## POPULATION AND SOCIAL CONDITIONS

THEME 3-5/2000

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In spring 1999 the population of the European Union was measured at 370 million people, taking into account only private households.

- 155 million had a job during the survey reference week, giving, for the population aged 15 to 64 years, an employment rate of $62 \%$ for the whole EU, with the lowest rate in Spain at $52 \%$ and the highest in Denmark at $77 \%$; four countries show rates higher than 70\% (Denmark, the Netherlands, Sweden and United Kingdom); the employment rate for women is $53 \%$ and 5 countries have rates higher than $60 \%$ (Denmark, the Netherlands, Finland, Sweden and United Kingdom)
- 18\% of people with jobs said that they worked part-time, $80 \%$ of these parttime workers being women;
- $13 \%$ of employees had a work-contract of limited duration (33\% of employees in Spain)
- the employees working full-time, work in average 40.4 hours per week (41.2 hours per week for males - 39.0 for females);
- 16 million people had no job but were available for work and looking for work, giving an unemployment rate of $9.4 \%$ for the whole EU, reaching $12.1 \%$ in France and 15.7\% in Spain;
- 46\% of unemployed persons had been looking for work for over a year;
- $21 \%$ of unemployed persons were looking for their first job (the figure for Italy being over 50\%).

## ESSENTIAL INFORMATION - METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The European Labour Force Survey was conducted in spring 1999 in the 15 Member States of the European Union in accordance with Council Regulation (EEC) No. 577/98 of 9 March 1998.
A detailed description of the sampling methods, the adjustment procedures, the definitions and the common Community coding currently used in the labour force survey is presented in the publication Labour Force Survey Methods and definitions, 1998.

## Basic concepts and definitions

All these definitions apply to persons aged 15 years and over, living in private households. The concepts and definitions used in the survey follow the guidelines of the Intermational Labour Organisation. Persons carrying out obligatory military service are not included.
The survey does not cover persons living in collective households such as hostels, halls of residence, medical care establishments, religious institutions, collective workers' accommodation, etc.
Persons in employment are those who during the reference week did any work for pay or profit for at least one hour, or were not working but had jobs from which they were temporarily absent. Family workers are also included. Unemployed persons are those who, during the reference week:
(a) had no employment, and
(b) were available to start work within the next two weeks, and
(c) had actively sought employment at some time during the previous four weeks.In addition, unemployed persons include those who had no employment and had already found a job to start later.
Duration of unemployment is defined as:
(a) the duration of search for a job, or
(b) the length of the period since the last job was held (if this period is shorter than the duration of search for a job).
The active population is defined as the sum of persons in employment and unemployed persons.
Inactive persons are those who are not classified as persons in employment nor as unemployed persons.
Employees are defined as persons who work for a public or private employer and who receive compensation in the form of wages, salaries, fees, gratuities, payment by results or payment in kind; non-conscript members of the armed forces are also included
The number of usual hours worked per week corresponds to the number of hours the person normally work including extra hours, either paid or unpaid, which the person normally works, but excludes the travel time between the home and the place of work as well as the main meal breaks.
Activity rates represent the labour force as a percentage of the population aged 15 to 64 years living in private households.
Employment rates represent persons in employment as a percentage of the population aged 15 to 64 years living in private households.
Unemployment rates represent unemployed persons as a percentage of the active population.
Inactive in education includes persons who had followed any kind of education during the 4 weeks preceding the week of reference. Students who were on holidays in this period are not included.
