## Foreword

### 1. Introduction

The environment in which trade statistics are collected has changed radically in recent years, leading to a detailed revision of the regulations. For statistics on trade with third countries, the introduction in 1988 of the Combined Nomenclature of goods (CN) and the Single Administrative Document had already led to considerable methodological changes. However, the major changes were brought about by the introduction of the single market on 1 January 1993. This led to the abolition of customs formalities between the Member States which had served as the traditional source of trade statistics, and the introduction of a special collection system called INTRASTAT.

Trade statistics – both detailed and general results – have now proved their worth. They are an instrument of prime importance for all users, both public and private. For instance, they enable Community authorities to prepare for multilateral and bilateral negotiations on the common trade policy, they help European businesses carry out market surveys and thus improve their competitiveness and they are an essential source of information for statistics on the balance of payments, the national accounts and short-term economic studies. This non-exhaustive list highlights the variety of users and their requirements.

The monthly bulletin on external and intra-European Union trade, published by Eurostat in the B series, Short-term Trends, sets out to provide data on short-term trends in the trade of the European Union (EU) and its Member States. It contains data on the trade flows, broken down by major product group, of the EU with its main trading partners on the one hand and between the Member States on the other. This bulletin comprises six parts:

- Trends in extra-EU and intra-EU trade
- The European Union and world trade
- The trading partners of the European Union
- Goods traded by the European Union with third countries
- The Member States and EU trade
- The external trade of the Member States.

While the first four parts (partially in the case of the first one) refer exclusively to EU trade (taken as a whole) with third countries, a comparison is made in the last two parts between the statistics on intra-EU trade and those on extra-EU trade. However, since the creation of Intrastat, the two types of statistics follow discrete methodologies and their aggregation may, therefore, involve risks.

Statistics on external trade and intra-EU trade at the most detailed classification level are published monthly on CD-Rom (Series B: intra and extra-EU trade). They are also available on-line from Eurostat's database (Comext). Trends in external trade since 1958 and a comparison with

world trade are contained in the publication "*External and Intra-EU Trade Statistical Yearbook (Series A)*".

Statistics on external trade and intra-EU trade are compiled on the basis of Community regulations. The same regulations are generally the basis for the compilation of statistics published nationally by each Member State. Nevertheless, methodological differences do arise, as a result of which Community statistics and national statistics do not match exactly.

### 2. Intra-EU trade

Statistics on trade between the Member States are based on Council Regulation (EC) N° 3330/91 of 7 November 1991 and on the various implementing regulations which have supplemented it or laid down rules on methodology, thresholds and forms. The system set up for the collection of information on trade between the Member States as from 1 January 1993 is commonly known as Intrastat. Its main features are:

- monthly statistical declarations sent directly by businesses to the competent national authorities;
- a system of thresholds abolishing all statistical obligations for almost two thirds of businesses;
- a close link with the VAT system.

Because of the introduction of this new system, the comparability of the intra-EU results prior to and after 1 January 1993 is limited, owing to a degree of under-estimation of flows. This was caused by the failure of some businesses to respond and the introduction of thresholds which exclude the smallest businesses. To correct this under-estimation, which varies according to the Member State, some countries make adjustments at an aggregate level (in general by partner country). Arrivals, i.e. imports from other EU countries, are particularly under-estimated. Consequently, Eurostat considers dispatches now to be the most reliable gauge of intra-EU trade.

If the dispatches of a given Member State are compared with the corresponding arrivals of its partners, differences may emerge, mainly for the following reasons:

- the threshold effect: a business may be obliged to provide statistical information in one Member State while its client or supplier, depending on the case, in the partner country may be dispensed from providing any or certain types of statistical information (e.g. product classification), thus preventing comparison at the most detailed level;
- the link with tax: this may result in a time-lag between the recording of dispatches and that of the corresponding arrivals. In addition, for certain special transactions (eg. triangular transactions or outside processing) distortions may arise because

of the difficulty in obtaining information on the partner country or on the statistical value of the goods. Tax fraud may have an effect, which is difficult to assess, on statistical declarations (under-assessment of arrivals, over-assessment of dispatches or failure to make a declaration);

- there may be other reasons, already in existence before 1993, for discrepancies (goods classified under different headings of the product nomenclature, different statistical values for dispatches and arrivals, etc.) and in addition there may be mistakes or omissions which are unavoidable despite the constant efforts by Eurostat and the Member States to improve the quality and topicality of statistical information.

For these reasons, figures on intra-EU trade should be interpreted with caution. They are also subject to frequent revision.

### **3. Extra-EU trade**

For data on the years 1978 to 1995, the Member States forwarded statistics on trade outside the European Union in accordance with a uniform methodology provided for in Council Regulation (EEC) N° 1736/75 and the regulations deriving from it. Since the beginning of 1996, data have been submitted in accordance with Council Regulation (EC) N° 1172/95 and its implementing rules which however retain the former methodological principles.

External trade statistics are usually recorded on the basis of customs declarations submitted by the declarant when clearing customs. The Single Administrative Document is used for this purpose. In some Member States, certain businesses are allowed to make a summary declaration.



## Methodological notes and sources

### 1. Data sources

The tables in this publication on EU trade and that of the Member States were compiled by Eurostat using the detailed data forwarded by the Member States. Eurostat would like to take this opportunity to thank the departments concerned in the Member States for their cooperation, which makes it possible to compile these harmonized statistics and guarantee their quality.

Some of the tables in the first two parts describe the development of external trade as declared by some of the EU's most important trading partners. With the exception of Table 1C and the results concerning the EU, these tables were compiled from data taken from the tapes sent each month by the International Monetary Fund. The information in table 1C is taken from the Comtrade database, which is managed by the United Nations.

### 2. Coverage

#### 2.1. Intra-EU trade

Statistics on trade between the Member States cover the arrivals and dispatches of movable property recorded by each Member State. Arrivals and dispatches are defined as follows:

- *arrivals* are goods in free circulation within the European Union which enter the statistical territory of a given Member State;
- *dispatches* are goods in free circulation within the European Union which leave the statistical territory of a given Member State to enter another Member State.

Goods placed under the customs arrangements of inward processing or processing under customs control (for working, processing or repairs) are also regarded as arrivals or dispatches.

The reader should also note that statistics on trade between the Member States do not cover goods in transit or trade between Member States and, for example, the French overseas departments or the Canary Islands.

#### 2.2. Extra-EU trade

Statistics on trade with third countries cover movable property imported and exported by the European Union. The definitions are as follows:

- *imports* are goods which enter the statistical territory of the European Union from a third country and are placed under the customs procedure for free circulation (as a general rule goods intended for consumption), or inward processing, or processing under customs control (goods for working,

processing or repair) immediately, or after bonded warehousing;

- *exports* are goods which leave the statistical territory of the European Union for a third country after being placed under the customs procedure for exports (definitive export) or outward processing (goods for working, processing or repair).

Statistics on trade with third countries do not, therefore, include goods in transit or those placed under a customs procedure for bonded warehousing or temporary entry (for fairs, exhibitions, tests, etc.) nor do they include re-export following entry under one of these procedures.

The field covered by statistics on trade with third countries corresponds to "special" trade. This method of accounting differs from that of "general" trade, which includes all goods entering the statistical territory and those leaving it, with the exception, however, of goods in transit. Goods placed in bonded warehouses and exports of goods after bonded warehousing are included in the definition of general trade.

### 3. Statistical data

#### 3.1. Statistical territory

The statistical territory of the European Union comprises the customs territory of the European Union, excluding the French overseas departments (Guadeloupe, Guyana, Martinique and Réunion) and the Canary Islands, which are therefore considered as third countries. Likewise, Greenland, Ceuta and Melilla are not covered, nor are the overseas countries and territories which are not part of the EU customs territory.

Since October 1990, the external trade data of Germany refers to the Federal Republic of Germany in its borders as of 3 October 1990, i.e. after reunification.

#### 3.2. Trading partners: countries and economic areas

The results are broken down by country and area in accordance with the "Country nomenclature for statistics on European Union external trade and trade between its Member States", referred to as the Geonomenclature (Geonom). For the purposes of presenting the results, Eurostat has defined geographical and economic areas.

In the case of exports (or dispatches), the country (or Member State) of final destination of the goods is the partner country.

The trading partner in the case of an intra-European Union arrival is always the Member State of consignment of the goods, even when the goods originate in third countries and have been placed in free circulation in the Member

State of consignment. For imports (extra-EU trade) the statistics show, except in certain cases (returned goods, objects of art, etc.), the country of origin. Where two or more countries were involved in the production of certain goods, the country where the final processing or substantial working took place is considered to be the country of origin.

### 3.3. Goods classification

The most detailed results published by Eurostat and accessible to the public on magnetic medium are broken down according to the subheadings of the Combined Nomenclature (CN). This tariff and statistical nomenclature is based on the international nomenclature of the Harmonized System (HS) and comprises around 10 000 eight-digit codes.

In this publication, the results are broken down by the sections and divisions of the UN Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev. 3 since 1988) by means of conversion tables drawn up by Eurostat on the basis of the CN.

### 3.4. Estimate of the statistical value

Although the data is collected in units of national currency, the values set out in this bulletin have been expressed, after conversion, in European Units of Account (ECU). The ECU is a "basket" currency unit based on the market exchange rates of a specific quantity of each European Union currency according to a weighting system involving the five-year average of each Member State's gross national product and intra-EU trade balance. The rates used in this bulletin are averages of daily rates. The annex to the bulletin contains a table showing the conversion rates used.

#### 3.4.1. Intra-European Union trade

The statistical value is based on the assessment for taxation purposes or the amount billed. It is the FOB (free on board) value for dispatches and the CIF (cost, insurance, freight) value for arrivals. It comprises only those subsidiary costs (freight and insurance) which relate, for dispatches, to the journey to the border of the Member State from which the goods are dispatched and, for arrivals, to the journey to the border of the Member State into which the goods enter.

In the case of arrivals or dispatches under an inward or outward processing arrangement and those for outside processing, it is always the total value of the goods that is recorded and not simply the added value.

#### 3.4.2. Extra-European Union trade

The statistical value is based on the amount billed (real or provisional) or if it exists, on the customs value. It is the

FOB value for exports and the CIF value for imports. It comprises only those subsidiary costs (freight and insurance) which relate, for exports, to the journey within the territory of the Member State from which the goods are exported and, for imports, to the journey outside the territory of the Member State into which the goods are imported.

In the case of imports or exports under an inward or outward processing arrangement and those for outside processing, it is always the total value of the goods that is recorded and not simply the added value.

### 3.5. Statistical secrecy

Most Member States take measures to guarantee the confidentiality of certain flows of goods. The legislation, the procedures for implementing it, and the range of goods subject to secrecy vary from one Member State to another.

This confidentiality applies to the most detailed level of the classification used for collecting the data: it may therefore refer to all or only part of a subheading of the Combined Nomenclature. Similarly, confidentiality may apply to imports only, or to exports only, or to only some of the variables recorded (value, statistical procedure, quantities, partner country, etc.).

Measures are taken during collection and during processing by Eurostat to minimize the effect of confidentiality on the results. In particular, subheadings which include confidentialized trade data are included at higher levels of aggregation and in totals.

## 4. Indices

### 4.1. Introduction

Changes over time in the value of trade are influenced by changes in prices and the quantities marketed. Eurostat calculates Fisher's annual chain indices to measure these two effects. This publication sets out the indices calculated according to the SITC for each Member State on a strictly comparable basis. These indices may be consulted on the TREND database.

### 4.2. Data sources

The data transmitted for external trade and intra-European Union trade statistics are used at the most detailed level for calculating the indices. The indices of unit values (values divided by quantities) are used as price change indicators. The computer programs contain a system for automatically identifying extreme unit values pointing to unlikely price movements.

Two rules are applied to exclude unlikely price behaviour. The first is that, given the general level of inflation, the price of a product will not change significantly compared with its level the previous year. Any change of five points or more

is considered suspect. The second rule – which is more restrictive – is that the change in the price of a product compared with the closest month available will not differ significantly from the average change in the price of similar products. The application of these rules prevents extreme changes due to factors unrelated to prices which, otherwise, would lead to a distortion of the unit value index. For products whose unit values are rejected, the changes are drawn up according to those of similar products.

## Trends in European Union trade

## GLOBAL TRENDS IN WORLD TRADE

In the first nine months of 1996 the European Union's trade balance improved by almost ECU 12 billion compared with the same period in 1995. In the same period, the United States' deficit worsened slightly, reaching over ECU 110 billion while Japan recorded a decrease of ECU 30 billion in its surplus.

Between January and September 1996, the EU as a whole confirmed its position as the world's leading exporter, while the United States was the most important world outlet.

In the first three quarters of 1996 the **European Union's**<sup>1</sup> external trade balance showed a surplus of ECU 24 billion, whereas in the same period in 1995 it had shown a surplus of 12.3 billion. The annual growth rates of extra-EU exports and imports for this period were 7.3% and 4.6% respectively.

Between January and September 1996 the EU as a whole confirmed its position as the leading world exporter (ECU 445.4 billion, i.e. 20% of world exports), while in imports it ranked second with 17.6% (ECU 421.3 billion).

