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### *Results of the August 1996 survey of the pig population*

#### Halt in cyclical decline in pig production to meet short-term increase in demand

The pig survey carried out in August 1996 by most of the EU countries showed that the pig population has remained stagnant compared to August 1995. Thus, the reduction in population which began in 1994 following a cyclical climax has stopped and the resumption of production should be seen to continue until the first quarter of 1997.

This recovery is in all probability a result of the serious crisis in the beef sector. The shift in consumption to poultry meat and pigmeat have resulted in sharp rises in prices. Over a mere ten weeks or so, the producer price for pigmeat increased from ECU 150/100kg to over ECU 180/100kg (European average). Over the summer, the difference between the price paid to the producer and the cost of the feedstuffs necessary for fattening increased by over 50% compared with the beginning of the year. So the profitability of pig-rearing improved noticeably. It was only after mid-September that the artificially high prices began to level off and at the end of October they are still higher than the prices observed in January.

This situation, which is very favourable for pig farmers, could only encourage them to resume full activities in units that they had gradually started to put out of operation when prices were becoming less attractive. However, judging from the detailed results for the August 1996 survey, there were fewer fattening pigs than in August 1995 (-1.9%). This was no doubt because for the time being the supply of piglets ready for fattening was inadequate. It should be borne in mind that the previous survey conducted in April, very shortly after the outbreak of the "mad cow" crisis showed

a reduction of 1.5% in the number of pigs weighing less than 50kg compared with April 1995. In the meantime, the piglet population has grown again and this could rapidly lead to an increase in the number of fattening pigs and hence an increase in the amount of pigmeat on the market. There was also an upswing in the number of mated sows, the number of sows mated for the first time particularly increasing by 3.5%.

Gross indigenous production in 1996 should be slightly higher than in 1995. The year started with a downward trend but production picked up in the second quarter, for which an increase of 0.7% over 1995 is expected. This upward trend should continue until the beginning of 1997, when the experts expect a slight drop. However, everything will probably depend on consumer attitudes to beef.

#### Methodology

Spain has not yet finished processing the survey and the data for that country are very provisional. For Italy the quarterly development of pig GIP has been calculated on the basis of slaughterings developments. The level of GIP has been restimated back to 1993. The real GIP figures of 1992 have been taken as a basis.

For Greece, Luxembourg and Portugal the pig survey in August is optional.
