



Born January 5, 1931, in Paris. Diploma from the Institute of Political Studies; Paris law degree. Diploma in advanced public law studies.

Attended Ecole Nationale d'Administration from 1954 to 1956. In 1956, probationary official at the Council of State.

In 1961, Chargé de Mission, then Conseiller technique in the Private Office of the High Commissioner for Youth and Sport. In 1962, was Rapporteur at the Council of State, and Paris representative of the Organisation technique de mise en valeur des richesses du sous-sol saharien.

From 1964 to 1968, Government Commissioner to the Council of State Legal Assembly. From 1970 to 1974, Deputy Secretary-General, then Secretary General of the Entreprise Minière et Chimique, and since 1974 has been Financial and Administrative Director at the Institut de Recherche et de Coordination Acoustique Musique (IRCAM), Beaubourg Center.

State Counsellor since June 1981, and in July 1981 became Government delegate to the Saint-Gobain-Pont-à-Mousson Group. In October 1981 became legal adviser to the Entreprise de Recherches et d'Activités Pétrolières (ERAP).

Appointed Judge at the Court of Justice on October 7, 1982.
