of consumer taxes other than VAT, on beer, wine and alcohol (COM(79) 261 final)

The Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection examined the above Communication from the Commission and the report of your committee (Doc. 1-1121/83) in its meeting of 22 March 1984.<sup>1</sup>

The committee noted that the essential objective of the Commission's proposals is to move towards the removal of fiscal frontiers by harmonizing direct and indirect taxes in the Member States and the committee agrees with the aim.

The existing situation is unfavourable for consumers who are denied the free choice which would result from the abolition of fiscal discrimination.

The committee considered that the report drawn up by the Economic and Monetary Affairs Committee adequately covers these points of interest so far as the objectives are concerned but has not entered into the discussion as to how these objectives should be achieved.

Please consider this letter as the opinion of my committee.
