Mr. Krauthoff's professional experience has been in business, in trade associations, and in trade policy. He was associated with the H. D. Catty Corporation from 1946 to 1955, and was its Executive Vice President from 1951 to 1955. He was a member of the Executive Committee of the Laminated Foil Manufacturers Association from 1949 to 1955 and its President from 1953 to 1955. He was a member of the Executive Committee of the Coated and Processed Paper Association from 1951 to 1957 and its President from 1955 to 1957.