From January to September 1996, the **United States'** trade deficit went up compared with a year earlier, and amounting to a total of ECU 113.3 billion. The growth rates of export and import were 9.4% and 7.9% respectively.

Despite a slight decline since 1995, the United States confirmed its first place in the world ranking of importers, with a share of 19.9%.

In the first nine months of 1996, **Japan** recorded a trade surplus of ECU 34.5 billion, down from the 64.3 billion registered in the same period of the previous year. This result was due to the high growth rate of Japanese imports (+7.5% over the previous year), together with a decrease in the value of its exports (-6.1%).

As a result, the Japanese share of world exports fell to 10.7%, while its share of imports remained stable at 8.6%.

<sup>1</sup> The European Union's figures for 1996 are provisional and subject to frequent revisions. The symbol ":" indicates that the figure is not available. The 1994 figures for the three new Member States (Austria, Finland and Sweden) are estimated using different international sources which do not follow EU methodology; for this reason, the growth rates for these countries should be treated with caution.

## EU EXTERNAL TRADE BY MAIN PARTNERS

The EU balance with its Central and Eastern European (CEEC) partners showed the largest surplus in the first nine months of 1996 (ECU 14 billion), followed by Other Asian countries (ECU 11 billion) and DAE partners (ECU 9 billion). In contrast, trade with Japan and China registered the highest deficits (ECU 12.7 and 12 billion respectively).

Trade flows with the **United States** (the EU's most important individual partner, with shares of 17.8% and 19% respectively for exports and imports in 1995) showed a deficit of ECU 1.6 billion in the period January-September 1996.

This represents a slight improvement compared with the same period in the previous year, when the EU-US balance showed a deficit of ECU 1.9 billion. Export and import growth rates were 9.6% and 8.9% respectively.

Between January-September 1995 and the same period in 1996 the trade balance with **Japan** improved by 3.5 billion, amounting to an ECU 12.7 billion deficit, while in the same period, trade with the **EFTA** countries was almost in balance.

EU exports to Japan were in fact quite dynamic, with a growth rate over the previous year of 9.4%, while imports over the same period showed a negative rate of change (-3%).

EU exports to the **CIS** and the **CEEC** partners in the first nine months of 1995 and 1996 showed the most dynamic flows (growth rates of +22% and +20%), while the corresponding imports either declined or remained sluggish (-3.3% and +4.1% respectively). As a result, the EU trade balances with these

countries (which in 1995 together accounted for around 13.6% of total extra-EU flows) improved sharply by ECU 4 billion and ECU 7 billion respectively.

The growth rates of EU exports to the **Latin American** and **DAE** countries were similar (+4% and +5% compared with January-September 1995), while on the imports side they were quite different (-0.8% and +6.6% respectively). The differences in the rates of change in exports and imports reduced the EU surplus with DAE countries to ECU 8.8 billion, and improved the EU surplus with Latin America to ECU 2.2 billion. Latin America and DAE countries accounted for 5.5% and 11% respectively of EU external trade in 1995.

The first three quarters of 1996 saw a sharp expansion in EU imports from **China** (+14% compared to the corresponding period of the previous year), together with a slight decrease in the value of the Union's exports to China (-1.7% growth rate). As a result, the EU-China trade deficit rose by ECU 2.8 billion in January-September 1996 to reach ECU 12.1 billion.

## EU EXTERNAL TRADE BY MAIN PRODUCTS

**In the first nine months of 1996, the EU's trade balance in machinery and transport equipment recorded the greatest surplus (ECU 64 billion), while fuel products showed the largest deficit (ECU 46 billion).**

In the period January-September 1996, the **primary products (SITC 0-4)** deficit rose to ECU 67 billion compared to the ECU 65 billion registered in the corresponding period of 1995.

The EU trade deficits in fuel products (SITC 3) and food, beverages and tobacco (SITC 0+1) grew by ECU 5.1 and 0.4 billion respectively, while the balance for raw materials except fuel (SITC 2+4) showed an improvement of ECU 3 billion compared to a year earlier.

Between January-September 1995 and 1996, the growth rates of the flows for primary products (which in 1995 accounted for 11% of total extra-EU exports and 27.2% of imports) were 4.9% for exports and 4.4% for imports. Trade in fuel products (SITC 3), propped up by the increase in international oil prices (the ECU cost of the EU's crude oil supplies rose by 19% in the first nine months of 1996), saw increases in export and import flows of 21.8% and 14% respectively, while the other raw materials (SITC

2+4) registered negative growth rate for exports and imports (-3.1% and -10.7% respectively)

As far as **manufactured products (SITC 5-8)** are concerned (87% of total extra-EU exports and 70% of imports in 1995), EU external trade showed a surplus of ECU 97 billion compared to the ECU 81 billion registered in January-September 1995.

In the first nine months of 1996, the EU surplus for machinery and transport equipment (SITC 7) improved by ECU 5 billion, for other manufactured goods (SITC 6+8) by ECU 7.7 billion and for chemical products (SITC 5) by ECU 3.7.

Among the sections encompassing manufactured products, the most impressive rates of growth were recorded for imports of machinery and transport equipment (SITC 7) and exports of other manufactured goods (SITC 6+8), both with 9 %.

## EU TRADE BY MEMBER STATE

### EXTRA-EU TRADE

**Germany and Italy showed the two largest extra-EU surpluses among the EU countries, while the Netherlands and the United Kingdom registered the highest external deficits.**

In the first nine months of 1996, **Germany** was the EU Member State with the largest extra-EU trade surplus (ECU 21.6 billion). This represents an improvement (3.5 billion) over the previous year and is due to the positive gap (2.4 percentage points) between the growth rates for exports and imports.

Germany is also the most important player in trade between the EU and third countries. Its 1995 share of total extra-EU exports amounted to 29.3%, while the figure for imports stood at 25.7%.

The second-ranking country (in trade value terms) was the **United Kingdom** (which in 1995 accounted for 12.8% and 17% of exports and imports respectively). The UK was also the EU Member State with the largest trade deficit (ECU 16.7 billion) in January-September 1996.

**Italy** displayed the second-largest extra-EU trade surplus (ECU 16.9 billion) among the EU Member States. The remarkable 7.5 billion improvement compared to the first nine months of 1995 was due to very high increase in extra-EU exports (+16.5%), while imports grew by only 3%.

Between January-September 1995 and the same period in 1996, **France's** imports increased faster than its exports, the growth rates being 4% and 3.6% respectively. However, France's trade surplus showed a slight improvement compared to the previous year (ECU 0.2 billion), reaching ECU 11.3 billion.

During the first three quarters of 1996 the **Dutch** extra-EU deficit rose by 0.3 billion compared with the same period in 1995, representing the second-largest deficit among the EU Member States. Nevertheless, this deficit has to be interpreted in connection with the intra-EU Dutch surplus and the transit role of this country in EU trade. Both import and export flows showed a reduction between January-September 1995 and 1996 of -0.4% and -2% respectively.

After the boom experienced in 1995 (+15% growth rate), **Belgium/Luxembourg** extra-EU imports grew slowly in the first nine months of 1996 compared to the previous year (3.6%). However, owing to the smaller increase in the extra-EU exports of these two countries (2.1%), their trade balance deteriorated by ECU 0.4 billion.

The two new Member States of **Sweden** and **Finland** contributed positively to the EU's external trade balance in the first nine months of 1996. Together they showed a surplus of ECU 13 billion. As for Austria, the figure for the first half of 1996 (the latest data available) showed a surplus of ECU 2.2 billion.

Sweden's extra-EU exports were fairly dynamic in January-September 1996, showing growth rates of 17.4%, while Finland registered more moderate rates of change (6.1%). On the imports side, only Sweden had a significant growth rate (+5.1%), while for Finland extra-EU imports underwent a slight increase.

Of the five remaining Member States (which together accounted for about 10% of extra-EU flows in 1995), **Greece, Ireland, Portugal** and **Spain** registered fairly high growth rates in their extra-EU exports in the first eight months of 1996 (+44.3%, +24.1%, +9.4% and +10.4% respectively), while the performance of **Denmark** (+3.3%) was less impressive. Nevertheless, for Greece the level of growth is mainly due to changes in its revision system.

As far as the trade balance is concerned, despite the positive gap between export and import growth rates, Greece, Spain and Portugal registered extra-EU deficits in January-September 1996 of ECU 2.3 billion, 2.8 billion and 2.2 billion respectively.

## EU TRADE BY MEMBER STATE

### INTRA-EU TRADE <sup>1</sup>

**The Netherlands and Germany produced the two largest intra-EU surpluses, while the United Kingdom and Greece recorded the highest internal deficits.**

The first estimate of intra-EU trade in the period January-September 1996 showed a total value for dispatches (i.e. exports, which are the more reliable measure of intra-EU trade) of around ECU 768 billion, representing an increase of 2.9% compared with a year earlier.

The **Netherlands** was the Member State with the largest intra-EU surplus. In the first nine months of 1996 it grew to ECU 29.4 billion, which is 3.1 billion up on the same period of 1995. However, as mentioned in the preceding comment, it must be stressed that this figure has to be interpreted in the light of the extra-EU Dutch deficit and the transit role of this country in EU trade.

In January-September 1996, the growth rate of the country's intra-EU dispatches slowed to a modest +6.2% (compared to the 17% registered at the end of 1995), while the dynamics of arrivals were even more sluggish (+4% growth rate).

As in the case of extra-EU trade, **Germany** is also the most important player in trade with the EU partners, its 1995 share of total intra-EU trade amounting to 21.5%.

In the first nine months of 1996, this country registered the second-largest intra-EU trade surplus (ECU 17.2 billion)-a decline of 0.8 billion compared with the same period of the previous year.

**France** ranks second in volume of trade with EU partners, with a 1995 share of 15.2%. In the period January-September 1996, its intra-EU trade showed a deficit of ECU 4.3 billion, an improvement of 0.5 billion over the same period in 1995.

The **United Kingdom's** internal deficit rose by ECU 1 billion, reaching ECU 7 billion. The UK's growth rates for arrivals and dispatches for the first nine

months of 1996 were very close (7.5% and 8.1% respectively)

**Italy and Ireland** saw growth rate increases in their intra-Union flows in January-September 1996. For dispatches, the rates were 5% and 7.6% respectively, while on the arrivals side the figures were 2.7% and 10.8%. As a result, the intra-EU surplus of both countries increased compared to the same period of 1995 by ECU 1.9 billion for Italy and ECU 0.1 billion for Ireland.

With a 1995 share of around 10%, **Belgium/Luxembourg** were also important players in intra-EU trade. In January-September 1996, these countries registered an intra-EU surplus of ECU 9.7 billion. This represented a reduction of ECU 0.4 billion compared to a year earlier, mainly due to the gap between dispatch and arrival growth rates (3% and 4% respectively).

As far as the three new Member States are concerned, **Sweden** and **Finland** confirmed their surpluses in trade with their EU partners whereas for **Austria**, the data for the first half of 1996 (latest period available) showed a deficit of ECU 3.9 billion.

Of the remaining four Member States (together accounting for 10.5% of intra-EU trade in 1995), only **Denmark** displayed a small intra-EU surplus in the first nine months of 1996 (ECU 1.1 billion), while **Portugal, Spain** and **Greece** registered internal deficits of ECU 3.3, 5.3 and 6 billion respectively. However, it must be pointed out that Spain's intra-EU exports and imports were fairly dynamic in this period, showing growth rates of 10.2% and 7% respectively.

<sup>1</sup> On 1 January 1993, following the abolition of customs controls in the EU, a new collection system for intra-EU data (Intrastat) was introduced. Instead of being derived from customs declarations, trade figures are now compiled from data provided directly by companies.

# SEASONALLY ADJUSTED TIME SERIES OF EU TRADE

## Extra-EU trade <sup>1</sup>

After falling by a seasonally adjusted 3.9% in August 1996 compared with the previous month, the EU's exports levelled off from August to September. However, all the monthly figures for the third quarter were still above the individual levels recorded in the seasonally adjusted series for the first half of the year.

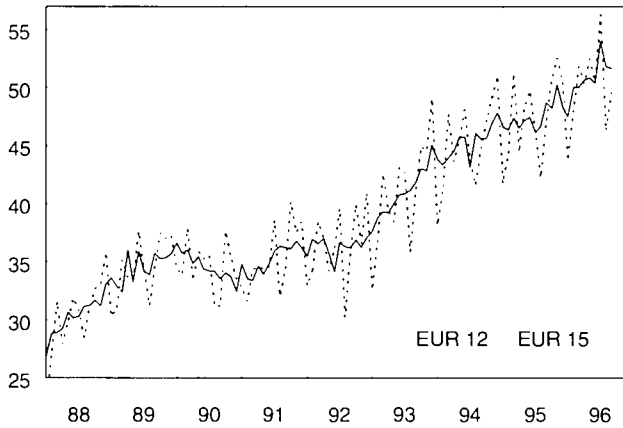
Imports picked up again in August 1996 (+1%) reaching ECU 48.3 billion in September - the same figure as in June. This corresponds to an increase of 2.9% over the same month in the previous year, and is the highest level of seasonally adjusted imports since the enlargement of the EU in January 1995.

