David Galloway is an official with the Council of Ministers of the European Union, where he has been employed since 1986. David Galloway is currently a principal administrator in the Directorate General for External Relations, working in the Common Foreign and Security Policy Department, where he is responsible for horizontal financial and institutional matters.

Mr Galloway has previously held a number of posts in the External Relations Directorate General of the Council, initially dealing with relations between the EC and the African, Caribbean and Pacific countries during the Lomé IV negotiations, and subsequently with trade policy matters, where his specific responsibilities included the completion of the single market in the EC's Common Commercial Policy, and international multilateral and bilateral textile negotiations. Since 1993, he has also acted as note taker for the European Council summit meetings.

Prior to working in the Council, Mr. Galloway worked in Brussels for two years, first of all in a newsagency, and subsequently in an industry lobby group and in Generale Bank.

Mr. Galloway is British, and was born in 1961 in Bridge of Allan, Scotland. He is married with two children. He was educated at the Nicolson Institute, Stornoway, Western Isles, and at Heriot-Watt University in Edinburgh (BA (Hons) First Class in Languages). He is a keen pilot and bagpipe palyer. The focus of his work at the LBJ School, apart from teaching a broadly-based course on the EU, will be on comparing and contrasting the mix of shared and competing interests and objectives between the EU and the US in foreign and trade policy.
