

HANS-JOACHIM GLAESNER Director-General

Born December 4, 1923. Doctor of Laws degree, with thesis on the customs union. From 1956 to 1960, a deputy in the Federal Ministry of Justice, where he took part in the negotiation of the Rome Treaties.

On January 1, 1960, became Legal Adviser in the Joint Legal Service of the European Executives. From 1968 to 1970, was the Director responsible for the Community Research Program, including the central administration of the Joint Research Center.

In 1970, became the First Director for General Research Policy in the Commission. From 1973 to 1975, was principal executive secretary to Prof. Dahrendorf and Guido Brunner, Members of the Commission.

Appointed Director-General in the Legal Service of the General Secretariat of the Council of the European Communities, effective March 1, 1975.