With the increase in imports and the drop in exports, the seasonally adjusted trade balance deteriorated in August and September - from ECU +7.1 billion in July to ECU +4.6 billion in August and ECU +3.4 billion in September.

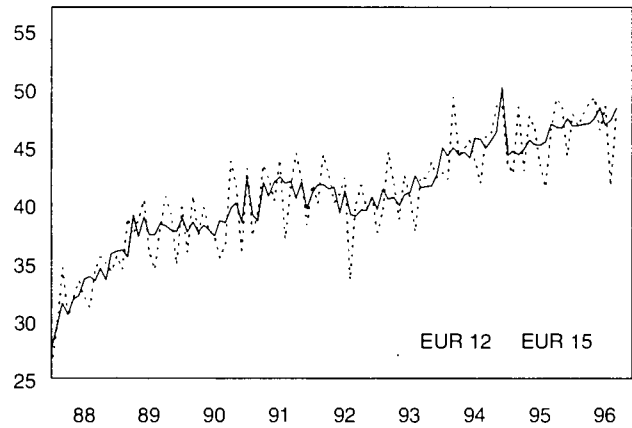
## Intra-EU trade <sup>2</sup>

Seasonally adjusted intra-EU trade appeared to stabilise between ECU 85 billion and ECU 86 billion from October 1995 to May 1996. However, it increased again from June to August (August +4.5% over May) and fell back only slightly by ECU 0.1 billion or 0.1% in September. The figure for the entire third quarter was 2.9% up on the second quarter of 1996.

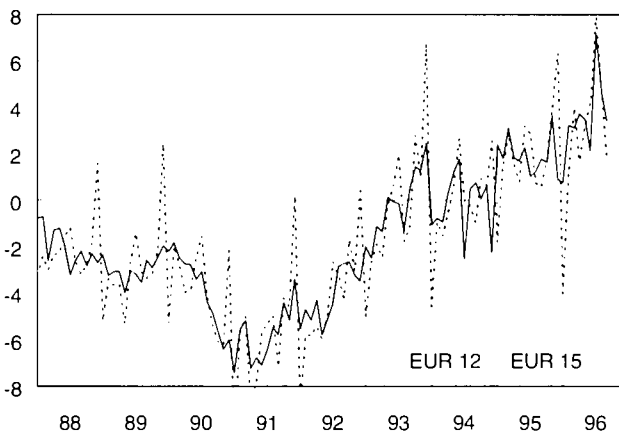
Extra-EU trade: exports  
(in ECU billion)



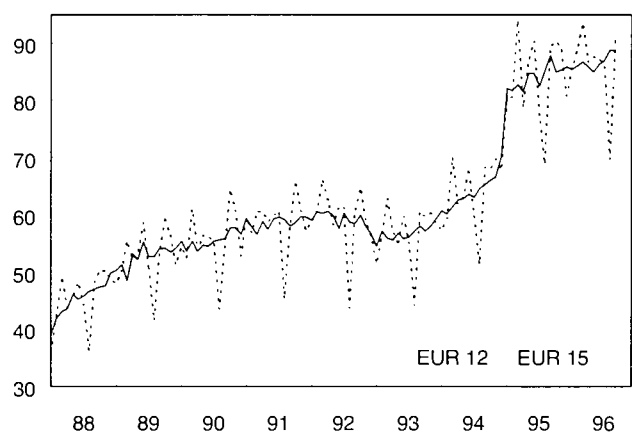
Extra-EU trade: imports

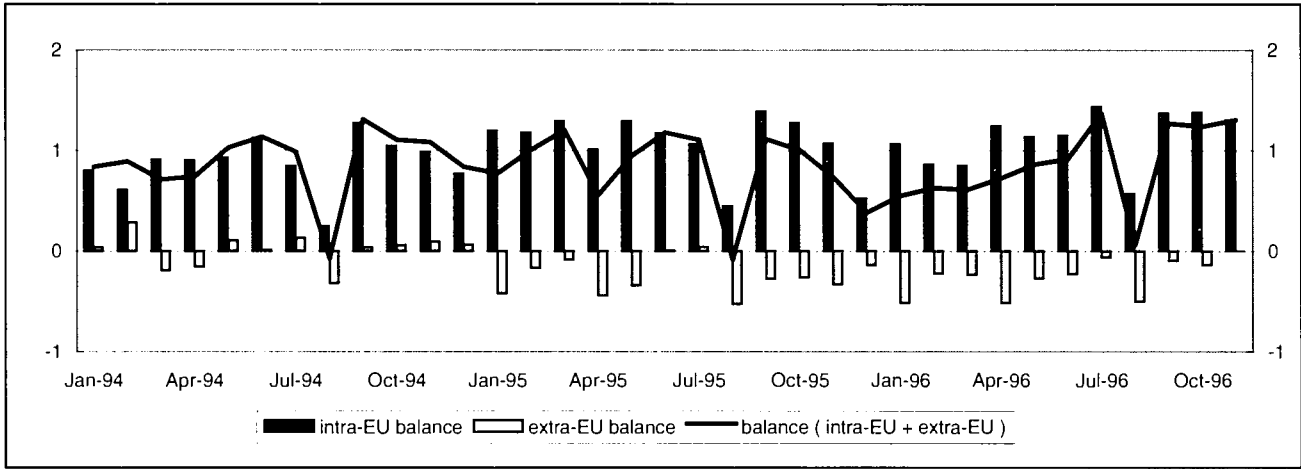

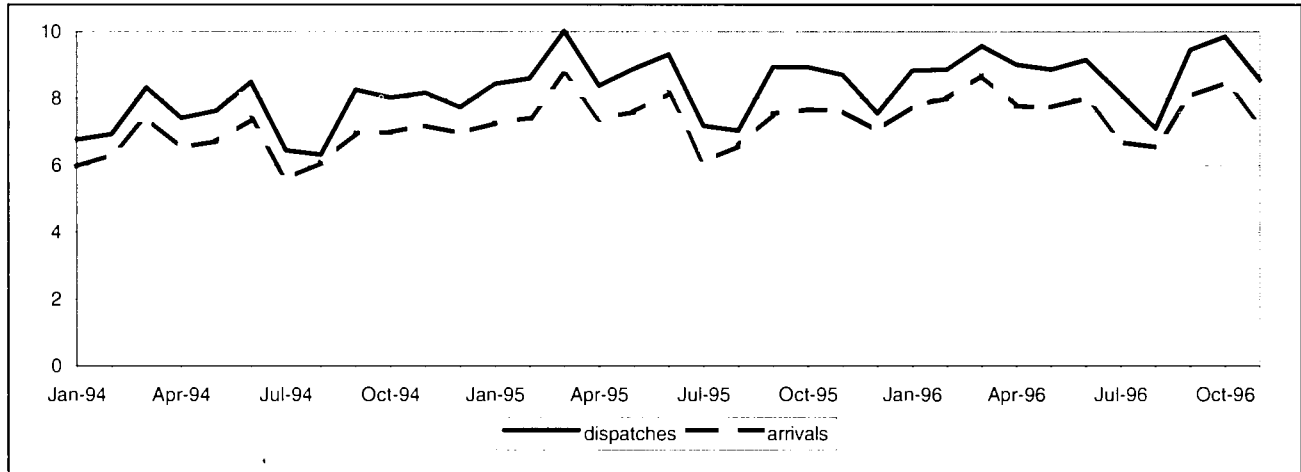

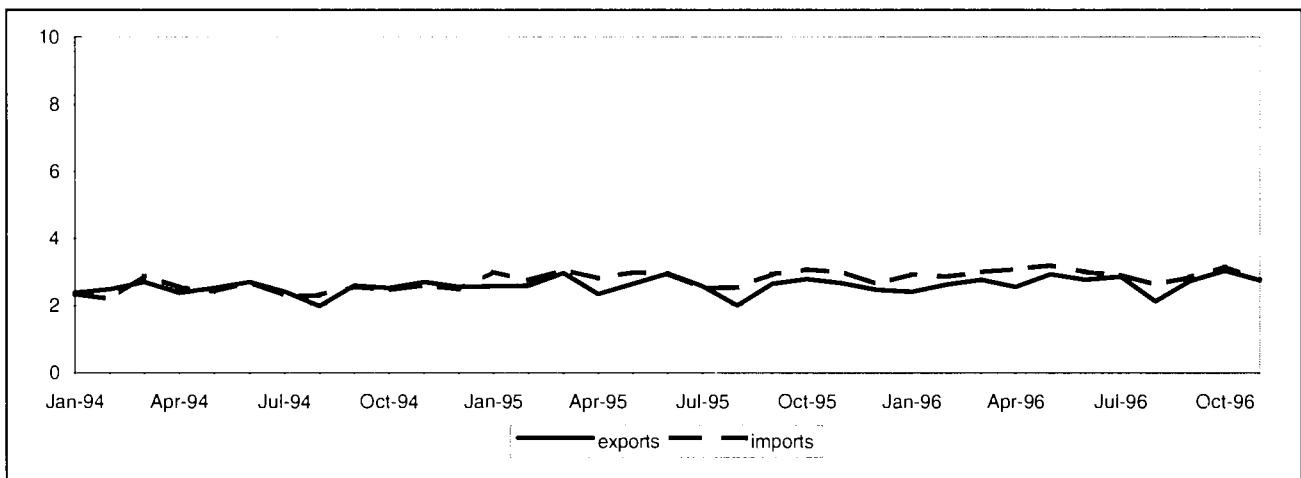
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

