BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

RICHARD BURKE, MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES, RESPONSIBLE FOR PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION, JOINT INTERPRETING AND CONFERENCE SERVICES, STATISTICAL OFFICE AND OFFICE FOR OFFICIAL PUBLICATIONS

Mr. Burke was born in March 1932 in New York. He is Irish. Educated in Nova Scotia and Dublin, he graduated with a Master of Arts and Higher Diploma in Education from the University College, Dublin, and later was called to the bar at Kings Inns, Dublin.

His professional career includes time as a secondary teacher and barrister.

His political career began in 1969, when he was elected to the Irish Parliament (Dail Eireann) representing Tipperary. He immediately became opposition Chief Whip of the Fine Gael. In 1973, following the coalition of the Fine Gael and Labor parties, he became Minister for Education.


From 1977-79, he was Member of the Commission of the European Communities, responsible for taxation, consumer affairs, transport and relations with the European Parliament. He then spent a few months at Harvard University as a Center for International Affairs Fellow. In 1981, he returned to Irish politics as an elected Member of the Irish Parliament, and, on April 1, 1982 he was appointed Member of the Commission of the European Communities.

Mr. Burke was instrumental in bringing to the United States the Irish Art exhibition in 1978, growing out of his great love for religious art and literature, and because he was convinced that this first full revelation to Americans of Ireland's early Christian heritage would serve to balance the impression created in many minds by Northern Ireland's troubles.

Mr. Burke is married with five children and resides in Brussels, Belgium.
