Christian Jacques Brumter,

Mr. Christian Jacques Brumter received his Master's degree in Sociology in 1973 and his Ph.D. in Law in 1979. He supplemented his academic work with a research fellowship with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and a Fulbright fellowship with the Graduate School of Public Affairs at the State University of New York at Albany.

His professional experiences include being Director of the General Direction of Hospitals in Paris and teaching positions at the University of Paris, University of Strasbourg and the National Institute for Advanced Studies in Defense.

His work with the European Communities began in 1981 in the General Secretariat of the Council of Ministers. In 1985 he began working for a member of the Commission of the European Communities, Mr. Mosar, and in 1989 he joined the cabinet of Mr. Cordoso E Cunha, Member of the Commission responsible for Energy, Small Business, Distributive Trades and Tourism. His publications include two books entitled, "Health Policy and Administration," and "The North Atlantic Assembly."

While at the Brookings Institution, Mr. Brumter will be researching the electrical production and distribution industry. In order to rectify the fragmented nature of electrical sectors in Europe, a unique legal framework has been set up. Mr. Brumter is interested in researching the American legal framework and economic consequences related to the electronic industry as a source of inspiration for the EC Commission's new policy. He will be specifically highlighting transportation of electricity which has been emphasized for many years as a draw for encouraging investment in production and authorizing international trade in electricity relaunched by the agreements reached with Canada and the ongoing negotiations with Mexico.