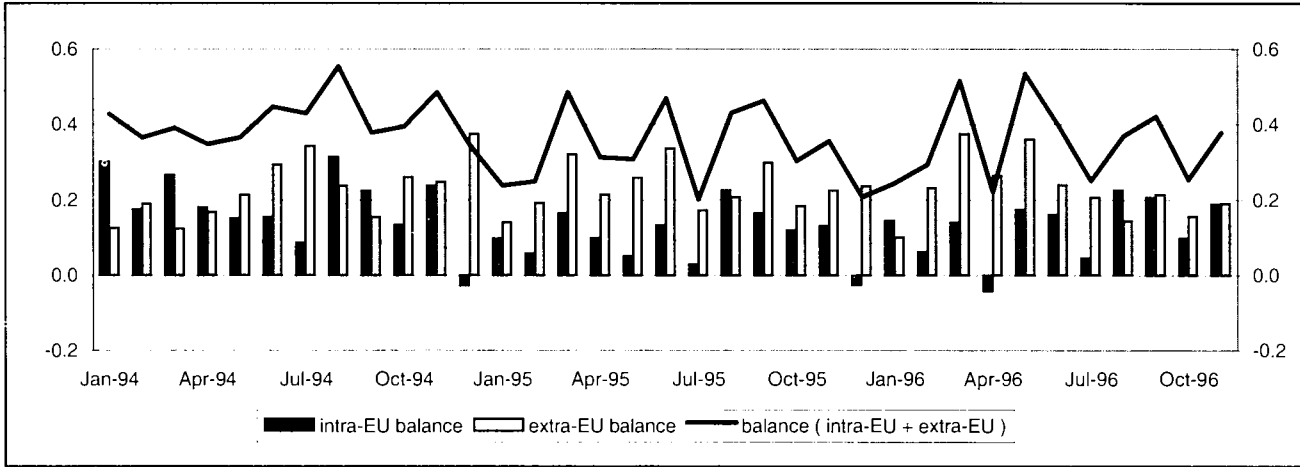

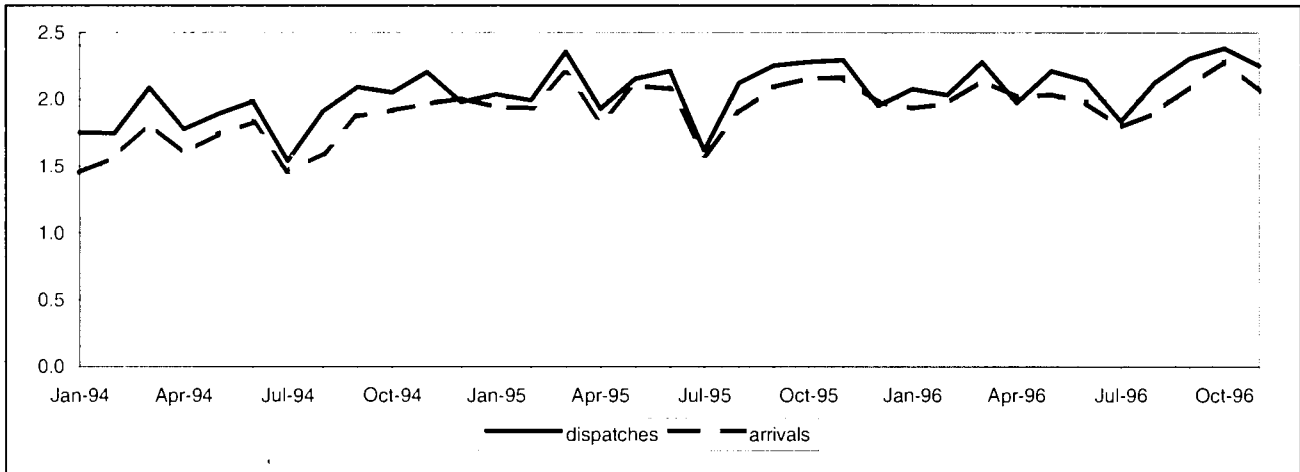

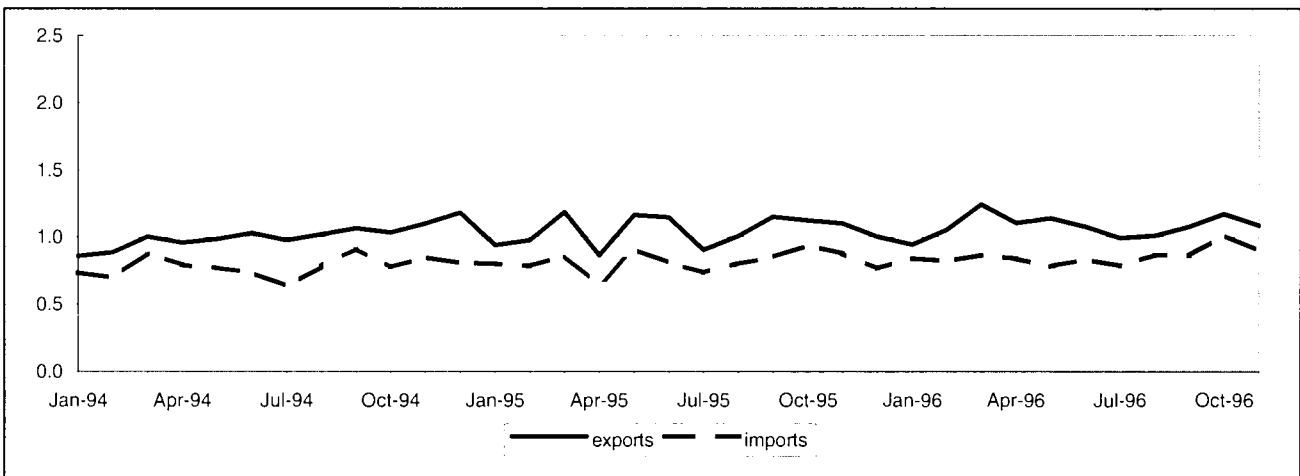
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

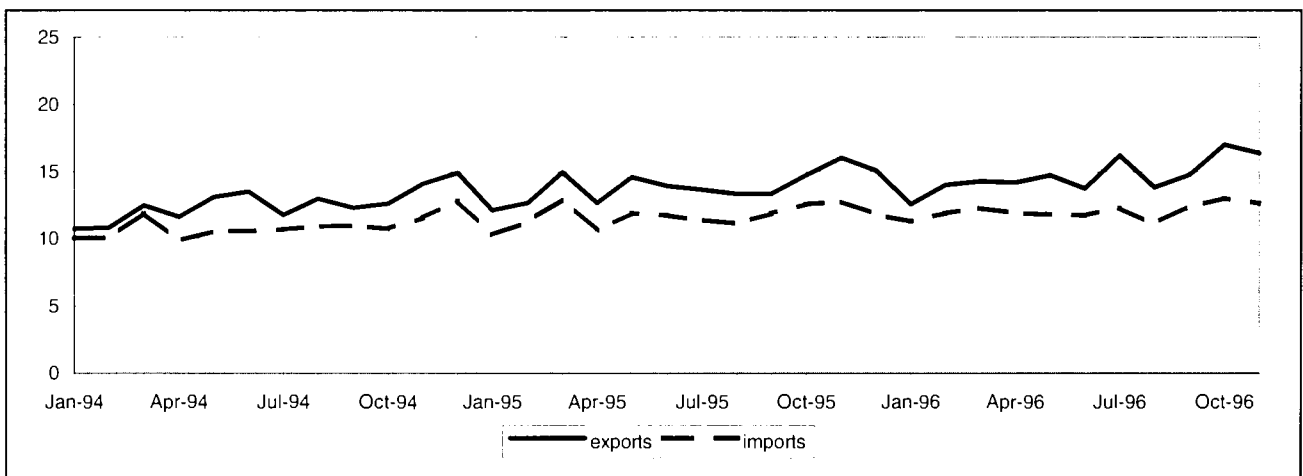

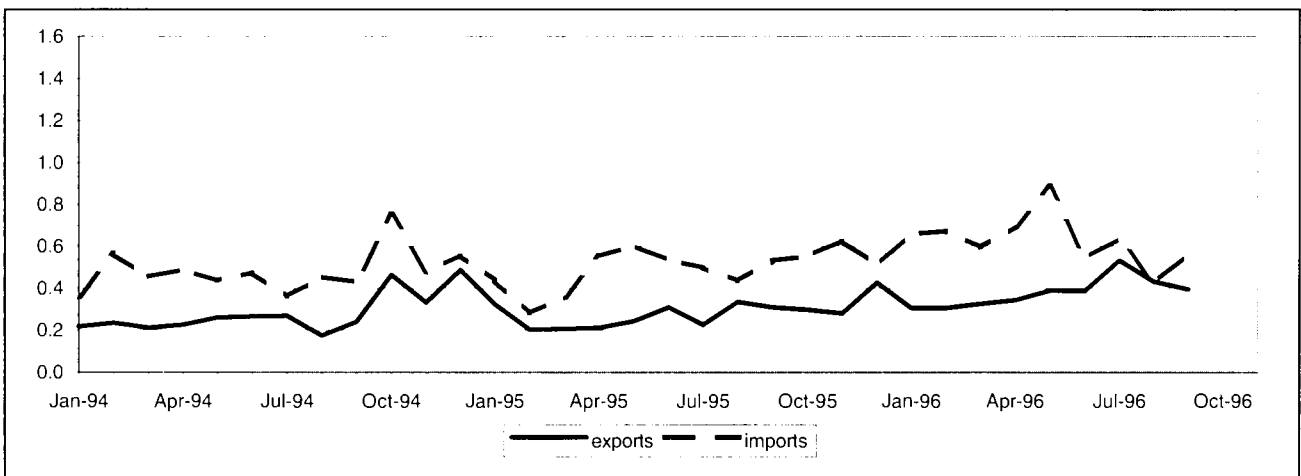
### TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

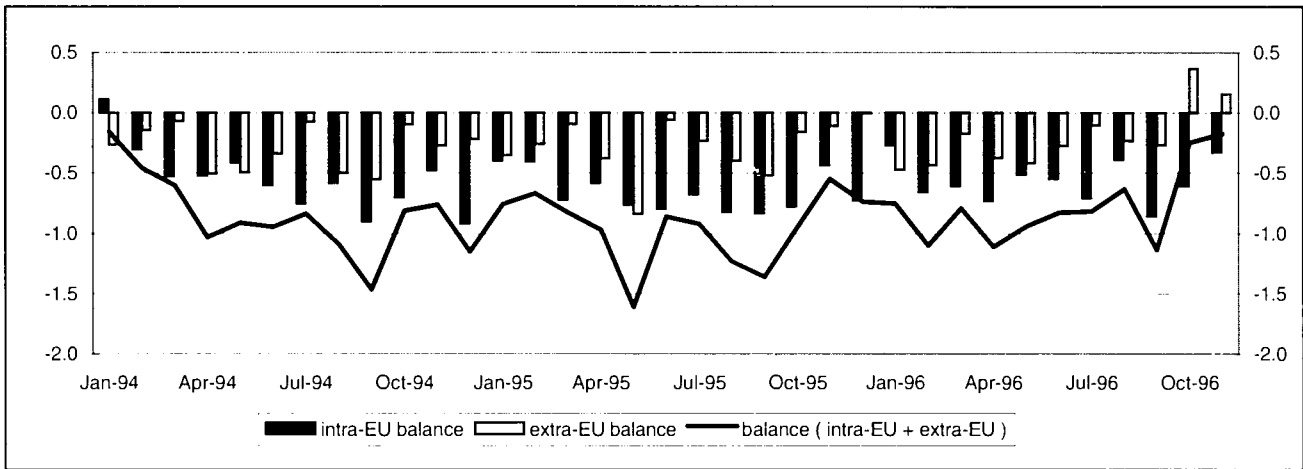

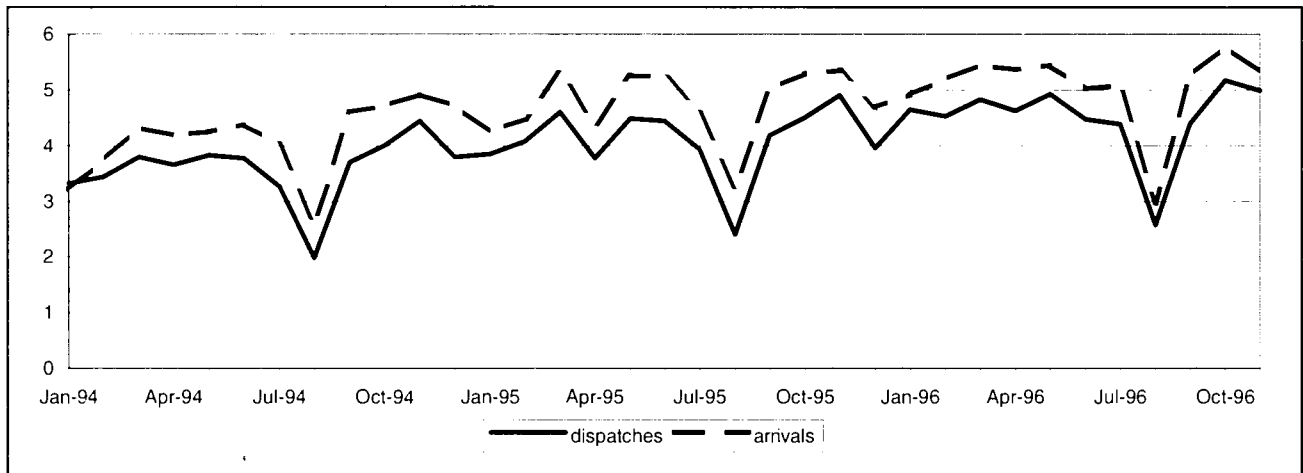

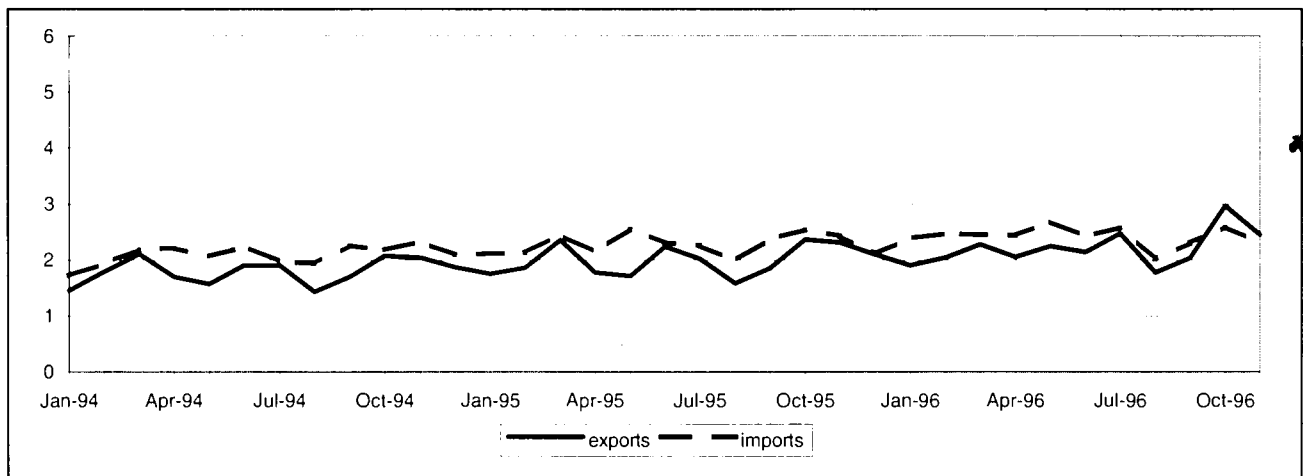
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

