BUDGETARY DISCIPLINE

Following a very detailed discussion, the Council reached general agreement on the content of the provisions for implementing the principles of budgetary and financial discipline defined by the European Council at its meetings on 19 and 20 March and 25 and 26 June 1984. However, there remains a reservation on the part of two delegations and the question of the title of the act envisaged remained unresolved.

The outcome of the proceedings of the Council on Economic and Financial Affairs will be brought to the attention of the Ministers for Foreign Affairs at their meeting on 2 October. they will be asked to decide on the form of the act envisaged in the course of their discussions on the system of own resources and budgetary problems.



ECO/FIN COUNCIL

ECONOMIC AND FINANCIE MINISTERS MET TODAY TO DISCUSS BUDGETARY DISCIPLINE FOLLOWING THE INFORMAL ACCORD REACHED AT DROMOLAND CASTLE TWO WEEKS AGO AND INTENSIVE SUBSEQUENT DISCUSSIONS IN BRUSSELS. THEY HAD A NEW TEXT BEFORE THEM, DRAWN UP BY THE PRESIDENCY WHICH AS VICE-PRESIDENT TUGENDHAT ACKNOWLEDGED WENT A LONG WAY TOWARDS MEETING THE PREOCCUPATIONS OF THE COMMISSION WHICH WERE EXPRESSED IN PRESIDENT THORN'S LETTER TO THE COUNCIL ON FRIDAY. HE ALSO DREW ATTENTION TO THE URGENT NEED FOR THE COUNCIL TO REACH A DECISION TODAY SO THAT THE WHOLE COMPLEX OF PROBLEMS CONNECTED WITH THE BUDGETARY SITUATION IN THE COMMUNITY CAN BEGIN TO BE SOLVED. THE PRESIDENCY DRAFT RAN INTO CRITICISMS FROM SEVERAL DELEGATIONS. ONE ISSUE BEING THE DATE BY WHICH GUIDELINES SHOULD BE DRAWN UP. SOME DELEGATIONS SAID IT HAD TO BE AFTER THE AGRICULTURAL MINISTERS HAD SET THE PRICES (I.E. AFTER 1 APRIL), OTHER SAID THIS WOULD NEGATE THE VERY IDEA OF BUDGETARY DISCIPLINE AND THE GUIDLINES SHOULD BE SET EARLIER. MARCH 15 IS THE DATE WRITTEN INTO THE PRESIDENCY TEXT. SOME DELEGATIONS ALSO MADE THE POINT THAT WITHOUT AGREEMENT ON BUDGETARY DISCIPLINE THERE WAS NO QUESTION OF ANY EXTRA RESOURCES BEING DEVOTED TO THE BUDGET THIS YEAR OR NEXT. THE DISCUSSION CONTINUES. MORE LATER.

THE MINISTERS SPENT ALL RETERNOON SCREINS THEIR WAY CLAUSE BY CLAUSE THROUGH THE PRESIDENCY'S BOCUMENT. SOME PROGRESS APPEARS TO BE IN PROSPECT AND A BREAK WAS CALLED AT 17.38 SO THAT THE PRESIDENCY COULD DRAW UP A NEW BOCUMENT WHICH WOULD INCORPORATE THE VARIOUS SUGGESTIONS MADE ROUND THE TABLE. A RESUMPTION OF THE MEETING IS CALLED FOR 18.38.

