COMBATING AIR POLLUTION FROM INDUSTRIAL PLANTS

The Council held an initial exchange of views on the proposal for a Directive on combating air pollution from industrial plants. This proposed Directive, of a general nature, stipulates that Member States must make the building of industrial plants subject to prior authorization and that certain criteria must be met before such authorization is granted.

Discussion concentrated on the three main questions raised by this proposal, namely: the scope of the Directive; definition of the economic criterion for issuing authorization; the possible fixing of Community limit values for emissions.

At the end of the debate the Council instructed the Permanent Representatives Committee to continue to seek solutions which could enable it to take a decision at its next meeting.

IMPACT STUDIES

Following further detailed discussion of the main problems outstanding, the Council noted the agreement of nine delegations on the text of the proposal for a Directive concerning the assessment of the environmental effects of certain public and private projects.

Since one delegation had a general reservation on this proposal, the Council instructed the Permanent Representative Committee to take up the matter again in due course.

MEDITERRANEAN SPECIALLY PROTECTED AREAS - PROTOCOL TO THE BARCELONA CONVENTION

The Council discussed a proposal for a Decision on the conclusion of the Protocol to the Barcelona Convention concerning Mediterranean specially protected areas.

This Protocol, the fourth to the Convention, is designed to protect marine areas which are important in safeguarding the natural resources and natural sites of the Mediterranean Sea area.

Since one delegation wanted further clarification regarding the financial rules of the Protocol, the Council postponed examination of the dossier.

WASTE FROM THE TITANIUM DIOXIDE INDUSTRY

The Council held a policy debate on the proposal for a Council Directive on procedures for harmonizing the programmes for the reduction of pollution caused by waste from the titanium dioxide industry.

The Council instructed the Permanent Representatives Committee to expedite its work on this proposal so that the Council could take up the matter again.

LEAD IN PETROL

The Council noted a statement by the Commission on the progress of work on lead in petrol. It also took note of a statement by the Greek delegation on the subject.

In the course of discussion, the Council confirmed its procedural decision of June 1983 inviting the Commission to submit appropriate proposals before April 1984.

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At the end of its discussion on the above items the Council agreed to suspend its meeting until 16 December with a view to continuing its proceedings on the following items in particular:

- surveillance and control of transfrontier shipments of hazardous waste
- action by the Community relating to the environment (ACE)
- joint declaration on environmental policy
- limit values and quality objectives for mercury discharges.

OTHER DECISION ON THE ENVIRONMENT

The Council adopted, in the official languages of the Communities, a Regulation amending Regulation (EEC) No 3626/82 on the implementation in the Community of the Convention on international trade in endangered species of wild fauna and flora.