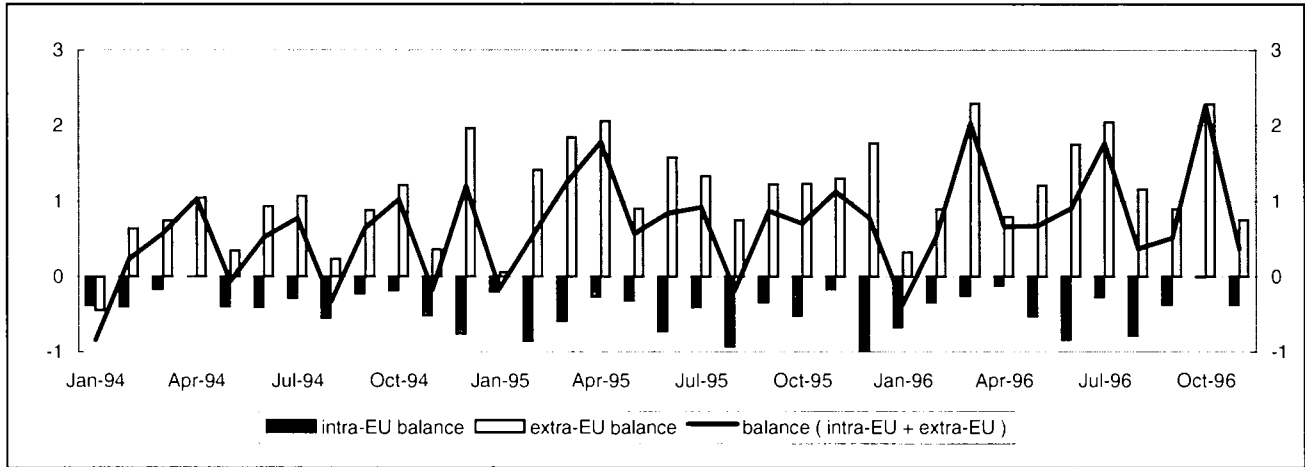

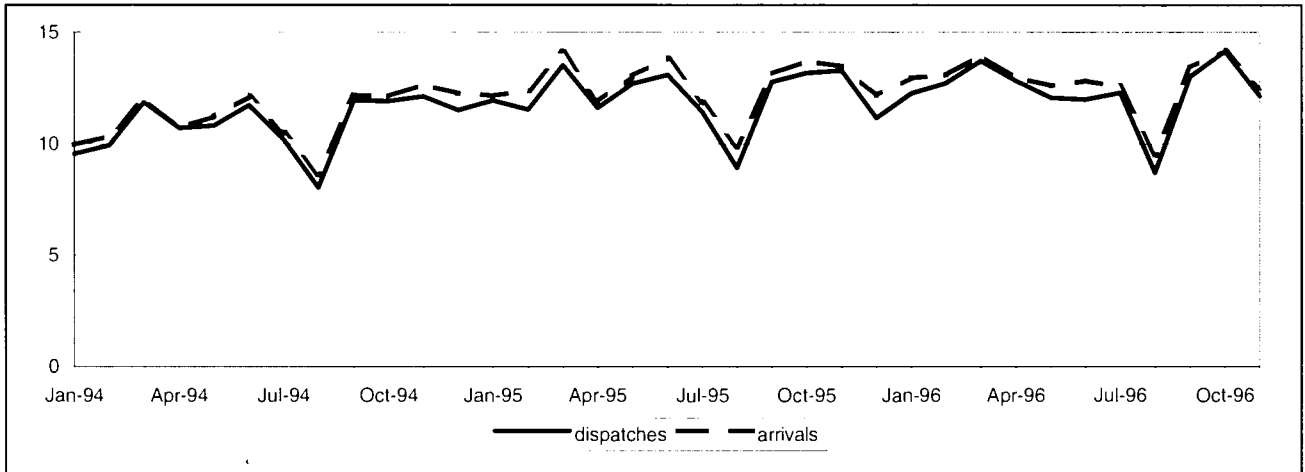

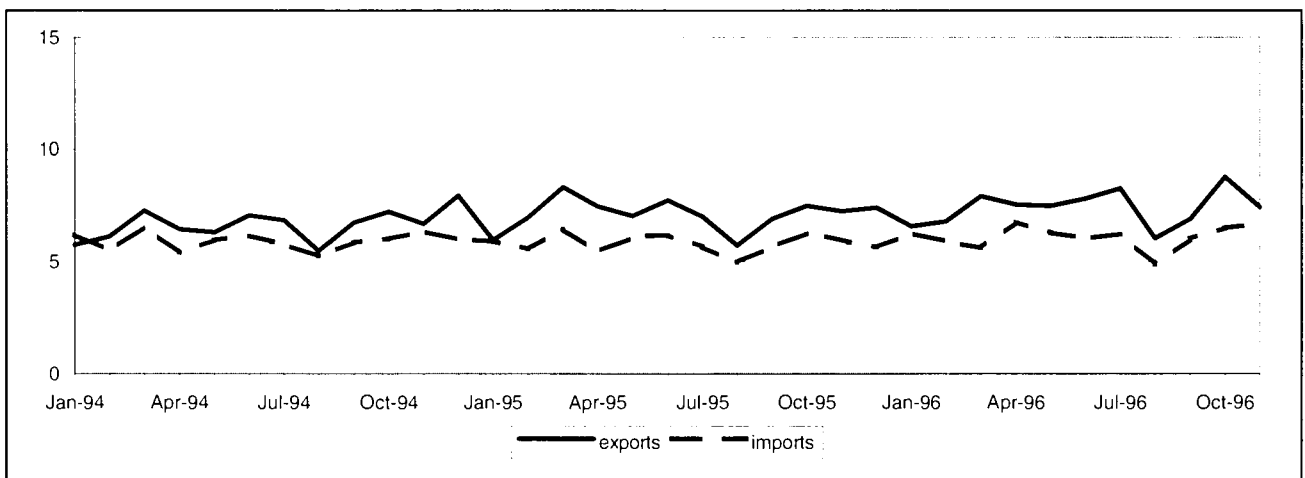
## TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

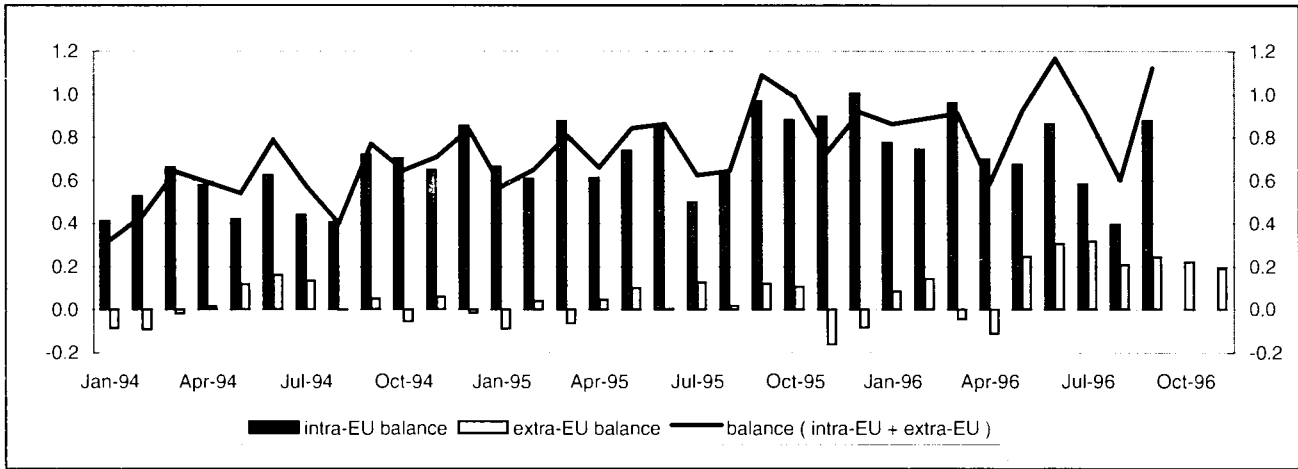

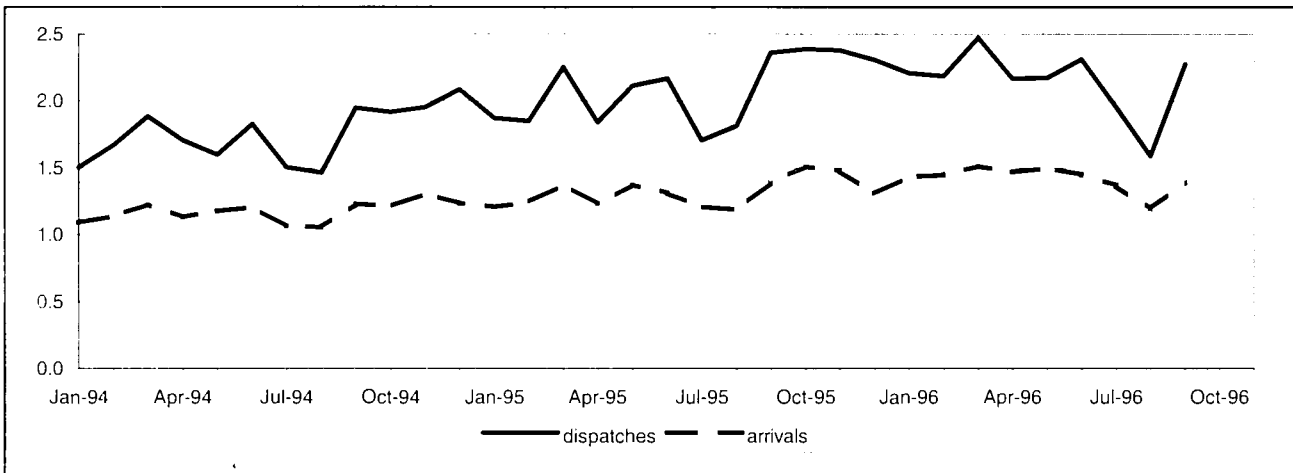

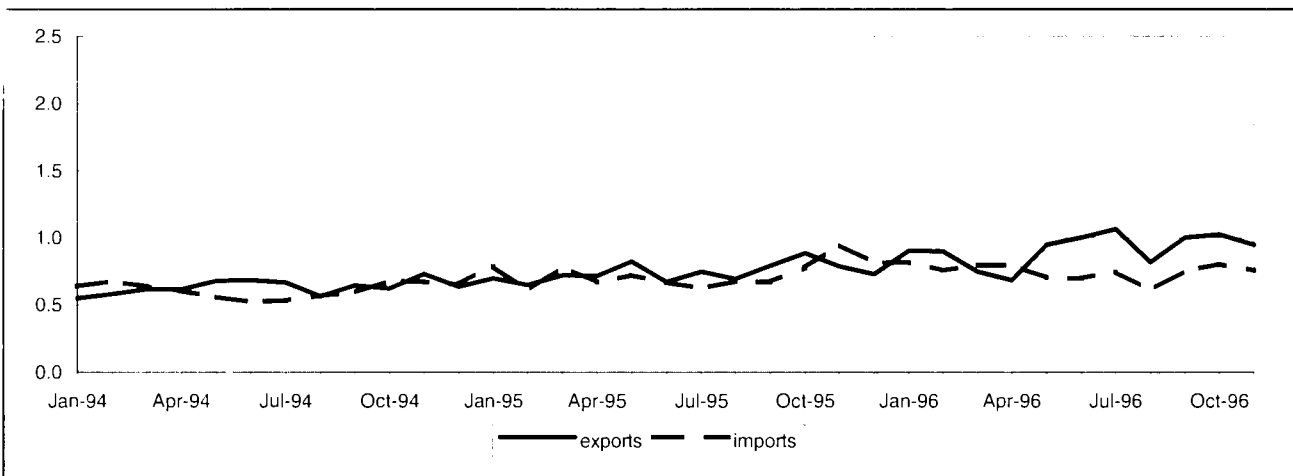
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

