Congressman Frelinghuysen has represented New Jersey's Fifth Congressional District since 1953. He was elected to his ninth consecutive term in the House in 1968 by a record margin.

A member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee for ten years, he has become a Republican spokesman on foreign policy issues. He serves on the Subcommittee on Inter-American Affairs, the Subcommittee on International Organizations and Movements, the Special Subcommittee for Review of Foreign Aid Programs, and is senior Republican on the Subcommittee on Europe. In 1965, Congressman Frelinghuysen was one of two members of Congress appointed by President Johnson as a delegate to the United Nations General Assembly. In 1967, 1968, and 1969, he was appointed a Congressional adviser to the United States delegation to the Eighteen-Nation Disarmament Conference in Geneva, Switzerland.
