on freedom of movement within the European Community in the event of strikes by customs officials

## The European Parliament,

- having regard to the increasing number of strikes by customs officials,
- whereas obstructions to the movement of goods at borders not only causes serious economic disruption but also places an intolerable burden on long-distance goods vehicle drivers,
- whereas obstructions at internal Community borders for whatever reason are incompatible with the provisions of the Treaty of Rome,
- Calls on the Council to make representations to the Governments
  of the Member States
  - (a) to remind them of their obligation to maintain freedom of movement within the Community;
  - (b) to this end to prevent obstruction at borders in the event of industrial action by customs officials;
  - (c) to report to Parliament within one year on the implementation of these principles;
- 2. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission, the Council and the Governments of the Member States.