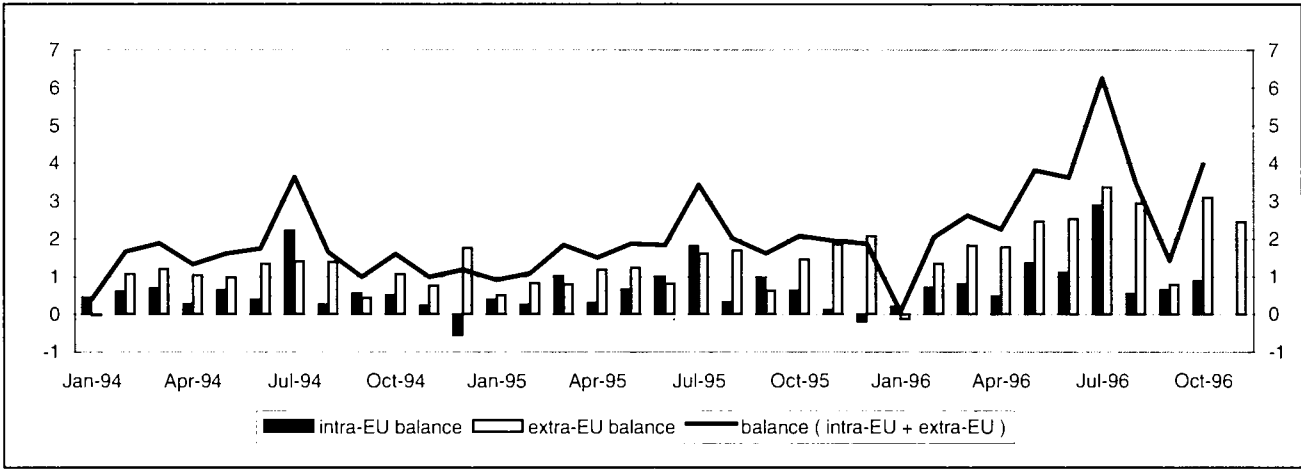

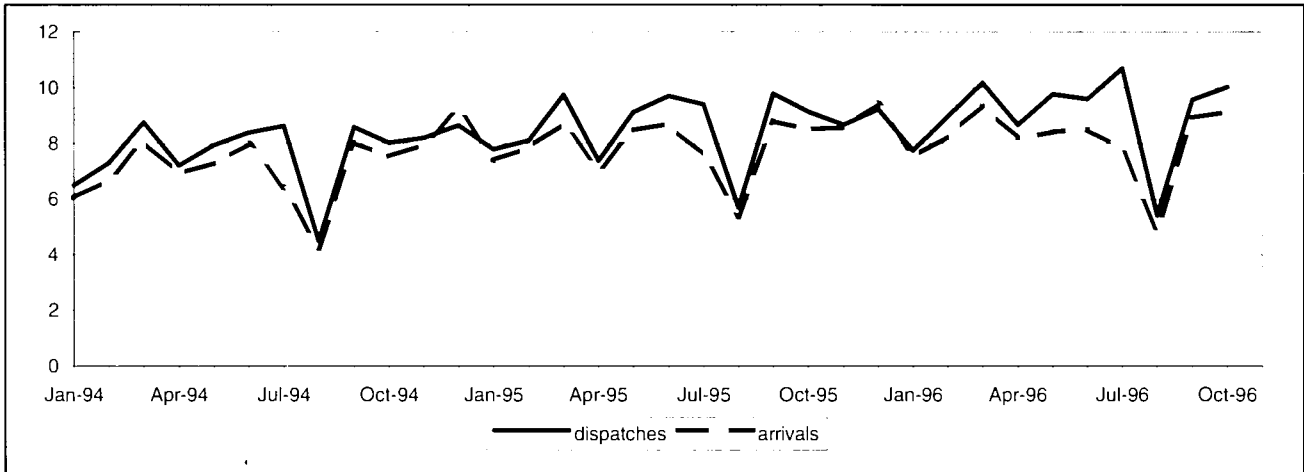

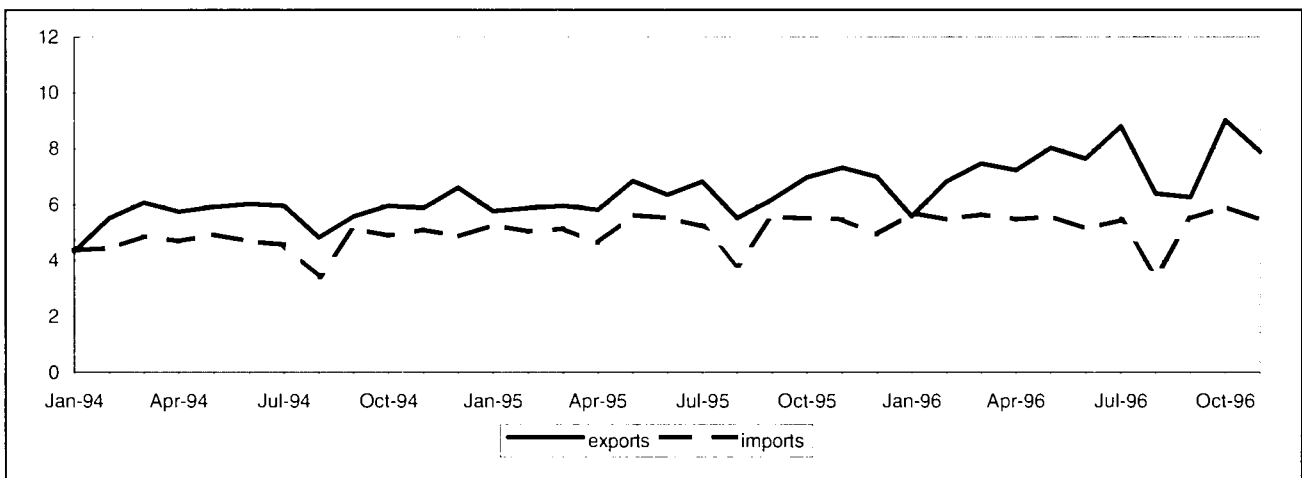
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

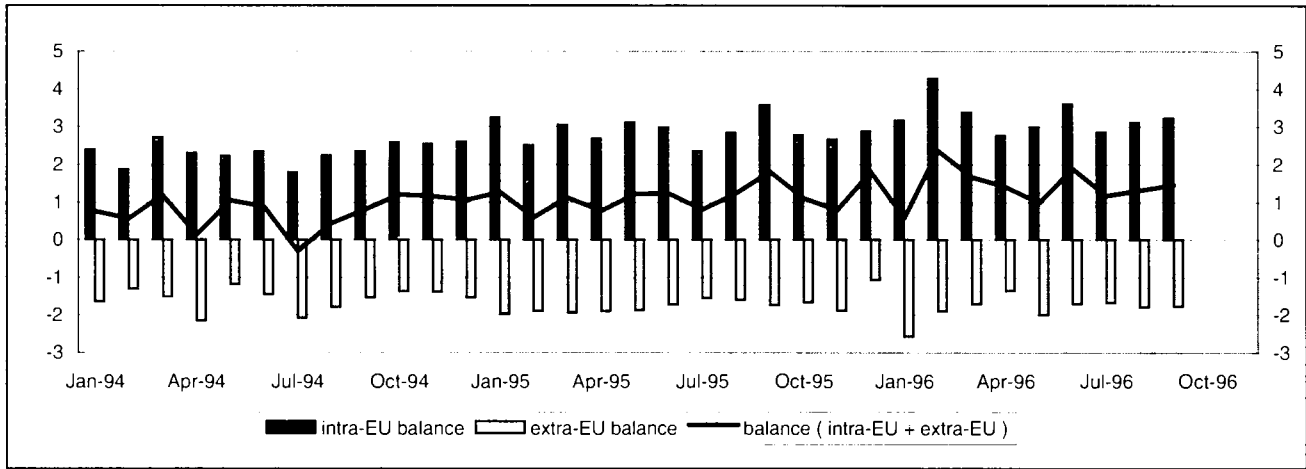

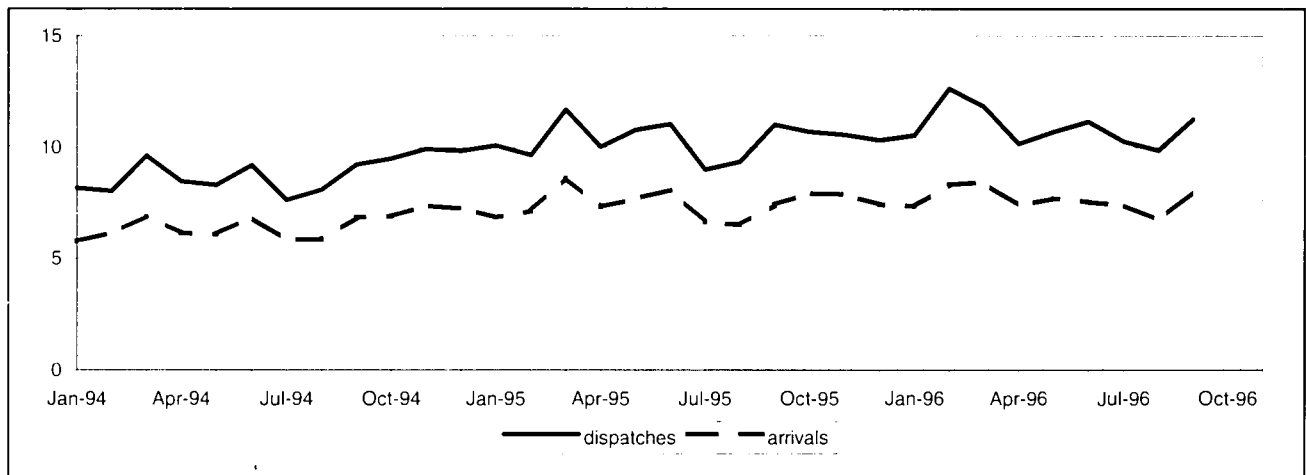

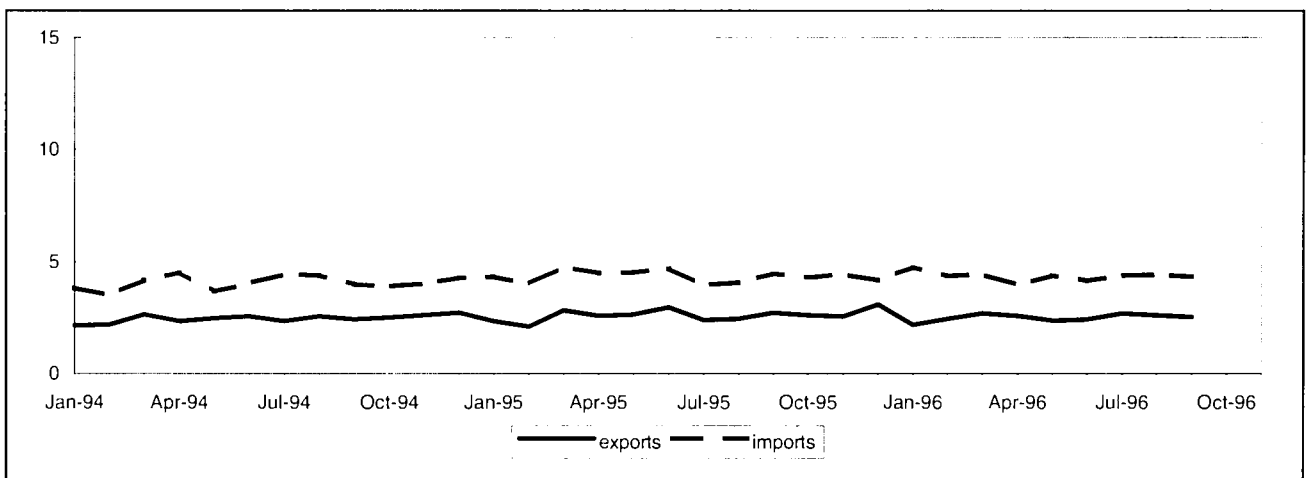
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