ECITIN - MONDAY EVENING

THE ECOFIN MINISTERS SUCCEEDED AFTER FOME ELEVEN HOURS OF REGITIATION IN PUTTING TOGETHER AN ELEVEN POST ARRESMENT ON BUDGETARY DISCIPLINE. THIS COMMITS THEM TO ENSURING TRAT AGRICULTURAL EXPENDITURE DOES NOT EXPAND BY A GREATER RATE THAN THE INCREASE IN OWN RESCURIES BUT ALSO EXTENDS TO A RIGOROUS ATTITUDE TO OTHER POLICIES. THE AGREEMENT IS SUBJECT TO ONE OR THO RESERVES: WHICH WILL PROBABLY BE LIGHTLY SHOULD THE FOREIGH MINISTERS ON THESDAY (TODE ? BE ABLE TO REACH ASSEEMENT ON THE BUDGETS FOR 1984 AND 85 AS WELL AS ON INCRESING OWN RESOURCES. THE TEXTS WHICH IS NOT YET FINALISEDS AGEES THAT IF ANOTHER COSMITT VI.E. AGRICULTURAL PROISTERS) LOOKS LIKE EXTEEDING A REFERENCE AMOUNT SET EACH YEAR! THEY PROCEEDINGS MOBLE BE SUSPENDED SO THAT OTHER MINISTERS COULD BE BROUGHT IN TO SETTLE MATTERS! EXFERDITURE HOULD BE LOCKED AT OVER A THREE YEAR PERIOD. THE ECO FIN MINISTERS: HOWEVER: WERE UNABLE TO SETTLE FINALLY ON WHAT TO CALL THEIR DOCUMENT: SHOULD IT BE A COUNCIL BECISION OR RESCLUTION? THE POINT WAS THAT THE FORMER MIGHT HAVE THE FORCE OF A ■ JUDICIAL INSTRUMENT AND BE LEGALLY ENFORCERBLE: THE OTHER SOMETHING LESS; ALTHOUGH SEVERAL MINISTERS PROTESTED THAT THEY COULD SEE LITTLE SENSE IN ARGUING OVER THE DIFFERENCE. MINISTERS ALSO SHOWED THEMSELVES SENSITIVE TO CHARGES THAT THEY WERE IMPOSING THEIR WILL ON OTHER PARTS OF THE BUDGET AUTHORITY: THE POINT HIGHLIGHTED IN ■ PRESIDENT THORN'S LETTER LAST FRIDAY. SEVERAL MINISTERS PROTESTED THAT ALL THEY WERE DOING WAS TO IMPOSE RULES ON THEMSELVES AND THERE WAS NO INTENTION OF IMPINGEING ON THE RIGHTS OF EITHER THE COMMISSION OR PARLIAMENT. THE STATEMENT BY CHAIRMAN OF PARLIAMENTS BUDGET COMMITTEE WAS ALSO REFERRED TO. THE FOREIGN MINISTERS TODAY WILL BE ASKED TO SETTLE THE MATTER OF THE TITLE TO THE ECO FIN COUNCIL 'S ACT.

AS THEIR FINAL CONTRIBUTION TO THE DAYS SUCCESS THE ECOFIN MINISTERS SENT THEIR STRONG RECOMMENDATION TO THE FOREIGN MINISTERS TO PRESENT THE 1985 BUDGET TO PARLIAMENT AS SOON A SPOSSIBLE AND IN ANY CASE BEFORE 5 OCTOBRE: WHICH IS THE DATE INSCRIBED IN THE TREATY. FOR THE COMMISSION; AS THE ECO FIN PROCEEDINGS DREW TO A CLOSE; VICE-PRESIDENT TUGEHNDHAT HADE THE FOLLOWING STATMENT: I HAVE MADE A NUMBER OF STATMEENTS IN RESPONSE TO SPECIFIC REQUESTS FROM THE COUNCIL. THESE SHOULD NOT BE TAKEN TO IMPLY ANY GENERAL ENDORSEMENT OF THE TEXT BY THE COMMISSION. THE COMMISSION: AS PRESIDENT THORN SAID IN HIS LETTER OF LAST WEEK; IS FULLY ALIVE TO THE NEED FOR BUDGET BISCIPLINE. IT RESO REMAINS CONVINCED THAT THIS CAN BE ACHIEVED IN DUE COMPLIANCE WITH THE TREATY AND IN FULL CONSULTATION WITH THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AS THE COUNCIL KNOWS: THE COMMISSION ATTACHES GREAT IMPORTANCE TO THE RESPECT OF THE RESPECTIVE RIGHTIS OF BOTH ARMS OF THE BUDGET AUTHORITY",

FOREIGN MINISTERS ARE NOW TACKLING THE OTHERS PARTS OF THE BUDGET PACKAGE.
