BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Jean-Claude EUDE was born in France on May 16, 1941. He is a French citizen.

He graduated from the Political Science Institute in Aix, France in 1962, from the Institute of European Studies, University of Saar in Sarrebruck in 1963, from the Institute of Public Administration in Paris in 1965. He then received a Master's Degree from the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs, University of Pittsburgh in 1966 where he studied with a Fulbright scholarship and a Pittsburgh Plate Glass Foundation scholarship. He received a law degree in 1967.

From January 1967 to April 1968, he worked at the Ministry of Planning and Development in Senegal, Africa. In 1969, he joined the International Monetary Fund in Washington, D.C., as an economist specializing in aid to Africa.

From 1972-1973, he worked for the Department of International Financial Operations at the Banque de Paris et des Pays-Bas in Paris, France. Since November 1973, Mr. Eude has been a member of Mr. Claude Cheysson's cabinet. Mr. Cheysson is a member of the Commission of the European Communities in Brussels, responsible for the development policy of the European Communities (relations with the developing countries and the Arab countries).

Mr. Eude is single and lives in Brussels, Belgium.