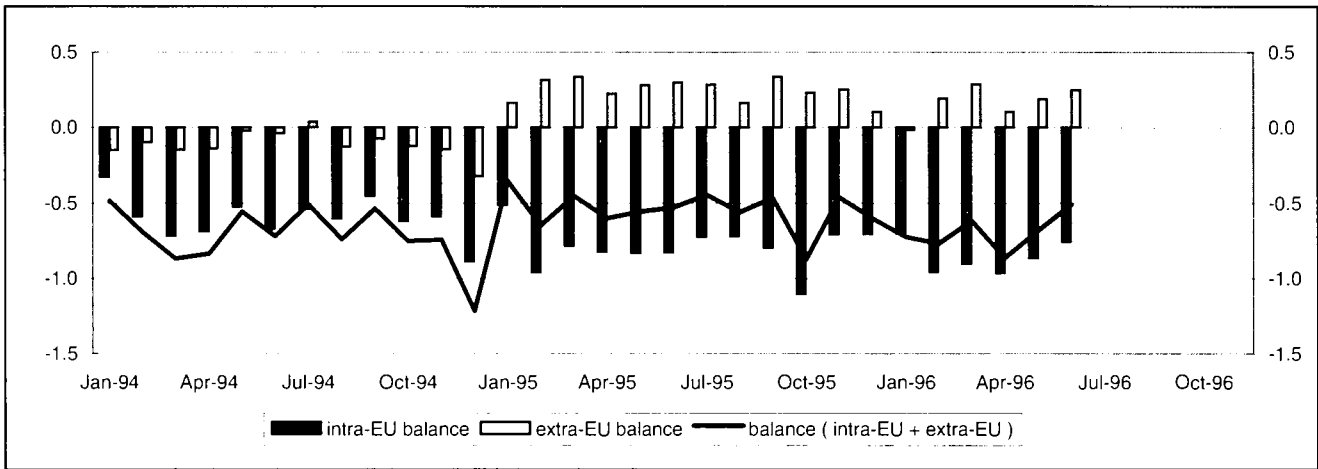

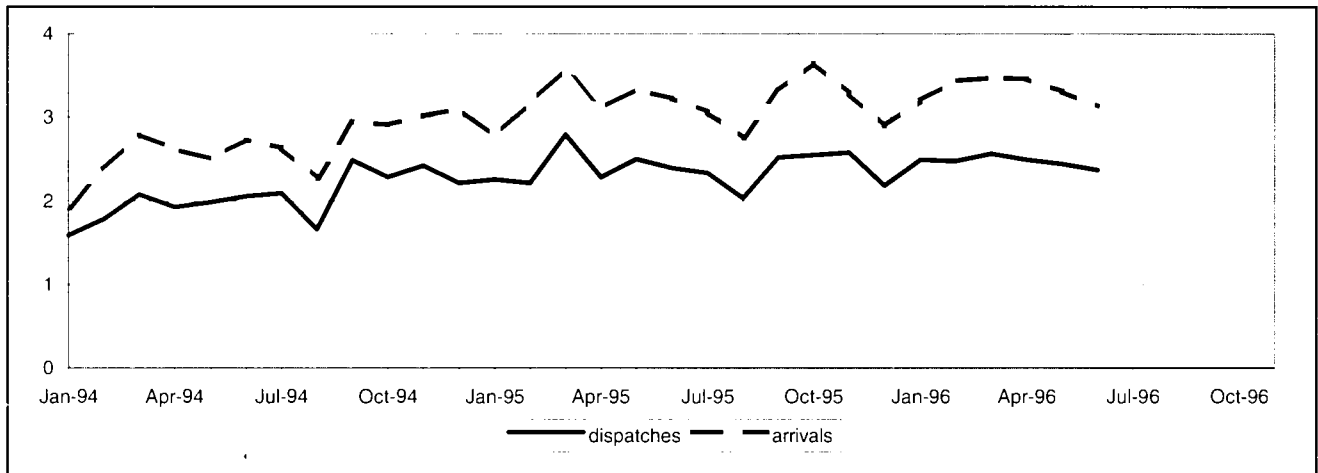

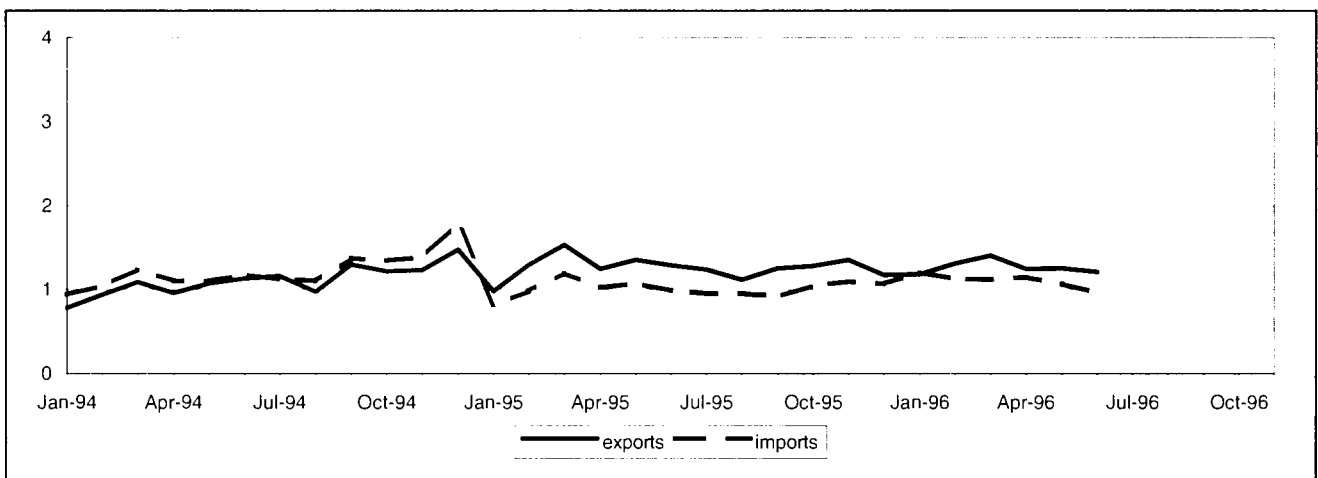
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

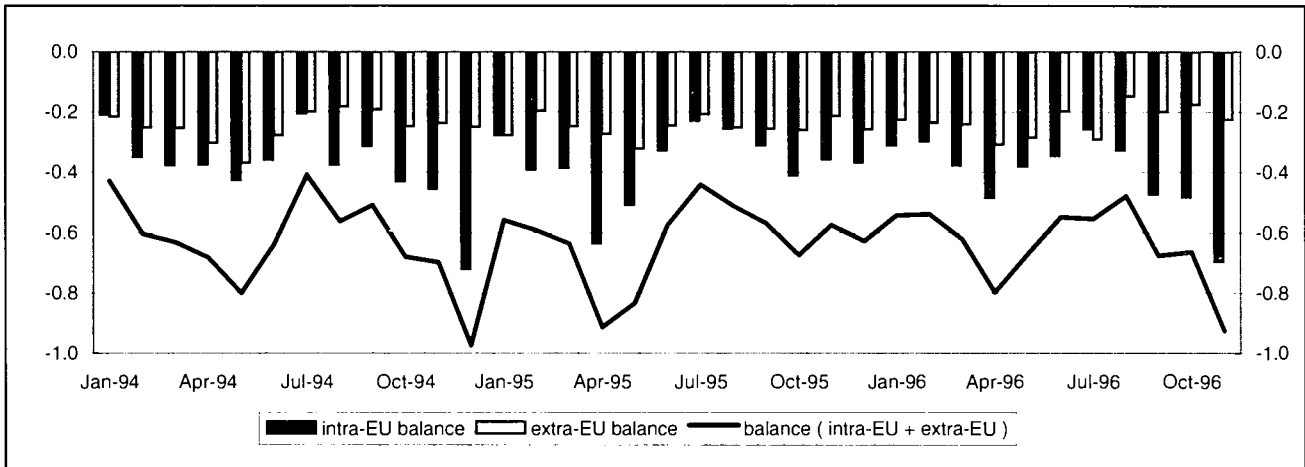

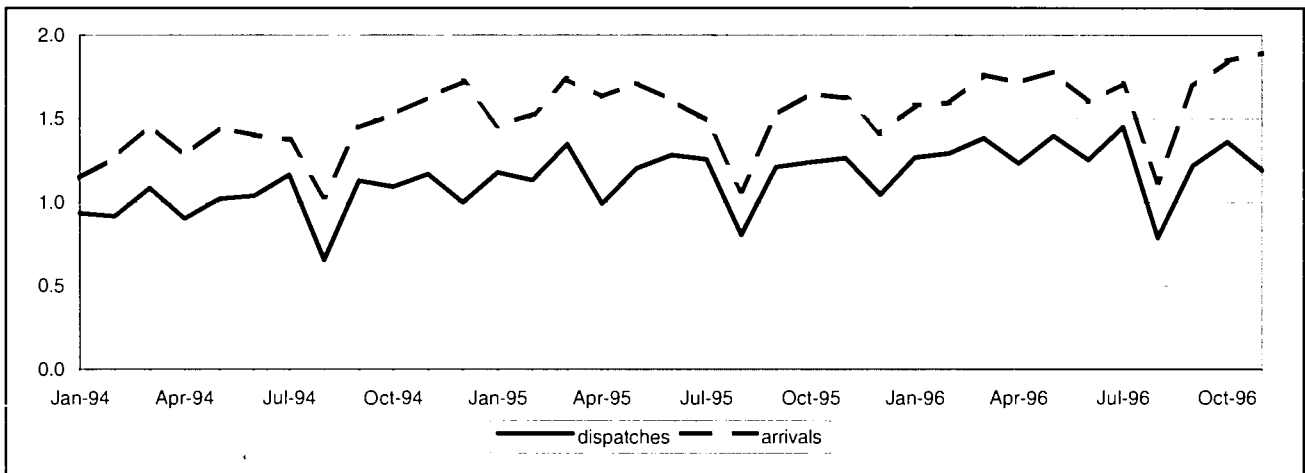

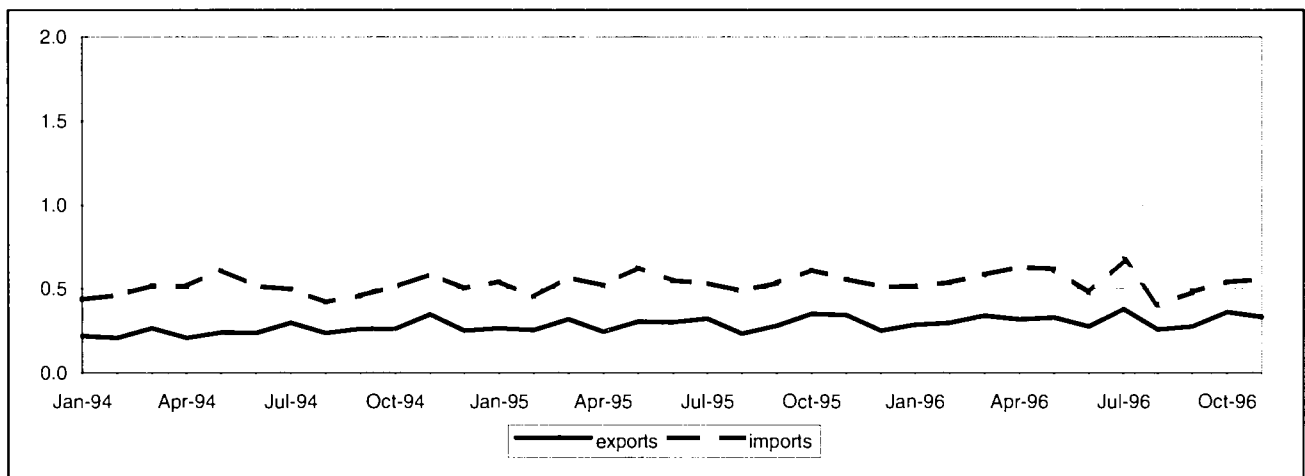
## TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

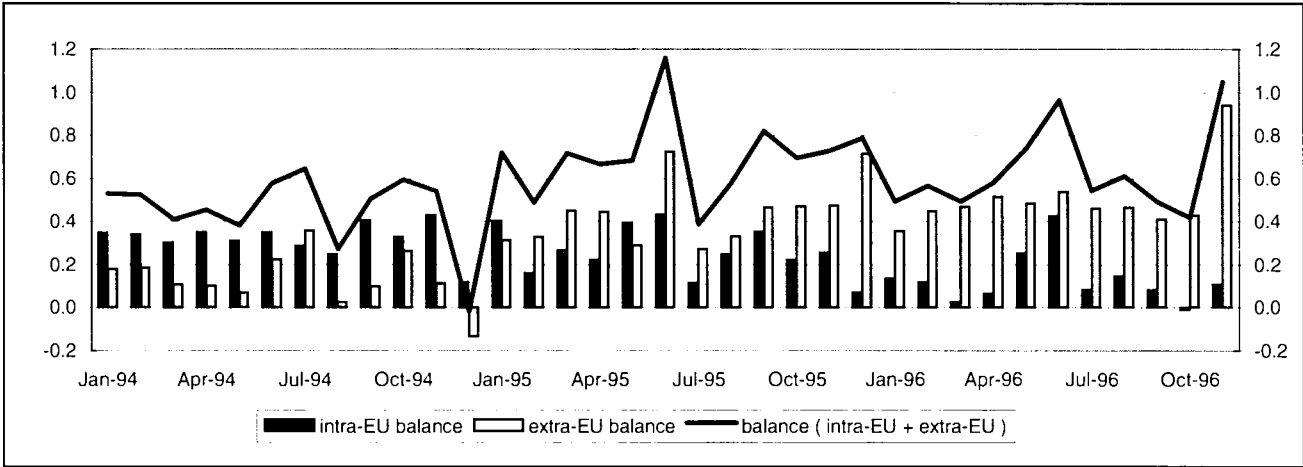

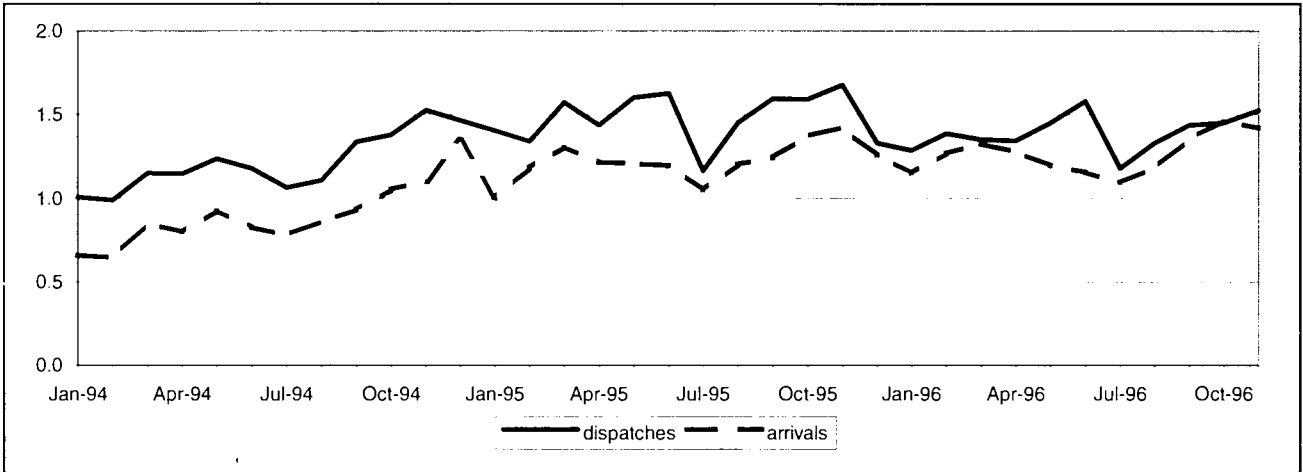

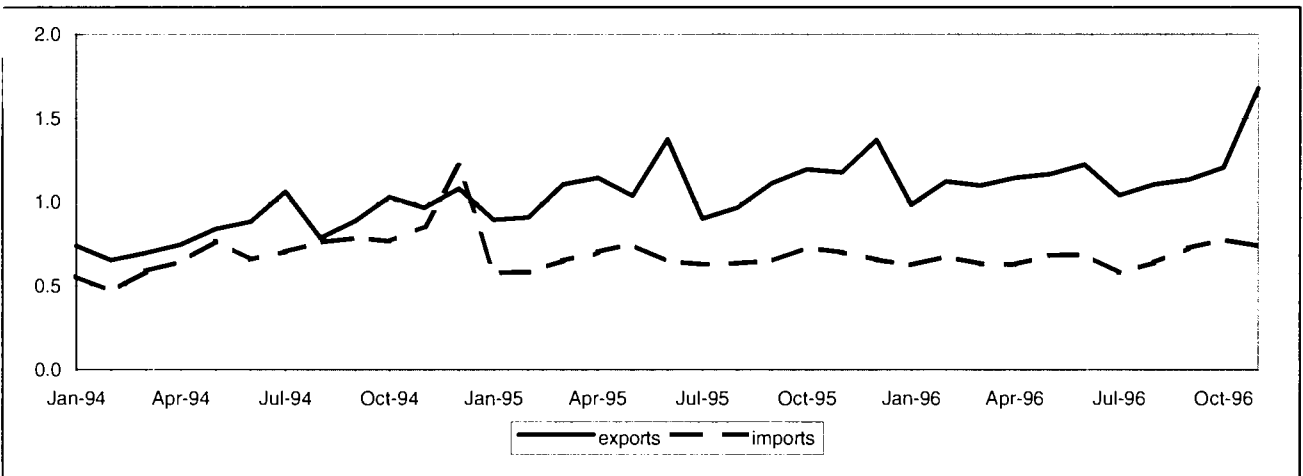
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

