## CHRISTOPHER AUDLAND, C.M.G.

Director General for Energy Commission of the European Communities

Christopher Audland, C.M.G., is Director General for Energy for the EC Commission in Brussels, Belgium. In this position he is responsible for common EC policies in the energy field.

Mr Audland was born in 1926 and educated at Winchester College, England. From 1944 to 1948 he served in the British Royal Artillery as a Temporary Captain. He then joined the British Foreign Office and served in Bonn, Strasbourg (as Deputy to the British Permanent Representative to the Council of Europe) and at the British Embassy in Washington D.C. From 1963 to 1967 he was a member of the British Delegation to the negotiations with member states of the European Community.

He was Head of Chancery at the British Embassy in Buenos Aires from 1963 to 1967 and Head of the Science and Technology Department at the Foreign Office in London from 1968 to 1970. From 1970 to 1973 he was Counsellor and Head of Chancery at the British Embassy in Bonn and Deputy Leader of the British Delegation to the Four Power Negotiations in Berlin. In 1973 he moved to Brussels to become Deputy Secretary General for the EC Commission. He took over his present position earlier this year.

Mr Audland is married with two sons and one daughter. He is a British citizen.
