Also, drafted constitutions and other laws, and participated as a member of the United Kingdom delegation in numerous constitutional conferences and several intergovernmental committees and conferences.

In the Commonwealth Relations Office, advised on all legal aspects of United Kingdom relations with various independent Commonwealth members, including Cyprus, Malaya, Malta, and Rhodesia, as well as on the dissolution of the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland.

In the Commonwealth Office and Foreign and Commonwealth Office, gave legal advice to the departments handling relations with various African countries (including South Africa and Rhodesia) and countries of Asia and the Far East (including the Indian subcontinent), to the departments administering diplomatic relations and diplomatic personnel affairs, the European Convention on Human Rights, and the European Communities.

Special Counsel to the United Kingdom delegation at the Second Session of the General Assembly of the United Nations (1973).