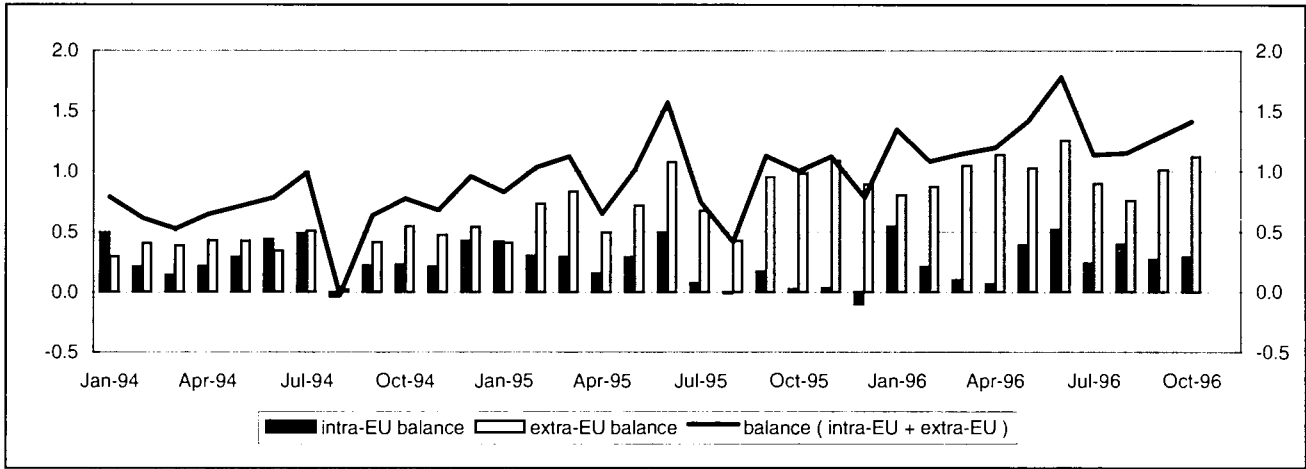

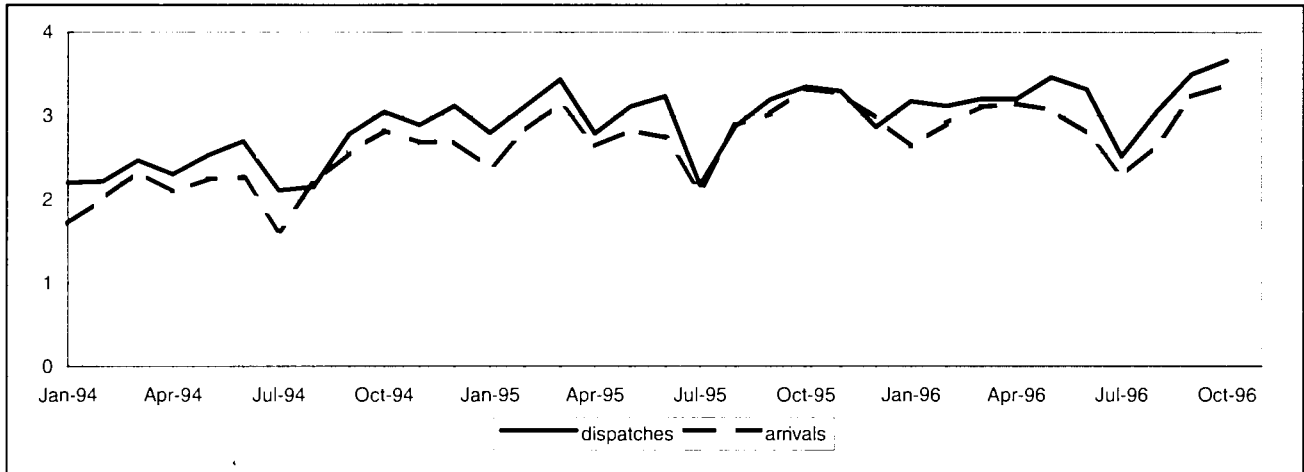

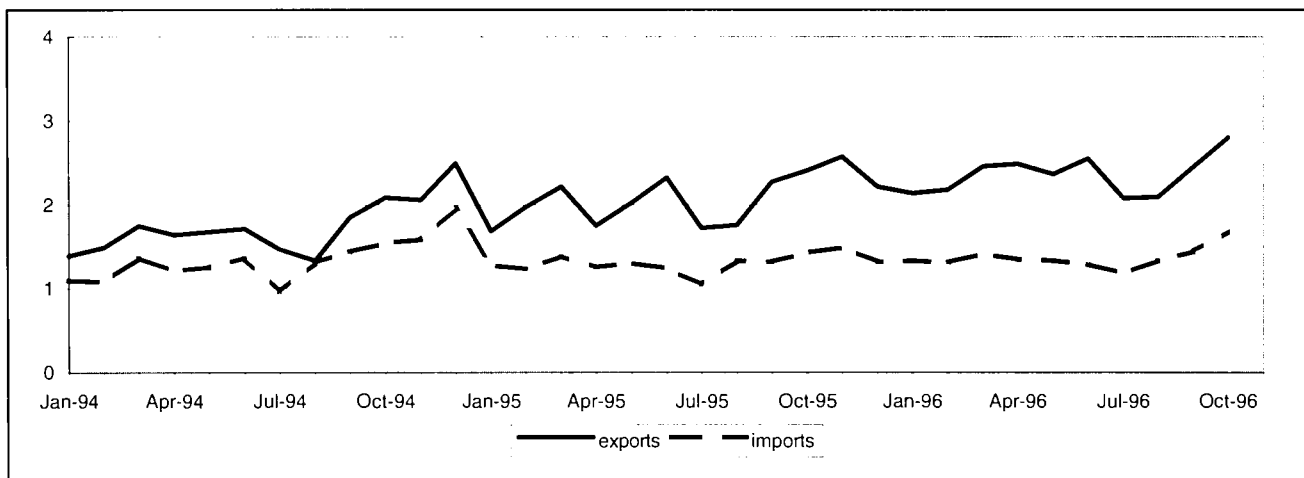
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU

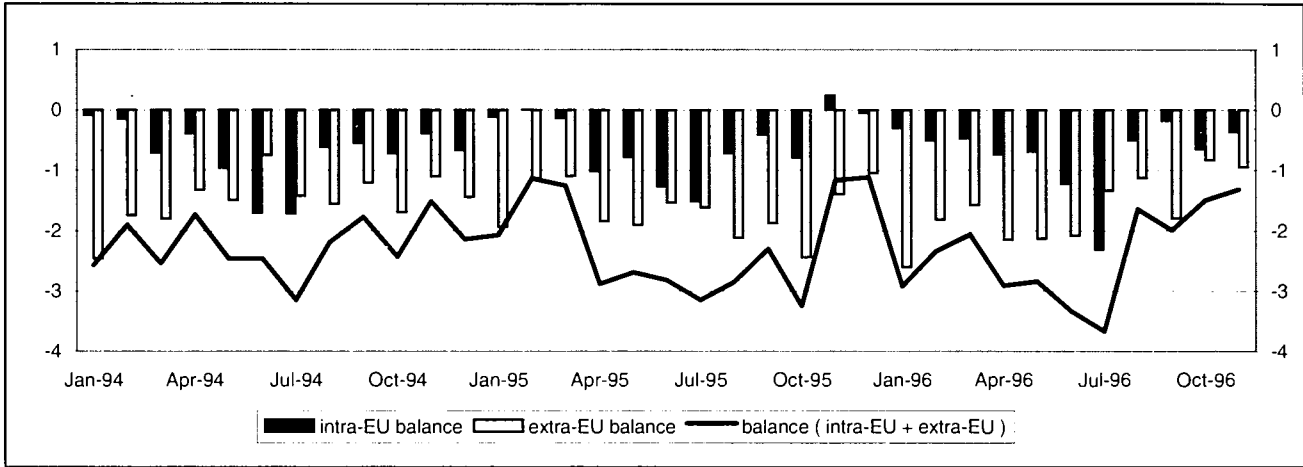

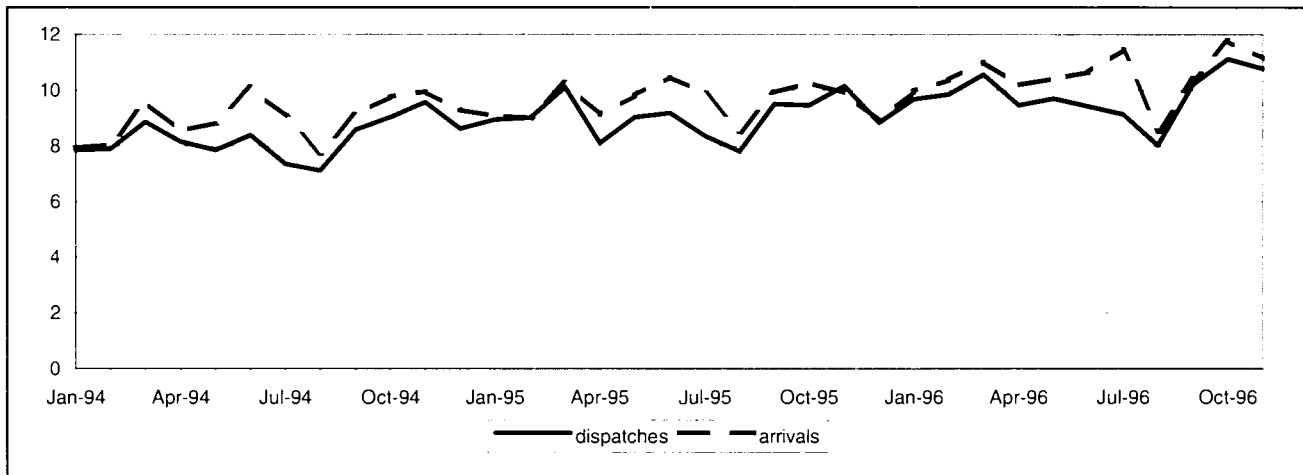

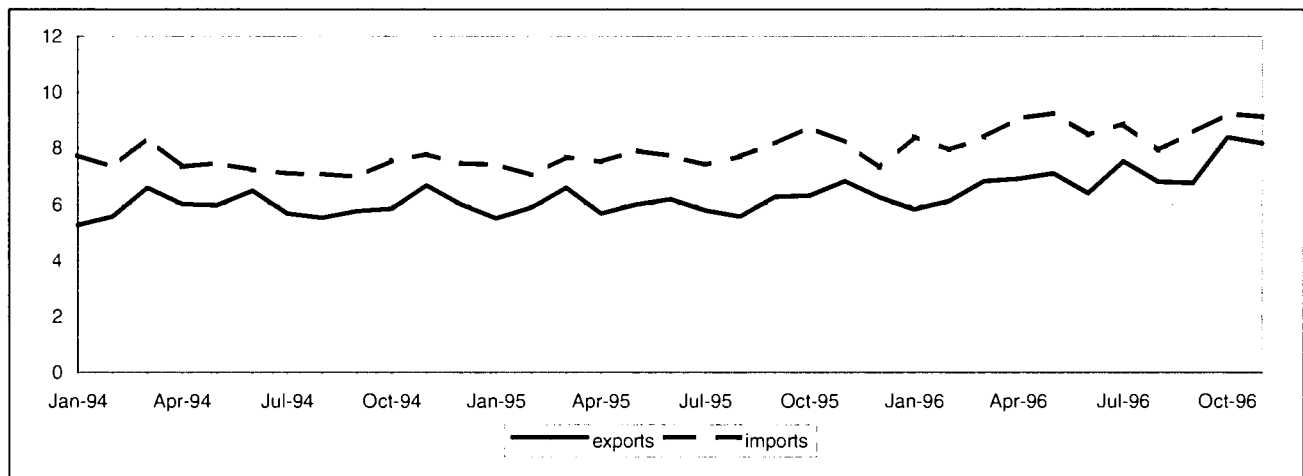
TRADE BALANCES - Bn ECU
