## Henning Christophersen

Henning Christophersen, born 8th November 1939, in Copenhagen, active in politics since the mid-sixties, elected member of the Danish Parliament. In 1971 for the Liberal party ("Venstre"). During the seventies, gained increasing prominence in the parliament as his party's deputy leader and general policy spokesman. As such he dealt with all areas of legislation but he became particularly known and respected for his great insight and understanding of economic and financial matters. In 1978 he became party leader and the same year led his party into a coalition with the Social Democrats.

In the Government led by Prime Minister Anker Jørgensen he became foreign minister. The government was widely seen as a political experiment and when towards the end of 1979 he found it was unable to take the necessary decisions in the field of economic policy to redress the deteriorating situation, Henning Christophersen led his party out of Government and thereby brought it down. In the next three years he led a campaign from the opposition for a radically different economic policy and when the Social Democratic Government collapsed in 1982, he became deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance in the new Liberal-Conservative coalition. Within 24 months he managed to ensure a complete turn around of the Danish economic situation with a dramatic improvement in the economic situation.

In 1985 he became Vice-President of the Commission of the European Communities and was made responsible for the Community's budget, financial control, personnel and administration. In this capacity he master-minded the complete overhaul of the Community finances to secure increased resources and improved control of Community spending.

1989-1992. Mr Christophersen has been Vice-President responsible for economic affairs and the coordination of the Structural funds.

Among his private interests are genealogy, history and languages such as old Greek. He is married to Jytte (born Nielsen) and has three children.
