on the establishment of human rights in Uganda

The European Parliament,

- A - whereas civilized people everywhere felt a keen sense of relief at the end of the bloody regime of IDI AMIN in Uganda,
  - B - whereas, further, the general expectation was that with the fall of the dictator IDI AMIN there would be a move towards the respect of freedom and human rights in Uganda,
  - C - dismayed that under the new OBOTE Government the people of Uganda, still do not enjoy adequate personal security in a large part of that country,
  - D - aware of, and in protest at, the fact that the so-called UGANDAN NATIONAL LIBERATION ARMY of Vice-President PAUOLO MUWANGA, according to the testimony of numerous eye-witnesses, is responsible up to the present day for pogroms against the people,
  - E - whereas, finally, no investigation has been undertaken against or punishment imposed on those responsible for the arbitrary killing of their fellow citizens,
1. Calls on the Council of Ministers of the European Community to make representations without delay to the Ugandan Government concerning the violations of human rights;
  2. Urges the Ugandan Government to respect human rights and to guarantee the personal security of the Ugandan people without delay;
  3. Points out to the Ugandan Government that the continuation of unpunished killings of civilians in Uganda cannot fail to affect that country's standing and the development aid which it receives;
  4. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council of Ministers.
