Born at Jupille-sur-Meuse on January 17, 1938. Doctor of Law (Liège, 1960); LL. M. (Northwestern University, 1966); S. J. D. (Northwestern University, 1968). Several periods of study in Germany and the United States, both as a researcher and as a postgraduate student.

Holder of the Chair of European Community law at the University of Liège (associate lecturer in 1970, full professor in 1974); lectures in EC institutional law, European competition law, and intellectual property law. Visiting professor at the University of Nancy (1971-1978), at the Europa Instituut at the University of Amsterdam (since 1976), at the University of Louvain-la-Neuve (in 1980-1981 and 1981-1982), and at Northwestern University in Chicago (1974 and 1983). Held the Belgian Chair at the University of London, King's College (1977). Has lectured in European competition law at the College of Europe in Bruges since 1979.

Rapporteur or guest speaker at several international or foreign seminars (FIDE on two occasions; Studienvereinigung Kartellrecht, German Comparative Law Society on two occasions, Centre Paul Roubier in Lyon, and the American Bar Association on two occasions).

Occasional consultant to the Belgian institutions (Ministry of Public Works, Walloon Region), European institutions (EC Commission), and various public and private undertakings.

Author of two works in English and three in French and some 30 articles in English, French, and German published in Belgian and foreign journals (German, U. S., British, and French). Fluent in English and German and familiar with the Anglo-American and German-speaking worlds.

Appointed Judge at the Court of Justice of the European Communities on April 10, 1984.
