FREDERIC BOYER DE LA GIRODAY

Head of Monetary Problems Division,
Commission of the European Economic Community

Frederic Boyer de la Giroday is one of the Common Market's foremost fiscal authorities.

Born in France in 1918, he is a graduate of the University of Paris (doctorate diplomas in Law) and Oxford University (B. Litt. Economics).

He was a member of the secretariat of the Marshall Plan Conference in Paris in 1947 which helped shape Western Europe's future.

Then, in 1948, he joined the International Monetary Fund as a senior economist and advisor. He served in that capacity for the next ten years in both Paris and Washington, D.C.

In 1958, M. Boyer de la Giroday assumed his present position as head of the Monetary Problems Division of the EEC Commission.
