on the organization and convening of a new Messina Conference

The European Parliament,

- A having regard to the concurring declarations of the Presidents of the Council, Commission and Parliament on the need for a new Messina Conference,
 - B having regard to the overwhelming majority vote of the European Parliament on the resolution on guidelines for the reform of the Treaties and the achievement of European Union (Doc. 1-305/82), reaffirming its wish for European Union to be developed further and for the existing obstacles to be overcome by means of a new treaty establishing European Union,
 - C convinced of the need to break out of the political impasse currently affecting the application and broadening of the Treaties and the achievement of European Union,
1. Calls on the Presidents of the Council, Commission and Parliament to arrange for the organization and convening of a government conference to be held at the end of 1983. Participation at this conference will be open to all the Member States of the Community. The aim of the conference is to establish, in the form of a Treaty, all the measures adopted by the European Parliament to date in the institutional field;
 2. Invites the abovementioned Presidents to submit proposals on how closer integration can be reconciled with the hesitant attitude adopted by certain Member States;
 3. Urges that consideration be given to ways of fostering the willingness of a number of Member States to achieve European Union as soon as possible, even if it is not possible to achieve a general consensus. In this case, the obligations of the existing Community Treaties should continue to apply to the remaining Member States.
