PAUL ELVINGER

Paul ELVINGER was born at Walferdange (Grand Duchy of Luxembourg) on October 10, 1907. He studied law at the Universities of Brussels and Paris and received his Doctor's degree in 1932.

From 1932 to 1959, he was a member of the Bar and admitted to practice before Luxembourg Supreme Court. During the Second World War, he was acting in the resistance and deported to the camp of Schreckenstein in Eastern Germany.

He served as Chef de Cabinet of the Luxembourg Minister of the Interior in 1945 and 1946 and was a member of the City Council of Luxembourg from 1953 to 1959.

He was Board of the Bar from 1956 to 1958, elected Deputy Mayor of Luxembourg City in 1958, and became member of the Parliament in 1959.

Since 1959 he is Minister of Justice and Economic Affairs in the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and at present President of the Council of Ministers of the European Coal and Steel Community.
