Edith Cresson

Prime Minister of France

Edith Cresson was appointed Prime Minister of France by President François Mitterrand on May 15, 1991. Mrs. Cresson was formerly Minister of European Affairs, having been appointed on May 11, 1988 and reappointed on June 28, 1988 in the first and second cabinets of former Prime Minister Michel Rocard.

Mrs. Cresson's political activities date back to her involvement in Socialist Party candidate François Mitterrand's bid for the presidency in 1965. Later that same year she joined the Organization of Republican Institutions. Within the Socialist Party, she has held numerous positions including National Secretary for Youth Organizations (1975-1979), National Delegate for Environmental Matters (1980-1981), National Secretary for Industrial Issues (1987-March 1990) and member of the Steering Committee of the Socialist Party.

A former member of the European Parliament (1979-1981), Cresson served on that assembly's Agriculture Committee. In 1981, Cresson was appointed Minister of Agriculture in the cabinet of Prime Minister Pierre Mauroy, a position she held until 1983. Subsequently, she was appointed Minister of Foreign Trade in the Cabinet of Prime Minister Laurent Fabius and remained in the post until 1986.

On the local level, Mrs. Cresson was elected a *député* to the National Assembly from the Vienne *département* on the Socialist Party ticket in 1981, reelected in 1986 and in 1988. She has also served as mayor of the small city of Châtellerault located in western France, first being elected in March, 1983. She has also served as a member of the General Council of the *département* of Vienne.

Mrs. Cresson is a graduate of the Women's School of Advanced Commercial Studies (HECJF) where she received a degree in business and a doctorate in demography. She is also the author of the book, Avec le soleil (With the Sun) and received the Legion of Honor last January.

Edith Cresson was born on January 27, 1934 in the Paris suburb of Boulogne-Billancourt. She is married and the mother of two children.


