On 29 November 1982 the Committee on Budgets appointed Mr PFENNIG rapporteur for Section II - Council, Annex I to Section II - Economic and Social Committee, Section IV - Court of Justice and Section V - Court of Auditors of the draft general budget of the European Communities for 1984.

At its meeting of 7 December 1983 the Committee on Budgets adopted the motion for a resolution by 12 votes to 0 with 3 abstentions. The amendments adopted by the committee at that meeting are attached to this report.
