PHILIP H. TREZISE SWORN IN
AS ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE
FOR ECONOMIC AFFAIRS

Philip Harold Trezise, of Michigan, a Foreign Service Officer of Career Minister rank, was sworn in today as Assistant Secretary of State for Economic Affairs. Mr. Trezise had served since October 1965 as United States Representative to the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, with the personal rank of Ambassador.

Born in Calumet, Michigan, on May 27, 1912 Mr. Trezise received both his A.B. and M.A. degrees from the University of Michigan, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He remained at the University as a research associate until 1941.

In 1942, Mr. Trezise entered Government service as an analyst in the Office of Defense Transportation. From 1943 to 1946, he served with the Office of Strategic Services while in the U. S. Navy.

Mr. Trezise joined the Department in 1946 as the chief research analyst in the Division of Research for the Far East, later becoming Chief of the Division. He served as an adviser to the U. S. delegation to the United Nations Good Offices Commission on the Indonesian Question in 1948. In 1949-1950, he attended the National War College. Subsequently, Mr. Trezise served as Chief of the Division of Research for the Near East and Africa, Deputy Director of the Office of Intelligence and Research, and a member of the Policy Planning Staff.

Mr. Trezise was Counselor for Economic Affairs in Tokyo 1957-1959; from 1960 through 1961 he was Director USOM, Tokyo, and concurrently Minister for Economic Affairs. From 1961 to 1965 he served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Economic Affairs.

In June 1965 he was given the Distinguished Federal Service Award by President Johnson.

Ambassador Trezise is married to the former Ruth Elenor Dorsey, and they have two sons, John D. and David Philip.
