on European companies operating in South Africa

## The European Parliament,

- deploring the fact that many European companies operating in South Africa are not paying the wages stipulated under the EEC Code of Conduct of 50% above the minimum wage,
- noting that many companies are not fulfilling the Code of Conduct in the field of desegregation and trade union recognition,
- noting that, although the Code lays down that parent companies should publish each year a detailed report on the progress made in applying the Code, this is not being carried out or is being done in a misleading way,
- Calls on the Commission to publish the names of all companies at present breaking the Code of Conduct;
- Calls on the Governments of the Member States to take the necessary action to ensure that the Code of Conduct is strictly applied by all companies operating in South Africa;
- 3. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission and the Governments of the Member States.

## JUSTIFICATION

Urgent procedure is justified by recent disclosures in the British press that companies are breaking the Code of Conduct.
